

The principal clergy for the ceremony, garbed in their most resplendent robes, will then proceed to their places. After a pause the bridal processio will follow, headed by the minor clea gy of the abbey and the choir in their rich scarlet cassocks. Lady Elizabeth will pass through the nave with her father, her train carried by two brides-maids and behind them the other six attendants in pairs. The opening sentences for the service have been specially written for the occasion, and will be read by the Dean of Westminster. The Archbishop of Canterbury will then deliver his charge to the bride and bridegroom, and the ring, having been placed on the finger of the bride, the blessing will follow. When the responses and prayers are done, the principals in the ceremony will go to the Edward the Confessor Chapel to sign the register on a huge table of ancient oak under the Confessor's tomb. Without further delay, the wedding party will drive back to Buckingham Palace, the King and Queen going first, so as formally to greet the bride and bridegroom at the head of the grand staircase. Crimson and gold will brighten the interior of the dim old abbey on the wedding morning. Bright crimson car-pet will be laid from the west door to the sacrarium, where the actual cere-mony takes place. 
British Doctor Says Self-Respect Should Be Restored to Vic-Before Cure Can Be tims Made.


London, April 1.-(By Mail)-"A person struggling alone to loosen the bonds of the drug habit is engaged in a task like that of Sisyphus himself," declared Dr. H. A. Burridge, in a paper read before the Medico-Legal Society, and published in "The British Medical Journal."

"Until self-respect has been re-established there is no hope of a cure." It was an absurdity, he said, if not a crime, to commit these people to prison, where the last shreds of their self-respect would be lost. Contrasting British and American methods of dealing with drug addicts, Dr. Burridge said that on this ide of the Atlantic the American principle of correlating treatment with penal re-pression had not been followed, nor had there been sufficient survey of drug addiction before legislation enact-

"Not only the medical but the legal mind in the United States regards the drug addict as a sufferer rather than

dug addict as a sufferer rather than a criminal," he said. "This dangerous drugs act seems as if it might become a 'dangerous to doctors act, and half the members of the Medico-Legal Society might pres-ently be employed in keeping the other half out of prison."
