

There is a west wing, and there will be cample exer-ense ground. The building will contain 60 rooms, including residence, cells (as the sister's dermiteness are termed), surgeons operating-room, dispensary, room for destitute women, mission-room, chapel, offices, etc. The total cost, exclusive of furnishing, will be \$25,000. The chief contractors are Join Stroud, brick and stone work; W. Park, carpenters work. Davling & Curry are the architect. The proceeding yesterday commenced with a procession of choristers, clergy and bishops, from 8. Stephen's School, College-avenue, to the site. All were surpliced; in front was carried a lotty burnished brans cross, and the procession was brought up by the Bishop of Toronto and the Bishop of Ningara, before whom was carried the crosier or bishop's staff. 




