CHURCH AND MANSE BUILDING FUND.

The Board of Management of the Church and Manse Building Fund, in submitting their fourth Annual Report to the General Assembly, have to express their gratitude to God for the valuable service rendered to the Church by means of this fund. During the past year the Board have assisted in the erection of three manses, one church-manse, and seventeen churches, in all twenty-one buildings, besides extending additional aid to buildings formerly assisted by the fund at Minnedosa and Carman, and completing the assistance given to the two churches in the Carlyle district. While considering with greatest care every application presented to them, and in some cases declining to grant the full amount of assistance asked, the Board are thankful to report that the condition of the fund has enabled them to meet every application to the full extent which they thought the case required.

The advances from the fund have been as follows :--

I.-PRESBYTERY OF WINNIPEG.

- SPRINGFIELD.—An excellent farming district within a few miles of Winnipeg. Loan advanced on Manse, \$300. Total value, \$1200.
- FORT FRANCES.—Situated in an important lumbering district, at the head of navigation on the Rainy River, with good farming along the river banks: accessible by steamer from Rat Portage, by Lake of the Woods and Rainy River. Free grant of \$200 promised, of which there has been paid \$36, on a church costing \$1000.

II.-PRESBYTERY OF ROCK LAKE.

- MORDEN.—The most important town on the line of the Manitoba & South-Western Railway. Centre of an excellent agricultural country, Loan of \$500, advanced on a church costing a little over \$1500.
- BEACONSFIELD. Farming district connected with Swan Lake Mission. Free grant of \$100 on a church costing \$500.
 - CARMAN.—Additional assistance to the amount of \$100 was advanced on the church here, making a total loan of \$600 on a building costing \$1250.

- 5. OAK LAKE.—A village on the line of the C. P. R., the fourth station west of Brandon. Excellent wheat country to south and north. Loan of \$350 on a church costing \$600.
- GLENDALE. A farming district connected with the congregation of Neepawa, and lying near the line of the Manitoba and North Western Railway. Loan of \$450.80 on a church valued at \$1000.
 - MINNEDOSA.—An additional loan of \$600 has been advanced to complete the Manse heremaking a total advance of \$1100 on a building costing \$1800, the Board securing deed and control of the building.

PRESBYTERY OF REGINA.

- CARLYLE. Two churches were erected here last year, as stated in Report of 1885. The Board gave a free grant of \$150 in each case, of which \$100 each were reported last year, and \$50 each are now reported, each church costing \$500.
- WHITEWOOD.—Town on line of C. P. R. Centre of a very promising farming district. A combined church and manse has been erected here, costing \$1000, on which a loan of \$650 has been advanced.
- MEDICINE HAT.—The congregation here purchased from the N. W. Coal and Navigation Co'y
 —on the removal of the headquarters of the Company to Lethbridge,—a house for a manse.
 The original value of the building was \$1800. Cost the congregation, with alterations,
 \$800. Loan advanced, \$400.
- KINBRAE. A farming district north of the Qu'appelle River, and a few miles west of the Provincial boundary of Manitoba. Free grant of \$100, on a church costing \$500.
- 10. FORT QU'APPELLE, —One of the most important centres in the N. W. Territories. Loan of \$600, advanced on a Manse costing \$1300.
- CARSSDALE. A heautiful farming district about 18 miles N.W. of Regina. Free grant of \$125 on a church costing \$500.
- LONGLAKETON.—Forming district at lower end of Long Lake, about 25 miles from Regina. Free grant of \$125, on church costing \$550.
- CLOVER BAR.—Good farming district connected with the congregation of Edmonton. Free grant of \$100, on church costing \$500.
- FORT SASKATCHEWAN.-Also connected with Edmonton congregation: chief station of N.W.M. Police for the district. Free grant of \$100 on church costing \$500.
- 15. FORT MACLEOD.—Chief centre of cattle-ranching country, and very important station of N.W.M. Police. Free grant of \$250, on church costing \$1300. Site granted by the Domion Government.
- 16. LETHBRIDGE.—Headquarters of the N.W. Coal and Navigation Company; most important mining district in the North-West. Loan of \$560.13 on church costing \$1600. The Board gratefully acknowledge a donation of \$100 from Peter Redpath, Esq., formerly of Montreal, in aid of this church. Site granted by the N.W. Coal and Navigation Company.
- 17. ALAMEDA.-Excellent farming country, south of Moose Mountain, and near the U.S. boundary line. Free grant of \$100, on church costing \$500.
- MOOSE CREEK.—Also a good farming country, south of Moose Mountain. Free grant of \$150, on church costing \$500.
- KINDRED'S (Erskine Church).—Farming district connected with the congregation of Grenfell, lying south of the line of the C.P.R. Free grant of \$100 on church costing \$400.
- 20. CATHCART. (N rthern Section).
- 21. CATHCART. (Southern Section). Two churches have been erected in the Cathcart district, south of Wapella Station, the funds being supplied almost entirely by the Board. The district is occupied by a colony of Soctishs croicers, who were greatly in need of services, but were unable to provide themselves with any place of worship, their own houses being utterly inade-quate to accommodate the number that would assemble for worship. The outlay from the Fund on behalf of these churches has been \$1408.81. The people contributed in the form of labour and hauling materials, their service in this respect being worth about \$100, and subscriptions to the amount of \$125 have been promised by them. It was expected that assistance would be received from Scotland in response to an urgent appeal made by the editor of the Edinburgh Scotsman, but as yet the only ald given, apart from that rendered by the board, has been received from a few friends in Canada. It was necessary, also, that two churches should be erected to accommodate the scattered settlers, and in the meantime the

burden had to be borne by the C. & M. B. Fund. in view, however, of the situation of these crofters and of the increasing interest taken in our mission work by friends in Scotland, the Board felt that they were justified in this outlay. The Board gratefully acknowledge receipt of two stoves, with piping, for these churches, each valued at \$30, one given by the McClary Manufacturing Co y. the other by the Winnipeg agent of the Company, J. W. Driscoll, Esq.

The Board have to acknowledge the kindness of the Canada North West Land Co'y, through their Winnipeg director, W. B. Scarth, Esq., in giving many valuable sites for churches. The Company have been ready to meet the wishes of the Board in this respect at every point on their property where a church has been erected.

In order that the work already accomplished by means of the C. & M. B. Fund may be more clearly understood, the Board of Management would call attention to the number and value of the buildings that have been assisted from the Fund since the Boa... was first organized in accordance with the resolution of the General Assembly in 1882.

* It may be observed that the Treasurer's statement gives \$8:66.40 as the amount advanced on buildings from the Fund for the past year. This difference is caused by including in his statement several payments made this year on account of advances passed and parity paid last year. The same overlapping may be noticed in comparing the statements here given with those of the Treasurer in prvious reports. It will be seen, however, that the total amounts here given correspond with those in the Treasure: s General Abstract of the transactions of the past four years. As further illustrating the benefit of the Fund, it may be noted that, during the past four years, there have been erected within the bounds of the Synod of Manitoba and the North-West only eight churches and two manses without any assistance from the C. & M. B. Fund; and although, no doubt, some of the buildings referred to in this report might have been erected even if the Fund had not existed, yet it may be safely assumed that by far the larger proportion of them would not have been built had it not been for this assistance.

It was expected, when the Board first undertook the administration of the Fund, that congregations would have been able to repay the loans within three, or at most, four years. The succession of undvorable seasons, however, and the unexpected check laid upon the progress of many communities, combined with the difficulties incidental to new settlements, have prevented, as yet, any general repayment on account of loans, the total amount repaid by congregations up to this date being \$2704.71, including some amounts of interest on loans.

The security furnished to the Board in almost every case is in the form either of mortgage or of notes signed, jointly and severally, by the managers of the congregation. In view of the difficulties that many congregations have experienced in meeting their obligations, the Board have been unwilling to use extreme measures to secure repayment. They regard the securities as, for the most part, thoroughly valid, and although there may be unexpected delay on the part of congregations in repaying the loans yet the general interests of the Church are being very largely advanced by means of the Fund, and, through the help thus rendered, a great impetus is given to many departments of church work.

Since the last report of this Board was presented to the Assembly the census of the North-West Territories has been taken. From the returns it appears that about one-third of the white population of the Territories (excluding, that is, half-breeds as well as Indians) is Presbyterian. It is estimated that within the Province of Manitoba a still greater proportion is Presbyterian. It is estimated that within the Province of Manitoba a still greater proportion is Presbyterian. This indicates the necessity that is laid upon the Church for the vigorous prosecution of her work within the bounds of this Synod, and at the same time illustrates how large a field there is for the operations of the C. & M.B. Fund. It is gratifying to the Board to be able to report that there is scarcely a place of iraportance in the Province or in the N.W.Territories where there is not aPresbyterian place of worship or else the prospect of the early erection of one. Many of the rural districts, however, are still destitute of churches, and there is a very serious lack of manses. The applications now before the Board are almost aufficient to exhaust the balance at present on hand; but it is hoped that the liberality that has sustained the work hitherto will be continued, as expenditure in this direction at the present stage in the settlement of the country must yield most important results in developing the life and work of the Church.

A statement is herewith presented from the Superintendent of Missions, shewing the effect that the C. & M.B. Fund has had upon the general work of the Church in Manitoba and the North-West.

A full statement is submitted by the Treasurer, shewing not only the receipts and expenditure for the past year, but also an abstract statement of the fund from the beginning.

STATEMENT

OF THE

SUPERINTENDENT OF MISSIONS.

In compliance with the request of the Church and Manse Building Board I herewith submit a statement shewing the effect which the efforts put forth by the Board have had in advancing Mission work within the bounds of the Synod.

After my appointment as Superintendent of Missions in 1881 I visited the different settlements in the country, and was very much struck with the lack of suitable places of worship and residences for ministers and their families. School houses, even in Manitoba were then few in number, and where available for Sabbath services afforded indifferent seating accommodation for adults. Religious services were therefore conducted in country districts almost wholly in settlers' houses. These were frequently small, and so low of roof sometimes as to make it difficult for an ordinary man to stand erect. Granaries, stables and stable lofts were sometimes resorted to, but the sounds, and sights and smells occasionally marred the effect of the service. In villages and incipient towns unfinished stores and dwelling houses were extemporized into churches, but always to be abandoned, when nearing completion, for some other structures in a less developed state. Public and private halls were secured, but in such cases ther rent left little of the revenue of the congregation to be applied on salary. As much as \$30 a month has been paid for a private hall. The C. P. R. Company generously put their station houses at our disposal, and in several cases their offer was accepted. The arrival of trains, however, during the time of service—a frequent occurrence—interfered seriously with the effect produced by the preaching of the truth. In some instances the only available to frequent such places on other days for other purposes scarcely cared to attend religious services there on Sabbath. They were anxious not to mix things. Men entirely opposed to the liquor traffic were unwilling to accept any favors at the hands of liquor dealers. The consequence was that in country and town a considerable per centage of the population absented themelves from the services there on Sabbath. They were anxious not to mix things. Men entirely opposed to the liquor traffic of religion and were fast acquiring habits that would crystallize into chara

It was vain to ask the people to build. Except at a few points timber was not available. Lumber was scarce and dear. The settlers in many cases were young and without means, in every instance beginning life, and always with large outlays and no returns. That only 15 churches and not a single manse were built between 1874 and 1882 is the best evidence of their helpless state. And of these 15 churches two were not finished till the Board advanced the money to finish them, one had to be sold for \$50 to prevent its being a total loss, and others were crushed with debt.

The need of manses was as great if not greater than that of churches. Where houses could be had rents were high. Twenty dollars (\$20) per month was regarded as a very reasonable rent for a house with very moderate accommodation. When it is borne in mind that the salary of an ordained missionary was only \$500 per annum at that time it is plain that he could not afford to give \$240 of the amount for house rent. But in many cases a house could not be had at any figure, and hence missionaries and their families were compelled to live in places scarcely fit to shelter cattle. ces the work followed. And unless the Church takes care this must in many cases continue. Foreign missionaries are provided with homes for themselves and their families, and the requisite appliances are forthcoming to enable them to carry on their work with some prospect of success. This is as it should be. But why should a different rule obtain in the case of the home missionary?

The discoveries made convinced me of the necessity of timely aid being given to our people in the matter of church erection, and the impression was confirmed by the knowledge that much of the success of the American churches in the work of church extension was due to the judicious aid given by Church Erection Boards. In our own country the good effect of the Hunter Fund in Nova Scotia is well known, and it is also known that church extension suffered in Ontario in early days owing to the lack of a building fund. The Fund has now been brought to bear on our work since the spring of 1882, and it is not too early to "take stock" of what has been done. And in doing so it should be borne in mind that the country during three fourths of the time has been passing thro' a period of severe depression.

At the outset let it be noted that there is not a point of any importance on any line of railway between Lake Superior and the Rocky Movntains constructed before the close of last season that is not provided with a place of worship and a rissionary. Villages and towns are centres from which the Church is operating, and in 'all of them visibility is given to Presbyterianism. Rat Portage, Carberry, Brandon, Oak Lake, Virden, Moosejaw, Whitewood, Broadview, Grenfell, Wolseley, Indian Head, Qu'Appelle, Regina, Moosomin, Medicine Hat and Calgary, on the main line of the C. P. R., are provided with places of worship. Gladstone, Neepawa and Minnedosa on the M. & N. W. R_y ; Morlen and Manicou on the M. S. W., and Lethbridge on the Galt Railway, are in the same position. Nor have centres removed from the lines of railway been neglected. To Edmonton, Fort MeLeod, Carman, Rapid City, Fort Qu'Appelle, Fort Saskatchewan, the aid of the Board has been extended and with good results. That 78 churches and manses (of which 75 have received assistance from the C, & M. B. Fund,) have been erected during the pact four years buildings represent about two-thirds (z_i) of all the edifices belonging to the Church in the Northwest.

But the effect of the Fund has not been merely or mainly to stimulate the liberality of the people in giving outward form to religion. The children of the Church have been cheered by the generous • aid given. The strong have been bearing the burdens of the weak and so fulfilling the Christian law and giving practical proof of the unity of the Church. The attention of others has been arrested and persons unconnected with any church have been attracted to our communion.

The better accommodation afforded by the churches has answered the objections of many of the careless and quarrelsome and so swelled the audiences and wilened the spheres of usefulness of our missionaries. Instances might be given where carelessness has given place to seriousness, and seriousness ripened into piety.

With larger audiences have come larger revenues, and a diminution in the amount required from the Home Mission Fund. Until its church was completed Port Arthur received \$300 from the H. M. Fund. It is now self-sustaining, and promises its pastor \$1000 and a manse. The contributions of Edmontou went up from \$300 to \$700 in one year, and those of Rat Portage from \$550 to \$1000 and a manse. In less than three years from the time it was first occupied as a mission station, Calgary became self-sustaining from the outset. At Carberry, Regina, Braudon, Virden and other points similar results have been seen.

The increase in local givings has enabled the Church to extend her operations. If to-day there is not a settlement of any size in Manitoba or the Northwest where a representative of our Church is not ministering to the spiritual wants of the people, it is largely due to the fact that the erection of churches in so many centres has diminished the demand on the H. M. Fund and left the money to open up new districts. The C. & M. B. Fund has thus been a valuable aid in church extension.

The presence of a church has also furnished a guarantee for the prosecution of S. S. work. In this country, where family religion is so often neglected and children are left to grow up without any home religious training, the importance of Sabbath School work is scarcely of less importance than even the service of the sanctuary. During the last four years the number of Sabbath Schools has gone up from 15 to 145 and the attendance from 619 to 5,727.

The erection of manses has contributed much to the comfort of several of our missionaries and their families. Money has been saved by the manses to the missionaries and to church funds. Four-teen manses have been exected already. Reckoning the rent at \$15 per month each-a very moderate figure—an annual saving of \$2,520 has been effected. At eight per cent, the ruling bank rate of interest, this sum capitalized would amount to \$31,500, or two thirds of the whole sum expended or church and manse erection from the funds of the Board.

The need of manses in the Northwest for congregational work is greater than in the older Provinces. Here are found young people in large numbers away from home and the healthy restraints that the word implies. There are few opportunities afforded to satisfy the cravings of their social nature.

With all that the Board has been enabled to do, we are yet only on the threshold of the work. At present our Church holds services at, at least, 350 different points within the bounds of the Synod. There are only 85 churches, or not a church for every fourth station. There are over 100 separate congregations and mission fields, but only 19 manses, or not a manse for every fifth minister.

Settlements are moreover extending steadily. Owing to the rebellion of last year immigration was checked. This year the tide has begun to flow again, and the proportion of incomers that belong to our Church continues large. They must be followed and cared for. This is impossible without funds for building.

This statement would be incomplete without a recognition of the valuable aid given by the Eastern Provinces, and especially Ontarlo, in the prosecution of this work. Members and adherents of the Church in Ontario have furnished most of the means that have enabled the Church to prosecute her work, and for the most part the money has been given cheerfully as well as liberally.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CHURCH AND MANSE BUILDING FUND.

(Adopted by the General Assembly, June, 1882.)

1. The Fund shall be called the Church and Manse Building Fund of the Presbyterian Church in Canada for Manitoba and the North-West.

2. The amount to be aimed at in the first place shall be one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000); the Fund shall be raised by subscriptions and bequests.

3. The money constituting the Fund shall be, at the discretion of the Board, either invested and the revenue accruing therefrom be given in the form of grants to congregations engaged in the erection of Churches and Manses, or shall be lent to such congregations for a limited number of years, either with or without interest.

4. The management of the Fund shall be entrustel to a Board of nine members, six of these to be appointed annually by the Assembly; the other members of the Board to be the Superintendent of Missions for Manitoba and the North-West, the Convener of the Home Mission Committee, Western Section, and one member appointed by the Home Mission Committee. The ordinary place of meeting shall be Winnipeg. The Board shall have power to fill sny vacancies made by death or resignation, until the next General Assembly thereafter.

5. All applications for aid shall be made to this Board through the Presbytery of the bounds, and before being considered by the Board must be recommended by the Presbytery, but the Board is to be sole judge as to the merits of the application, and the amount of aid to be granted.

6. The assistance where made in the form of a grant, shall not, except in special circumstances, exceed one-fifth of the total cost of the building; and when made in the form of a loan shall not exceed fifty per cent of the cost. The money shall be payable only when the building can be used for service, in the case of grants. In the case of loans it may be advanced from time to time. No grant to be made or loan effected until the Board is satisfied that a valid title to the property, or a bond to that effect, has been secured by the congregation, and that the deed be in the form approved 'by the General Assembly.

7. It shall be competent for the Board, with the approval of the General Assembly, to make changes in these regulations, but such shall not extend to the alienation of the capital intrusted to the Board.

8. The Board shall report its transactions annually through the Home Mission Committee to the General Assembly.

In making advances from the Fund the Board of Management require, in addition to the terms prescribed by the General Assembly, that loans shall usually be repaid within three years; that payment shall be guaranteed by the personal bond of the managers of the congregations, or by a first mortgage on the Church property; and, in most instances, that interest be paid upon loans at a rate not exceeding five per cent, per annum.




DESIGN 1. CHURCH AND MANSE COMBINED.




