An indian Medicine Society.

Dr. W. J. Hoffman of the Bureau of Ethnology, Washington, read a paper on "The Midewiwin, or Grand Medicine Society of the Ojibwa Indians." The so-called secret societies of these tribes have been mentioned by various writers. One of the most important of such societies is the Grand Medicine Society. In this is preserved the most interesting collection of myths pertaining to the Ojibwa cosmor, ony, the origin and constitution of the society, the ritual of initiation and the secrets of prophesy. Mnemomic charts pertaining to the above have been collected and explained by the chief Mide of the society. Instead of being limited to a single dogree this body is graded into four distinct degrees with the collateral branch, the Ghost Society, through which candidates may under special circumstances obtain the preliminary privileges of the first degree. The writer has for two years been engaged upon official ethnologic investigations among the Ojibwa, and has secured very full notes-of the proceedings of the society. Dr. Hoffman has this summer been initiated into all the decrees of the Grand Medicine Society, and is believed to be the first white man who has gone through such initiation. He gave interesting particulars of the rites of initiation and a vast amount of information not hitherto published.






