Kirk-Session Report.

The Kirk-Session reports with thankfulness that the spiritual state of the congregation, as manifested in many ways, affords much that is encouraging and gratifying.

During the year 40 persons have been received into full communion with the church, on profession of faith; 32 by certificate; and 10 who had lapsed through carelessness have been restored—making a total of 82.

On the other hand 6 have been removed by death and 17 have left the city—making a decrease of 23.

The Communion Roll now numbers 426. This does not include students.

There have been during the year 45 baptisms, nearly double the number of last year; 13 marriages and 15 deaths.

The Kirk-Session feels that they and the congregation have been greatly bereaved since their last Report was made. Scarcely had the year begun when Mr. John Fraser, one of the oldest members of Session, and held in high esteem by all who knew him was taken away; and before it closed another vacancy was made in the Session by the death of the Reverend Dr. Bain, who, though his connection with the church was of recent date, had endeared himself to all “The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.”

The Kirk-Session congratulates the congregation on the near prospect of entering new St. Andrew's, and fervently prays and confidently anticipates that it will be in truth a holy place to many a life, round which many a sacred memory will cluster, and the centre of benevolence and beneficence radiating to a circumference seen only by God.

There are 251 scholars on the roll, and the average attendance has been 187. The small attendance has been due to the inconvenient place of meeting, and also to the number of wet and stormy Sundays. 220 scholars committed to memory verses of Scripture, and 190 studied the Shorter Catechism.

The school continues to use the International Scheme of Lessons. The following scholars have recited the Shorter Catechism:—Masters

John Gray, James Linton, and Misses Gertie Harold, Frankie Porter, Mattie Glasgow and Lizzie Sinclair. The Mother's Catechism:—Master E. D. Harris, Misses Florence Campbell, Annie Gillies, Lorraine Minnes. For the Paraphrases:—Mabel Boyd, Emma Strachan, Mary Bruce, G. McLymont and R. McLymont are entitled to prizes.

The name of Robt. Glasgow, one of the Librarians, has disappeared from our list. He is now in Portland, Oregon.

Mr. James Strachan, one of our teachers, is temporarily absent, being engaged in work in Hamilton, but trust he will soon be with us again.

The new books for the Library have been ordered, and when received the total number of volumes will be 1050. These will be distributed when we occupy our new Hall in a few weeks.

The amount of money raised by the school this year is \$427. Of this sum about \$20 have been paid to missions, \$103 for expenses, and \$275 to the church building fund.

In conclusion, we pray that the blessing of God may follow the efforts of another year.

The Women's Home Association have pleasure in reporting that during the past year their meetings have been largely attended ; that the liveliest interest in the affairs of the Society has been manifested ; that there has been a plentiful supply of willing and well qualified workers ; and that no inconsiderable work has been done.

The members of the Association to whom districts have been assigned have visited the families in them at least once every month. When sickness or the infirmities of age have required it, their visits have been frequent, always willingly paid and gratefully received.

Over 200 Records with St. Andrew's Notes have been circulated monthly during the year, keeping every household fully informed of the work and wants of the Church and the congregation. It is pleasing to report that owing to the satisfactory state of the funds the price of the Record with Notes has been reduced.

A stained glass window has been placed in the Church at a cost of \$1,000. The scene depicted is that of the Apostle Andrew introducing the Greeks to Christ. The design may be said to be that of the Association, and it has been very well executed by Messrs. Castle & Son, Montreal. It is hoped that it will be considered suitable, and will meet the approval of the congregation.

For upholstering the Church a house to house collection was made by the Association, instead of holding a sale, and the result has been satisfactory. Cushions of the best material covered with crimson damask are now being provided for every pew.

Additional communion plate, two cups and six salvers, has also been furnished, for which a subscription was made chiefly by the communicants.

Silver collection plates have also been supplied out of the funds of the Association.

Towards the salary of the City Missionary one member of the Association has received \$48.75.

The collections for the Schemes of the Church have not yet been completed, but it is hoped that there will be no falling off if there be no increase. \$1,000 a year for the missions of the Church is what the Association is aiming at, and which it will reach in the near future if not this year.

It is with much regret that the Association reports that owing to change of residence for a time, Miss Strange has resigned the office of Recording Secretary, the duties of which she discharged so admirably for many years. The Association feels that it owes a debt of gratitude to Miss Strange and looks forward to welcoming

her back. In conclusion, the Association expresses the hope that in new St. Andrew's the divine spirit of charity, self-renunciation and ceaseless activity may pervade the life of every member, young and old; that the Association may be increasingly helpful to the Church; that through us as individual Christians, and as a Christian Church, the kingdom of Grace may come to many a life and be greatly advanced in the lives of all believers, that the divine origin and abiding benediction of heaven upon the Church may be clearly manifested to all.
