A public meeting was held on Tuesday evening, August 3rd inst., at the Longley, Esq., Brigetown, for the purpose of considering the advisability of having the name Act brought into operation in this County.

The following resolution moved by William Miller, Esq., seconded by Mr. Tolson Chute, was adopted almost unanimously.

Resolved, That the County of Annapolis do not intend to have the Canada Temperance Act submitted to the people at the next election, or to have it brought into operation in this County.
