FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING.

On the morning of June 3rd the delegates and friends met in the Northern church, Toronto. The number of representatives present from our various auxiliaries was fairly good, considering the large district covered by our Board and the consequently long distance some would have to travel in order to attend this meeting. Although the weather was not favorable on this opening morning still all faces were brightened with the joy of meeting and greeting those who are becoming very familiar as co-workers in the Women's Board. With much regret we learned that our efficient secretary, Miss Wood, was unavoidably prevented from attending this meeting. The delegates and friends were entertained at lunch each day, and tea was also served on the closing evening. Although the members of all the Toronto Auxiliaries united in entertaining the guests, still the members of the Northern church were especially active and most indefatigable in their efforts to make all happy.

FIRST DAY.

The devotional meeting led by Mrs. Wickson, of Toronto, occupied the first half hour. The leading thought of this meeting was Christian Consecration in the Home, in the Church and in the Foreign Field. At the close the President took the chair and opened the business session. Miss Willson, of Toronto, was appointed minute secretary. The minutes of the last afternoon session of the annual meeting, held in Montreal last year, were read and confirmed.

Mrs. Williams then read a message from Miss Wood, in which our secretary regretted her inability to be present at this annual meeting. Moved by Mrs. Dr. Richardson, seconded by Mrs. Nasmith that a telegram be sent Miss Wood expressing our sorrow as a Board that she has found it impossible to meet with us. This was carried unanimously.

Mrs Pratt, of Bowmanville, was introduced and made a few remarks in response to the welcome extended.

Miss Edgar, of Hamilton, was introduced, after which the meeting adjourned for luncheon.

The afternoon session opened at two o'clock, the president in the chair. The minutes of the morning session were read and confirmed. Mrs. Robertson, of Toronto, in behalf of the Toronto Branch, extended a most cordial welcome to the delegates, and Mrs. Powter, of Montreal, gave a fitting response.

The president then delivered her annual address and the following ladies presented the greetings of their several societies :

Mrs. G. H. Robinson, for the Presbyterian Women's Missionary Society ; Mrs. John Firstbroke, for the Baptist Missionary Society ; Mrs. Dr. Willmott, for the Methodist Missionary Society ; Mrs. D. Cowan, for the Toronto District W. C. T. U. Mrs. C. T. Williams presented the greetings from the Canadian Women's Board of Missions, and also read a letter of greeting from the Secretary of the Woman's Board of Missions of the Interior.

After the hymn "Onward Christian Soldiers" had been sung, Mrs. C. T. Williams read the report of the Corresponding Secretary. This report showed a total of 36 Auxillaries, 6 Young Women's Auxillaries and 19 Mission Bands—61 societies in all. On motion the report was adopted. The Treasurer's Report was then received, which showed an income of \$1829.13. On motion by Mrs. Strathern and Mrs. Garlick this report was adopted. A vote of thanks to the Treasurer for the careful and business-like way in which she had carried on her work was also passed.

Miss Macallum then gave a map exercise on Turkey, and a talk about her own work in Smyrna. The address was full of interest and at its close a hearty vote of thanks was tendered Miss Macallum.

The reports of the Foreign Secretary, the Superintendent of the Literature Department, the Superintendent of the Missionary Letters Department and of the Organization Department were read and adopted.

Mrs. Moodie, of Montreal, read a paper on Women's Boards which was much enjoyed. A collection was taken up amounting to \$5.50.

After the hymn "Go ye into all the World" the benediction was pronounced by Rev. Geo. Robertson which closed the afternoon session.

SECOND DAY.

At ten o'clock the delegates assembled and were led in devotional exercises by Miss Macallum. At 10.45 the president took the chair and opened the business session. A letter of greeting from Miss Child, Secretary of the Woman's Board of Missions, Boston, was read.

The minutes of the previous afternoon were read and confirmed.

The following reports were then read :

Toronto Branch—Miss Willson.

Paris Mission Band—Mrs. Bolton.

Paris Young Ladies' Missionary Society—Miss Patton.

Pine Grove Mission Band—Miss Bennets.

Calvary Church Ladies' Missionary Society—Miss Moeser.

Mrs. Williams then read the petition of the World's W. C. T. U. to the Governments of the world, which our Board was requested to authorize the president and secretary to sign on our behalf. On motion by Mrs. Boulton and Mrs. Robertson the request was complied with. Mrs. Burton gave an additional report of the Ladies' Society and the Young Ladies' Society of the Northern church, Toronto.

The report of the Nominating Committee was then received. Before the election of officers it was moved by Mrs. Nasmith, seconded by Mrs. Barker, that the Vice-presidents be the Presidents of the several branches together with Mrs. Wilkes, of Montreal.—Carried.

The following officers were then elected : President, Mrs. Macallum, Maxville ; Vice-president at large, Mrs. George Robertson, Toronto ; Vice-presidents, the Presidents of the several branches, and Mrs. Wilkes, Montreal ; Corresponding Secretary, Miss Wood, Montreal ; Home Secretary, Mrs. Strathern, Toronto ; Foreign Secretary, Mrs. Cowan, Ottawa ; Superintendents of Literature Department for Ontario, Miss Ashdown and Miss Copp, Toronto ; Superintendent of Literature Department for Quebec, Miss C. Richardson, Montreal ; Superintendent of the Department of Missionary Letters, Mrs. J. G.

Thompson; Auditors, Miss R. James and Miss Dougall, Montreal. Miss Currie having resigned her office as Superintendent of Department of Missionary Letters, a hearty vote of thanks was tendered her for her faithful work in the past.

We regret to learn that Mrs. J. G. Thompson has resigned her office, but feel sure that her successor, Miss Foggin, Toronto, will ably perform the duties devolving upon her.

The report of the Business Committee was received and considered item by item as follows:

I. Appointment of a committee to compile and arrange for the printing of the annual report. On motion the following ladies were appointed on this committee: Mrs. Robertson, Mrs. Sandwell, Mrs. Burton, Mrs. Roberts, Miss Willson.

II. Number of annual reports. On motion of Mrs. Boulton and Mrs. Bolton it was decided to print 2,000 copies of the report and distribute them free when applied for by each society.

III. Place and time of next annual meeting, and authorization of sub-executive to arrange for any unavoidable changes. An invitation from Ottawa was extended through Mrs. Cowan, and on motion was accepted. Moved by Mrs. Bolton, seconded by Miss Rawlings, that the question of date and any unavoidable changes be left with the sub-executive.—Carried.

IV. Reply to the request of the C. C. M. S. for fraternal delegates to attend the annual meeting of that society. On motion of Mrs. Ashdown and Mrs. Roberts, the President, Mrs. Boulton and Mrs. Robertson were appointed to carry our greetings.

V. Continuation of Miss Lyman's support.

VI. Reply to the letter of the Secretary of the C. C. F. M. S. offering to transfer Miss Clarke to the Woman's Board. Moved by Mrs. Ashdown, seconded by Mrs. Cowan, that both Miss Lyman and Miss Clarke be supported by the Woman's Board for the coming year.—Carried. The meeting then adjourned for lunch.

The afternoon session opened at two o'clock. After singing hymn

“Rock of Ages” the minutes of the morning session were read and adopted. Report of the Business Committee continued:

Moved by Miss Rawlings, seconded by Mrs. Robertson, that the Board shall pay the salaries of the missionaries through the Woman’s Board of Missions of Boston, and that our Corresponding Secretary be instructed to write to the Secretary of the C. C. F. M. S., stating these resolutions of the Board, and also their willingness to comply with the request of the Secretary of that society that the Treasurer of the C. C. W. B. M. would send to the Treasurer of the C. C. F. M. S. a memorandum of the amount raised for foreign missions.—Carried.

VIII. Submission of two new by-laws.

By-law No. I.

The expenses of the President, Secretary and Treasurer in travelling to and from the annual meeting be borne by the Board. Moved by Mrs. Robertson, seconded by Mrs. Ashdown, that this by-law be passed.—Carried.

By-law No. II.

The Treasurer shall pay no moneys except by order of the President and Secretary of the Board. This by-law was moved by Mrs. Boulton, seconded by Mrs. Powter, and carried.

IX. Amount of grant to Literature Department. Moved by Mrs. Garlick, seconded by Mrs. Robinson that the Literature Department be provided with \$20.00, together with the amount of \$5.00 already on hand.—Carried.

X. Question of appointing additional organizers, and how best to meet their expenses. Moved by Mrs. Boulton, seconded by Mrs. Cowan, that the organizers work in connection with the branches and that the branches be responsible for their expenses.—Carried.

On motion it was decided to have only two organizers with the President, who is organizer *ex-officio*.

XI. Discussion as to the best method of securing reduced railway fares, and the bringing of delegates’ certificates to the convention,

Mrs. Strathern gave the report of the Committee on Credentials and recommended a slip to be printed to be signed by the Secretary of the

Board, as a credential for delegates, and also a slip printed to go with this, requesting the delegates to bring receipted railway certificates as well. On motion by Mrs. Boulton and Mrs. Powter it was resolved to secure the printed forms referred to.

Mrs. Barker then gave a paper on "Dark Spots in a Home Missionary's Life." This paper was very interesting, and on motion it was resolved to ask the editor to print it in the Independent. Miss Wetherald gave a beautiful reading called "Hidden Power." The Resolutions Committee then reported:

Nos. I, II, III were expressive of gratitude to our Heavenly Father for His blessing on our work throughout the year now closing, for one new missionary who has started, and for one who is preparing to go, and for one new life member, also thanks for the amicable arrangement with the C. C. F. M. S. by which we can claim Miss Clarke as our missionary.

Resolution IV, rejoicing and thanksgiving for the success of our present convention.

Resolution V. Thanks to the ladies who have taken part in this annual meeting—especially the President, acting Secretary and Treasurer.

Resolution VI. Thanks to the ladies of the Northern Church for the use of their building, and to all the friends who have so kindly entertained the visiting delegates. On motion the report was accepted as a whole.

Mrs. Robinson gave a paper on "How best to conduct a Missionary Meeting." This paper was excellent, and it was resolved on motion that a request be made that it be printed in the Independent.

Moved by Mrs. Robertson, seconded by Mrs. Nasmith, that as a token of our appreciation of the presence and assistance of Miss Macallum at this meeting, our Board shall contribute \$25.00 toward her expenses.—Carried.

A collection was then taken up amounting to \$7.95.

After one verse of "From Greenland's Icy Mountains" had been sung, Mrs. Thompson read a paper on "Mission Bands."

The Finance Committee gave a partial report, it being impossible to complete it until the close of the convention. On motion of Mrs. Ashdown and Mrs. Powter all unfinished business and settlements were left in the hands of the sub-executive. The minutes of the afternoon session were read and confirmed after which the meeting adjourned.

EVENING MEETING.

A public meeting was held in the evening, Rev. John Burton in the chair. There was a large attendance, and much interest manifested in the programme provided. Short addresses were given by Mr. Stevens, returned missionary from China, by Miss Moeser, who is soon to go to Africa, and by the chairman. Miss Wetherald gave a reading entitled "Jamie," and Miss Macallum gave an interesting and instructive paper on "Mission Work in Smyrna," where she had been laboring for several years. A collection was taken up amounting to \$25.00. After singing "God be with you till we meet again," the fifth annual meeting of the C. C. W. B. M. was brought to a close.

OFFICIAL REPORTS.

The corresponding secretary reported as follows:—

Reports have been received from 28 Auxiliaries, 4 Young Women's Auxiliaries and 3 Mission Bands—35 Societies in all. Eight Auxiliaries, 2 Young Women's Auxilliaris and 6 Mission Bands that were reported last year have failed to make returns to the Secretary this year. We believe they are still working, in which case the totals would be 36 Auxiliaries, 6 Young Women's Auxiliaries and 19 Mission Bands—61 Societies in all. Full returns of membership have not been given, but we think one thousand members would be a generous estimate for these 61 societies. As the year book reports over 4,000 female members of our churches in Ontario, Quebec and Manitoba, we see that but one out of four has joined our ranks. Let us hope that each delegate present will go home fully resolved to seek out and enlist those other three women who might be interested but are not.

Emmanuel Church, Montreal, has generously contributed one month's salary for Miss Lyman; Waterville Ladies' Missionary Society, al-

though not auxiliary, has sent a donation. Hawkesbury and Maple Grove have union missionary societies composed of different denominations. These also have sent donations. We welcome these tokens of friendly interest from those not in our ranks.

From the report of the Foreign Secretary, Mrs. Cowan, we quote:—
 “With those doing our work in foreign lands it has thus far been largely a period of preparation and seed sowing rather than of harvesting. Difficult languages were to be learned and vitality exhausted by the change from this invigorating climate to the debilitating influence of tropical residence had to be restored before the highest forms of work could be undertaken. But there is cause for deepest gratitude to God for the cheering report your secretary can give. One year ago much anxiety was felt concerning the health of Miss Lyman. She was forced to leave school some weeks before its close and hasten to the bracing air of the mountains. God’s blessing on the means employed enabled her to return to her work at the usual time.” The many cheering words that have come from, and about Miss Clarke from across the sea, have been especially welcome. She reached Bailundu in October without having had a day’s illness in her long, wearisome and perilous journey. Miss Clarke has a class of 18 boys in Mr. Woodside’s school, and of these she writes “They study well and it is a joy to teach them.” One of Miss Clarke’s associate workers writes of her, “She is full of work and love for the people, and has a way with her which wins them at once.” The open door of the new year is now set before us. Let us enter it with hearts inspired for nobles effort by this grandest thought of the day—that if the Christian church does her duty, before this century closes, even within the life-time of the oldest member of this Board, the world may be won for Christ.

Miss Rawlings, Superiniendent of Department for Organization of Auxiliaries and Mission Bands, reports:—“During the year one branch has been organized, another helped, three Women’s Auxiliaries, one Young Women’s Auxiliary and two Mission Bands have been formed. Four churches hope to organize societies after the summer months have passed.

CONSTITUTION
OF THE
CANADA CONGREGATIONAL WOMAN'S BOARD OF MISSIONS.

Revised June, 1890.

I. NAME.

This Society shall be called, "The Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions," and shall co-operate with the Canada Congregational Missionary Society and the Canada Congregational Foreign Missionary Society.

II. OBJECT.

Its object shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit, and the raising of funds for carrying on missionary work in the Home and Foreign fields.

III. MEMBERSHIP.

Any lady may become a member of this Board by contributing to its funds one dollar a year ; or a life member by payment of twenty-five dollars at one time.

It shall be understood that the object to which these fees are to be devoted shall not be determined by the donors, but shall be left to the Board.

IV. OFFICERS.

The Officers of this Society shall be a President, a Vice-President at large, Vice-Presidents (including Presidents of Branches), a Home Secretary, a Foreign Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer.

The President, the Corresponding Secretary and the Treasurer shall form a sub-committee to decide questions of urgency, subject to the approval of the Board. The Officers and Superintendents of Departments shall form an executive committee to arrange for the annual meeting.

V. BRANCHES.

The Auxiliary Societies shall, as far as possible, be organized into Branches, each of which shall have its President and Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer, to be elected annually. Each branch shall report, semi-annually to the General Board, and its officers shall be *ex-officio* members of the General Board.

VI. AUXILIARIES.

Section A. Any number of ladies organized into a Missionary Society, may become auxiliary to the Board by the payment of ten dollars annually, the money to be appropriated to the Home or to the Foreign Missionary Society, as the Auxiliary may desire. Each Auxiliary Society shall be entitled to be represented at the annual meeting by one delegate for each ten dollars contributed to the Treasury.

Section B. Any Association of Young People banded together to aid the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions may be auxiliary to the General Society, by paying to the general fund at least \$5 annually.

Each Mission Band shall be entitled to send one delegate to the annual meeting of the Board, and is desired to select an appropriate name and report the same to the Society to which its money is sent.

VII. AMENDMENT.

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present at any annual meeting, provided one day's notice has been given in writing.

VIII. ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall from year to year be determined by the Society.

BY-LAW No. I.

The expenses of the President, Secretary and Treasurer incurred in travelling to and from the annual meeting shall be paid by the General Board.

BY-LAW No. II.

The Treasurer shall pay no monies except by order of the President and Secretary of the Board.

 CONSTITUTION FOR BRANCHES.

I. This Association of Auxiliary Societies shall be called the——— Branch of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board.

II. Its object shall be to band together neighboring societies, and to excite a greater interest in the work by the use of all suitable means, and especially by arranging for union meetings of the Missionary Societies as often as practicable.

III. The officers of the Branch shall be a President, Vice-Presidents (who shall be Presidents of the Auxiliaries), a Secretary and a Treasurer. These officers are *ex-officio* members of the General Board.

IV. The duty of the Secretary shall be to secure semi-annual reports from the Auxiliaries, and to forward such reports in condensed form to the Corresponding Secretary of the Board. The Treasurer shall, in like manner, receive semi-annually the contributions from the Auxiliaries and transmit them to the General Treasurer.

V. The annual meeting shall be held at such time and place as shall be agreed on by the officers.

 CONSTITUTION FOR AUXILIARIES.

(OPTIONAL.)

I. This Society shall be called the———Auxiliary of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions.

II. The object of this Society shall be the cultivation of a missionary spirit and the collection of money for missionary purposes.

III. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

IV. Any person may become a member of this Society by the payment of—cents weekly.

V. Money raised by this auxiliary for the Board may be appropriated to the Home and Foreign Work in such proportions as may be deemed desirable by the said Auxiliary.

VI. This Auxiliary shall report quarterly to the Secretary and Treasurer of the Branch with which it is connected.

CONSTITUTION FOR MISSION BANDS.

(OPTIONAL.)

I. This Association of Young People banded together to aid the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions shall be called ———and is Auxiliary to the General Society agreeing to pay not less than \$5 annually to the General Fund.

II. Anyone may become a member of the Band on payment of—cents a week.


III. The officers of the Band shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected annually.


IV. The duty of the President shall be to preside at all stated meetings and to have a general oversight of the work of the Band.

V. The duty of the Secretary shall be to keep a record of the proceedings of the Band, and to make an annual report to the Missionary Society to which it is Auxiliary.

VI. The Treasurer shall receive and hold all funds, paying the same quarterly to the Treasurer of the Society to which the Band is auxiliary, or to the Treasurer of the Branch.

VII. By the Constitution of the Canada Congregational Woman's Board of Missions the Band is entitled to send one delegate to the annual meeting.
