REAL ESTATE INTELLIGENCE

List of Property Transfers, and Building Permits Issued—Business of Late Has Been Fair—People are Purchasing Houses Rather Than Pay Increased Rentals—Pan-American Has Worked Temporary Injury to General Business in Toronto.

Yesterday Mr. J. A. McIlwain, real estate agent, 94 Victoria street, parted with some interesting estimates to a representative of The World as to how business has been progressing here of late. Mr. McIlwain says: "Business here of late has been fair, and house property in Toronto is rapidly increasing to the price of \$10,000 because of the security of vacant houses. It is a conservative estimate to say that several thousand families in this city have their household furniture stored, and it is equally true that present tenants in large numbers are purchasing houses rather than pay the increased rentals." In connection with the question, "Has the Pan-American Exposition affected business in Toronto?" Mr. McIlwain replied as follows: "From a business standpoint the Pan-American Exposition has worked temporary injury to the general business interests of Toronto, and quite naturally, because in a large measure and Toronto are civic neighbors, and rivals in many branches of business, and any uncomely large enterprise on the part of one is certain to depress conditions in the other. We have beyond question, lost many citizens during the past year, who, drawn by the powerful magnet of a great industrial exposition, have left their homes in Toronto. Mr. McIlwain said: "But Toronto's opportunity is coming, and it is only a question of time when it will be given in full measure."

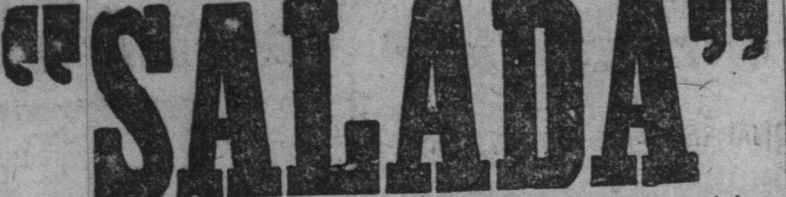

MONOPOLY IN LAGER BEER TRADE Modified Gothenburg System is in Successful Operation in Norway.

IT IS THE SWEDISH PLAN EXPANDED

Under Powers Given Municipal Councils in the Regulation of the Traffic.

Stockholm, Oct. 4.—The Norwegian method of dealing with the liquor traffic is the Gothenburg system modified. The Balmag, as the monopoly is called in Norway, is the same as the Balmag in Sweden—a society composed of benevolent people who control the trade in the interest of temperance, without profit for themselves. In Norway they are allowed 5 per cent. of the net proceeds for distribution among the shareholders, instead of 8 per cent. in Sweden, and the surplus profits, instead of going into the general fund of the municipal treasury, as in Sweden—which some people think induces the taxpayers to encourage intemperance—are distributed among benevolent institutions and objects of public utility which are entirely dependent upon private support. Any charity or institution which accepts aid from the municipality or from the government, however small, is disqualified from participating in the pecuniary benefits of the Norwegian plan of liquor control. This is an advanced step, removes one serious objection advanced by prohibitionists, and establishes a monopoly of the traffic in the hands of the municipality.

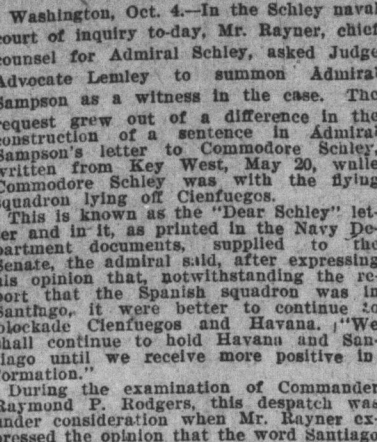
