## ARTICLES OF THE CALENDAR

—AND—

### Astronomical Notices for the Year 1896

On the left Hand page of each month are given the rising and setting of the Sun, and the length of the day to the nearest full minute, also the data required for solar observations, namely the Equation of Time (that is the difference between variable Sun Time and uniform Clock Time), to be added or subtracted according as the one is behind or ahead of the other, which is given for the instant of apparent Noon. Next is the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, Greenwich Time. With these exceptions all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local Mean Time at Charlottetown (Latitude  $46^{\circ} 13' 55''$  N., Longitude  $63^{\circ} 7' 33''$  W.; giving 4hs. 12 min. 29.5 sec. difference slow on Greenwich.

If required, the Sun's Declination at Greenwich apparent noon may be found from the data here given by multiplying the hourly variation by the Equation of Time for the same day reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the result according to the conditions as under.

From the Sun's apparent semi-diameter, which is given daily to the nearest tenth of a second, may be found the Sun's Horizontal Parallax (that is what would be the Earth's apparent semi-diameter as seen from the distance of the Sun, by dividing by 107.44, the proportion the Sun's actual diameter bears to that of the Earth). Thus we find for July when the Sun's distance is greatest  $\frac{15' 46''}{107.44} - \frac{946}{1074} = 8''.806$  for Parallax and also on December 31st, when the Sun is nearest the semi-diameter is  $16' 18''.2$  giving  $9''.105$  for Parallax.

On the right hand page of each month are given the phases of the Moon, its Rising, Southing and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown, to the nearest full minute of local mean time.

To assist in weather forecasts, are added the Moon's Perigee and Apogee, and the time of crossing the Equator and reaching its greatest North and South Declination. It having been observed that these periods are generally found to be accompanied by atmospheric changes more or less marked as they agree with the Moon's changes and Perigee, when two or more of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours it is indicated by \*\* or \*\*\* accordingly.

### ECLIPSES.

There will be four Eclipses during the year 1896, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, of which one of the latter alone will be visible at Charlottetown.

(I) An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Greenwich mean time of conjunction, February 13th, 3 hr. 32 mins. 27.6 sec., visible as a partial Eclipse at the south extremity of America, and southwest coast of Africa, the central line of the Moon's Shadow passing from the South Pole to about 600 miles of the Cape of Good Hope.

(II) A Partial Eclipse of the Moon G. M. T. of opposition February 28th, 8 hr. 15 mins. 41.9 secs., Duration of Eclipse from 1 hr. 3 mins. to 6 hr. 4 mins. p. m.

(III) A Total Eclipse of the sun G. M. T. of conjunction. August 9th, 4h. 37 mins. 23 secs. a. m. Central line of Moon's Shadow passing from North Cape, Lapland, through Siberia to North extreme of Japan.

(IV) A Partial Eclipse of the Moon G. M. T. of opposition August 23rd, 7 hr. 32 mins. 7.2 secs. a. m.

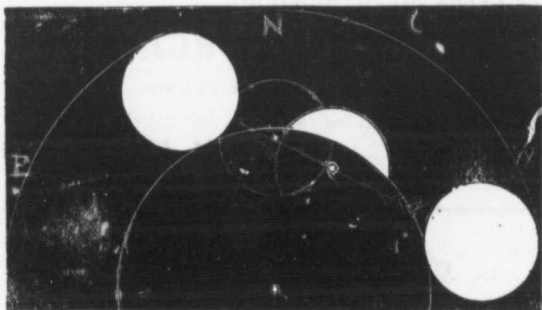

Last contact with Shadow,	“ “	4h. 18.1m. a. m.
“ “ Penumbra,	“ “	5h. 34.4m. a. m.

First contact with the Shadow  $100^{\circ}$  from the North Point of the Moon's Limb towards the East.

Last contact  $153^{\circ}$  towards the West, at greatest obscuration  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the Moon's diameter will be eclipsed. The Moon will be over the centre of the Earth's Shadow 3h. 19.6m. a. m.



### OCCULTATIONS.

The Moon will come into Conjunction with each of the Planets in the course of every Lunation, but there will be only two actual Occultations, one of Jupiter June 14th, 9h. 12.6m. p. m., the other of Venus, December 6th, 9h. 30m. a. m., but as both occur in the day time they will only be observed after sunset as a near approach.

## THE PLANETS

**MERCURY** will commence the year with direct apparent motion, and will be alternately retrograde and direct between the following dates:--January 29th, R.; February 20th, D.; May 29th, R.; June 21st, D.; September 25th, R.; October 16th, D.; to the end of the year, his only planetary conjunctions will be with Venus, June 14th, three times with Neptune May 15th, June 14th and 29th. The best chance of finding the Planet will be after sunset, about May 16th; Sept. 12th; or before sunrise, March 4th; July 4th.

**VENUS** will commence the year as a morning star with direct motion throughout the year, coming to superior conjunction with the Sun, July 9th, reappears shortly afterward as an Evening Star, so to continue to the years end. Coming into conjunction with Mars February 9th; Jupiter, August 2nd; Saturn, October 15th; Uranus, October 18th.

**MARS** will be a morning star from the beginning of the year to his opposition to the Sun, December 7th; his only conjunctions will be with Venus as noted above, and Neptune September 23rd.

**JUPITER** will be a morning star till his opposition to the Sun January 24th, he will be in conjunction with the Sun August 11th, appear again as a morning star to the years end. His apparent motion will be retrograde from the beginning of the year to March 24th, then direct to December 25th.

**SATURN** and **URANUS** will be near companions throughout the year, continually approaching till their conjunction December 28th, having no connection with any of the other Planets except with Venus on the 15th and 18th October, and Mercury the 19th and 20th November.

**NEPTUNE** will commence the year as an evening star coming in conjunction with the Sun June 7th, after which a morning star till his opposition to the Sun, December 9th, his other conjunctions have been already noticed.

This distant and minute Planet is not easily found without the help of a powerful telescope, the best guide to his position will be his conjunction with Mars September 23rd, when he will be 46' ( $1\frac{1}{2}$  Moon's diameter) north of that Planet.

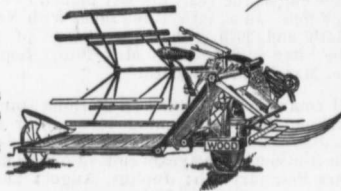

2. The phases happening from 4 to 10 p. m. may be followed by fair weather, but this chiefly depends upon the direction of the wind.

3. If a storm arises from the east on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west, the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

### The Queen

Her Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India *Kaisar-i-Hind*), born 24th May, 1819, succeeded to the throne 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV; crowned 28th June, 1838, married 10th February, 1840, to His late Royal Highness, Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha.

### The Royal Lineage

Tracing Her Majesty's claim to the throne back to her descent from the Tudors, it is seen that it arises from the marriage of Margaret Tudor, eldest daughter of Henry VII, with James V, King of Scotland; their son became James V of Scotland, who left an only child, Mary, Queen of Scots. Her marriage with Lord Darnley resulted in the birth of James VI of Scotland, and I of England. Upon the death of Queen Anne, daughter of James II, without issue, the succession to the Crown devolved upon the House of Hanover.

### The Prince and Princess of Wales

His Royal Highness Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, &c.; born 9th November, 1841; married 10th March, 1863, to the Princess Alexandra Caroline Mary Charlotte Louise Julia, (born 1st December, 1844), eldest daughter of the King of Denmark.

### Children of Queen Victoria

I. Princess Victoria (Empress Dowager of Germany), born Nov. 21, 1840; married Jan. 25, 1858, to Prince Frederick Wilhelm (Frederick III, Emperor of Germany), eldest son of Wilhelm I, German Emperor and King of Prussia, widow June 15, 1888.

II. Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, born Nov. 9, 1841. (See Prince of Wales).

III. Princess Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843; married July 1, 1862, to H. R. H. Louis IV, Grand Duke of Hesse. Five children: Alfred Victoria Alberta, born April 5, 1863; Elizabeth, born Nov. 1, 1864; Irene, born July 11, 1866; Ernest Louis, born Nov. 25, 1868; Alexandra Victoria, born June 6, 1872. Princess Alice died Dec. 14, 1878.

IV. Prince Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh, born Aug. 6, 1844; married Jan. 21, 1874, to Grand Duchess Marie of Russia, only daughter of Emperor Alexander II. Five children: Alfred born Oct. 15, 1874; Marie, born Oct. 29, 1875; Victoria, born Nov. 25, 1876; Alexandra, born Sept. 1, 1878; Beatrice, born April 30, 1884.
