| Paris. Feb. 27.—Premier A. Briand who succeeded Clemenceau as head of the French cabinet on July 23, 1909, today tendered his resignation of his ministry to President Fallieres. On Nov. 2 last, Briand formally retired, but a few hours later he was restored to power and formed a new cabinet from which all elements not thoroughly in sympathy with his attitude toward labor, had been eliminated.

The situation at present is wholly different, and the premier had leclared himself weary of the blekerings of parliament and the intrigues of the groups nominally supporting him, and expressed the wish that he might be relieved of the responsibilities of government.


