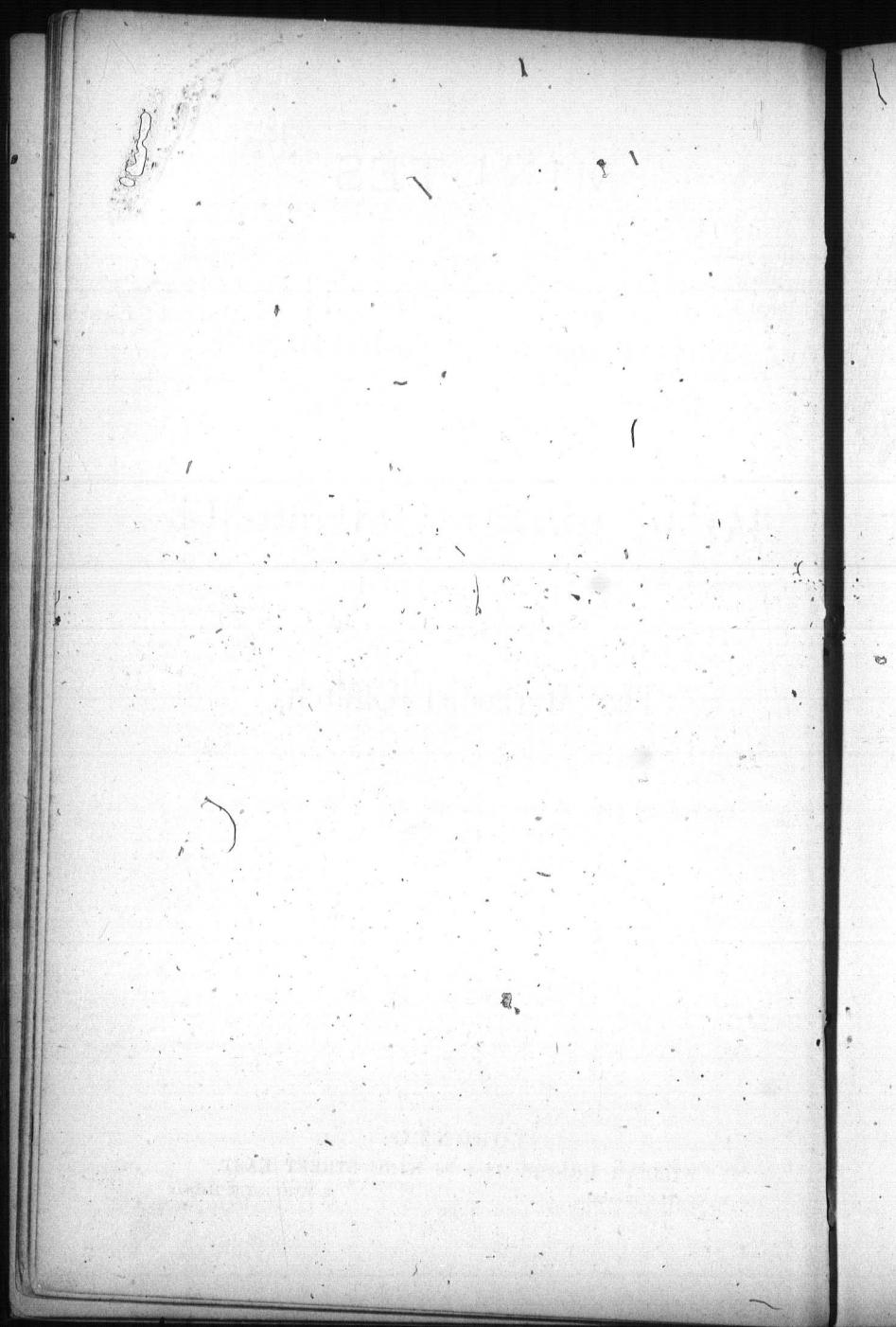

HELD IN THE TOWN OF PICTON, FROM JUNE 3RD TO JUNE 8TH, 1886.

THE THIRD SESSION of the BAY OF QUINTE CONFERENCE was opened in Picton, in the First Methodist Church, on Thursday, June 3rd, 1886, at 9 o'clock a.m.

Rev. JOHN BREDIN, D.D., President of Conference, presided, and conducted the devotional exercises, which continued for one hour.

Rev. DR. WILLIAMS, General Superintendent, then took the chair.

The Secretary read the 115th Psalm and a part of the 6th chapter of 2nd Corinthians. The 753rd hymn was sung, and Revs. M. L. PEARSON and JAMES CURTS engaged in prayer.

The Secretaries of Conferences will greatly aid in getting the Fund into a system by which it will be more easily managed in future, as well as greatly assist the Treasurer in his work, by inserting in the Minutes of Conference the following

RECOMMENDATIONS :—

1. The Annual Conferences should exercise great care in Superannuating ministers, and only those who are actually worn out in the work should be placed on the list.
2. In the appointment of Financial Secretaries (or District Treasurers) only those of known financial ability should be selected.

3. All parties sending money to the office should send with each remittance the names of all Circuits, or Ministers, or others to whom the money is to be credited. Sending money in bulk sums leads to great inconvenience, and makes it impossible to tell what Circuits or Ministers have paid their claims in full. In order to keep the books so that the amount paid by each Circuit or Minister can be traced, this request must be rigidly observed.
4. The Schedules sent out by the Board should be carefully filled up—taking the names of claimants as found in last years Minutes and accounting for them—showing who are still claimants and who have ceased to be claimants, and why they have so ceased, and then adding any new claimants, with their proper address, as per Schedule.
5. Then Schedules should be published in full in the Minutes of the several Annual Conferences as an official document for the guidance of the Treasurer in the payment of the claimants.
6. A statement of the amounts paid on each Circuit for ministerial support and ordinary connexional collections for the past year, together with the names of claimants, new and old, for the coming year, should be prepared by the Secretary of the Conference (or the Statistical Committee) and a certified copy immediately sent to the Treasurer at the close of the Conference in order to enable him to prepare his estimates in time for the Financial District meetings.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GENERAL EDUCATION.

Your Committee beg to submit the following report:—

Within the bounds of this Conference are Victoria University, Albert and Alexandra Colleges. All of these institutions, under the fostering care and Christian guardianship of the Church, are doing a noble work for the youth of our land; and we urge our people to value more highly than ever the tested efficiency and moral safety of our own University and Colleges.

The graduates of Victoria University are occupying many positions of honor, influence and usefulness; in various parts of the Dominion. Their number has been increased by 101 at the recent convocation.

Albert College has had a year of extraordinary and gratifying prosperity. The attendance (secured from Quebec in the East to British Columbia in the West) for the past year has been 168; an increase of one-third over the previous year. For the first time within twenty years Albert has been self-sustaining. We heartily commend it to the liberal patronage of our people.

We are glad to be able to inform our people that in addition to the usual matriculation examinations at Cobourg in September, intending matriculants have the privilege of writing at all High Schools, where departmental examinations are held in June and July.

As was done last year, we again recommend the Ministers of the Conference to attend to the requirements of the Discipline, that the claims of this essential department of our Church may be brought before each congregation on every Circuit; and that collections and subscriptions be solicited somewhat early in the Conference year. We regret to discover from the District returns that there is a slight decrease in the income to this fund for the present year.

On the question of University Federation, we recommend the following resolution:—

Without expressing a definite opinion on the question of College Confederation, a question that still lacks definite form, this Conference desires to express its high appreciation of the advantages now possessed by the Methodist Church in our present University arrangements, and to deprecate any change that would put those advantages in peril, or deprive us of a controlling influence in the higher education of our youth; and in particular would we deprecate any change that would reduce, or seriously threaten to reduce, our University to anything less than a well-equipped Arts College and Theological School, forming an integral part of a Provincial University superior to anything now in the Dominion.

We beg to nominate as representatives of this Conference on the Board of Albert College, the Revs. John Learoyd and J. J. Rice.

As the representative on the Board of Alma College, we beg to nominate the Rev. T. W. Pickett.

Your Visitor spent the 28th day of May, 1886, under the guidance of the genial and gentlemanly Principal, in visiting the classes and inspecting the buildings and grounds of the above Seminary, and brought away with him from this visit, as well as from former visits, the impression that the Ontario Ladies' College is to be cordially commended to the confidence and patronage of the Christian community.

The buildings are everything that could be desired, both from a utilitarian and from an æsthetic point of view. The situation, overlooking a pleasant town, fertile country, and sparkling lake, is equally delightful and healthful. The ample grounds give every opportunity for recreation.

The work of the class-room seems to be founded on correct principles, and to be prosecuted with ability, energy, and accuracy.

Principal Hare and his intelligent and enterprising Board are evidently determined to keep the College abreast of the progress of our time in education. The calendar for 1886-7, shortly to be issued, will indicate the following Departments:—College of Literature and Science, School of Music, School of Fine Art, School of Elocution, and Commercial School.

In the College of Literature and Science, the course is based upon the the Second-Class Teachers' Examination and University Matriculation; and the thoroughness of the work done in this department is guaranteed by the success of young ladies matriculating from the College in Toronto University last year. The appliances for instruction in the Natural Sciences are unusually good, and the methods are thoroughly practical. A post-graduate course of reading, leading to examination and diploma, is being prepared, and will, it is hoped, do much to save those who follow it from the mischievous delusion that a young lady has "finished her education" when she has left College.

The names of the instructors in the School of Music are enough to give it a place among the very best in the Dominion; it is in affiliation with the celebrated Leipzig Conservatory of Music; and last year one of its pupils secured high honors in the great German School.

Fine Art has for some time received very special attention in Whitby, this department being in affiliation with the Ontario School of Art, and carrying off a gratifying share of the honors of the provincial institution. Next year Mr. L. R. O'Brien, the distinguished President of the Royal Canadian Academy, will become the head of this department, and will add the inspiration of his presence and his lectures to the excellent instruction of the other members of the staff.

Henceforth the School of Elocution will be affiliated with the National School of Elocution and Oratory, Philadelphia, and will be under the charge of Miss Graham, gold medallist of the Philadelphia School, who will bring to her task not only enthusiasm and ability as a practical elocutionist, but also a trained familiarity with the profoundest principles of the art.

In the Commercial School are to be found not only able teachers of all the mathematical branches necessary, but also provision for instruction in telegraphy and phonography.

In short, there is perhaps no department of study for which young ladies or their friends are likely to enquire, which they will not find well provided in the Whitby College.

Health and recreation are not neglected. For calisthenics and proper amusements admirable arrangements have been made within the limits of the extensive College grounds.

The home and social life of the College are under the special supervision of the experienced and amiable Lady Principal, Miss Adams, whose name is throughout our community a synonym for success both in class-room instruction and in the formation of the manners of young ladies.

The attendance during the past year has been good. It is specially gratifying to see from the increased attendance of Toronto pupils that the College is commending itself to the judgment and taste of that centre of education and refinement.

Your Visitor heartily commends the Ontario Ladies' College to all parents who desire for their daughters a comfortable home for study, excellent instruction in literature, science, and art, and the good influences of those ladies and gentlemen who by precept and example make this school a thoroughly Christian institution.

The Trustees of Church Property on the 3rd Con. of Thurlow ask permission to sell that property; proceeds to be applied to the 3rd Line Church. Granted.

NAPANEE DISTRICT.

Arden Mission.—That permission be granted to sell the late Canada Methodist Church property in the village of Arden; proceeds applied according to Discipline.

That permission be given to the Trustees of the late Methodist Episcopal Parsonage property on the Arden Mission to sell that property; proceeds to be applied according to Discipline.

Roblin Mission.—That the request of the Roblin Quarterly Board, to sell the late Methodist Episcopal Church in the village of Roblin, be granted; proceeds to be applied according to Discipline.

PICTON DISTRICT.

Melville Circuit.—That permission be given to the Trustees of the late Methodist Episcopal Church property in the village of Melville to sell that property; proceeds to be applied to the church now occupied by the congregation there.

COBOURG DISTRICT.

Welcome Circuit.—That the request of the Trustees of the Dale Church, Welcome Circuit, to sell their church, be granted; proceeds to be applied according to Discipline.

Plainville Circuit.—That the Trustees of Precious Corners Church be granted permission to sell that church, and apply proceeds according to Discipline.

Canton Circuit.—That permission be granted to the Trustees of the Mount Pleasant Church to sell that church, and apply the proceeds according to Discipline.

That permission be granted to the Trustees of the late Canada Methodist Church, Perrytown, to sell that church, and apply the proceeds according to Discipline.

LINDSAY DISTRICT.

Woodville Circuit.—That the request of the Woodville Quarterly Board to sell the old church and parsonage property, and apply the proceeds to the erection of a new church and parsonage, be granted.

LINDSAY DISTRICT.

Recommended,—(1) That Lindsay East Mission be discontinued.

(2) That Fenelon Falls Circuit be divided: Cambray, Cameron, and Zion Appointments to form the Cambray Circuit, to be self-sustaining; Rosedale Appointment to be attached to the Coboconk Mission, and the remainder of the Circuit to constitute Fenelon Falls Circuit, to be self-sustaining.

REPORT OF THE TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee recommend that the Stewards of Circuits and Missions shall provide the unfermented juice of the grape for use at the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Whereas the use of alcohol as a beverage has become the greatest evil of the age, to which may be attributed at least 75 per cent. of the crime

and the greatest portion of the misery, destitution and suffering of our land, and is one of the greatest barriers to the advancement of Christianity, we greatly deplore the manifest indifference of many Christian people towards this gigantic evil, as evidenced in the defeat of the Scott Act in several countries. We believe the Act would have been adopted in almost every contest but for this indifference.

We recommend all our members in counties where the Scott Act has been adopted to use every lawful means to secure obedience to the law.

We condemn in the strongest possible terms the cowardly and outrageous attempts that have been made by the violators of the law and their sympathizers to intimidate the officers of the law in the discharge of their duties. We call upon the proper authorities to bring to justice by some means the perpetrators of such acts of lawlessness and outrage.

We rejoice in the undoubted success of the Scott Act wherever it has been fairly tried, and we believe it is decidedly the best measure in our Statute Books referring to the temperance question, yet nothing short of a prohibitory enactment, doing away with the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors in the Dominion, will effectually destroy the evil.

We advise our people to assist in the organization of electoral unions as recommended by the Ontario Branch of the Dominion Alliance, for the purpose of securing the return to office of only such men as are sound in temperance principles.

Your Committee also recommend that our ministers shall encourage the circulation of temperance literature in our homes and Sabbath-schools, and also hope that the subject of Temperance shall occupy a place among the text-books of our public schools.

We as a Church have verified throughout the year the truthfulness of that memorable saying of the prophet, "not by might nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord."

The kingdom of darkness has been mightily shaken during the past year. There have been marvellous upheavals. Several of our Circuits have witnessed deep, thorough, general, and we trust permanent, revivals of the work of God such as have not been known in our history on those respective charges.

One of the very remarkable features of this work of God during the year has been the extraordinary activity of the young converts in bringing others to Christ. Your Committee are unanimous in the conviction that the extension of the work of God in our midst depends more upon the co-operation of the Church as a whole, and especially of the young converts, than any other purely human consideration.

Your Committee further most heartily recommend the formation of working bands, and also camp-meetings, field meetings and all such agencies as the Church has proved a great power in the past, and would urge the necessity that all such agencies be employed under the direction of the proper Church authorities.

There has been a marked improvement in our Sabbath-schools through the temperance work by "Bands of Hope," and the success that has attended the Scott Act movement, all of which has given greater encouragement to the Church.

We would in this connection give glory to God that the little divergencies of opinion and feeling which the union seemed to have engendered have been, through divine grace, almost wholly removed.

We must therefore, as your Committee, record our conviction that God has been gloriously sanctioning the union of the Churches and prospering all our agencies during the year beyond all precedent.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH-SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee in reviewing our Sunday-school work, as furnished by the several District Reports, are able to report in the main very gratifying results. Our schools are 12 in excess of last year, with 200 additional teachers and 1,200 scholars. The increase of the latter is particularly noticeable in the primary and intermediate classes, while a decrease of 300 is equally striking in the adult classes, which, we think, leaves the important and practical question, "How shall we retain our larger scholars?" still open, and an early and effectual answer will be most gladly welcomed by all our Sabbath-school workers and the Church at large. A reported increase in average attendance of teachers and scholars of about 2,500 is encouraging, and will, we hope, prevent suffering any serious loss, notwithstanding a temporary decrease in any department. We rejoice in 1,213 conversions reported during the year, and 3,822 meetings in class. The very limited use of the Catechism in our Sabbath-schools may be regarded as a defect, which should be remedied by increasing its use. The number of total abstainers reported is, perhaps through lack of organization of Bands of Hope, etc., far too few. To the decrease of about 1,300 volumes in our libraries we place as an off-set the increase of 5,450 copies of our denominational Sabbath-school papers and 400 from other sources. Upwards of \$1,600 has been contributed to the General Missionary Fund, in addition to about \$11,000 raised for school purposes, and \$219 to the Sunday-School Aid and Extension Fund—an increase to the latter fund of \$26. Interest is becoming more general in keeping open and sustaining schools throughout the year where formerly they were closed during the winter season, and we are happy in the thought that so many of our most pious, intelligent and influential members are so earnestly engaged in this very promising field of labor; and sincerely do we hope that every possible appliance to make it even more productive may be brought into operation and, sanctioned by the Divine blessing, may make this nursery of the Church to bud and blossom as the rose.

We recommend the appointment of the Rev. W. Jolliffe as Secretary-Treasurer.

We recommend that this request be publicly read in every congregation early in the year.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH IN
THE BAY OF QUINTE CONFERENCE.

BELoved BRETHREN,—We greet you in the name of the Lord.
“Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus
Christ.”

We rejoice with you in the continued progress of the work of God in our midst, in the large accessions to the membership of the Church, in the steady growth of our people in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, in their consecration to the work of saving souls, in their wise-hearted liberality toward every good cause. “The Lord hath done great things for us whereof we are glad.” The toils of the hard heroic past have issued in the triumphs of the happy present. We are now in our turn sowing the seed of the illimitable future. Freely we have received; freely let us give. Other Churches may have something to commend them to the sympathies of their several communities, even apart from spiritual power—their historical associations, their theories of Church government, their special types of doctrine, their beautiful ritual, or their social prestige. The Methodist Church has indeed a history of which she has abundant reason to be proud, an excellent polity, a scriptural theology, an honorable social position. But in none of these do her distinctive strength and glory lie. Rob her of her godly zeal, and you rob her of her all. Let her cease to exemplify “Christianity in earnest,” and she will cease to attract and hold the people. A worldly Methodism is fit for nothing but burial.

As, therefore, you love the Church in which you have been blessed and through whose agency God has so greatly revived true religion throughout the world, we beseech you to consecrate yourselves fully and forever to the service of the Lord. In order that we may properly serve our generation, we need an aggressive type of piety. The powers of evil are stirred to fierce activity. Let us not sleep on duty.

We need, moreover, an intelligent type of piety, “in meekness instructing those that oppose,” understanding the special needs of our own time, wisely planning for the future, not blindly treading in the beaten path but cheerfully following God’s guidance into new avenues of thought and fresh fields of activity, adapting forms of expression and modes of work to our varying circumstances, but clinging with an ever firmer grasp to the unchanging and everlasting Gospel.

In order to cultivate such an aggressive and intelligent type of piety, good Christian literature is essential. We most heartily commend to you the *Christian Guardian*, the most widely circulated Church paper in the Dominion, and the *Canadian Methodist Magazine*, the only periodical of its class of which our country can boast, and one of the very best produced by the Methodism of the world. Fill your homes with such periodicals and with the choice works of the masters of our noble English tongue, and you will have done much to cultivate in your children that taste for the higher class of reading which is the best safeguard against the insidious influences of a lower and leprous literature.

With all your reading, forget not God's Word. Let it dwell in you richly. Meditate upon it day and night. Study it in the light of all available helps. But, above all, study it prayerfully. Consecrate all your life by prayer. Hold sacred to God the time necessary for secret and family devotions.

Prize and use the class-meeting. In times of revival other Churches are adopting this means of grace under other names and perhaps with slight modifications of method. Let not the service for Christian testimony languish in the Church whose most distinctive means of grace it has been so long. Let leaders endeavor to vary their exercises and to fill them with living forces of attraction. The repetition from week to week of the same "experiences," in the same stereotyped form, is fatal to the enjoyment and to the usefulness of the class-meeting. We affectionately exhort all class-leaders and all members of the Church to give careful and prayerful thought to this service and to make an earnest and persistent effort to render it so fresh, bright, cheerful, and unconventional that all may feel at home in it and be profited by it.

"We beseech you, brethren, to know them which labor among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you; and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. And be at peace among yourselves." Not every church has secured the pastor whom it desired, nor every minister the Circuit which he would have chosen. Let us remember that we are a Connexion, that the administration of our itinerancy is impossible without much mutual concession, and let us all loyally and in the fear of God labor together for the good of all.

We rejoice to see evidence on every hand of improved taste and growing enterprise in the matter of church building. It is not right that Christian people should beautify and enjoy their own luxurious residences and permit old, uncomfortable, and unsightly places of worship, which have outlived their usefulness, to hinder the progress of God's work. On the other hand, let us be on our guard against that extravagance which begins to build before it has counted the cost, and cripples the spirituality of the Church

under a crushing burden of debt. Permit us to call to your remembrance the too often forgotten provision of our Discipline, that, where the erection of a church is contemplated, three-fourths of the estimated cost shall be secured or subscribed before any such building be commenced.

We advise a strong effort to pay off church debts throughout our Conference, in order that with lighter hearts we may all face our wider responsibilities toward God's work at home and abroad.

All our connexional funds urgently need your loyal and liberal support and are thoroughly worthy of it. In the great empire of Japan, over the wide prairies of our own North-West, are now presented to us such golden opportunities for planting our Church as can not long continue and as can not return. It is now or never. If we would do our proper part in the evangelization of these vastly important fields, we must respond with increased generosity to the call of our Missionary Society.

Our Educational Fund has strong and pressing claims upon us. Much of the permanent future success of our Canadian Methodism is dependent upon the prosperity of those institutions of learning which this fund was established to support.

The second General Conference of our Methodist Church is to assemble in Toronto on the first of September, 1886. Questions of the gravest importance are there to be discussed and decided, involving the highest interests of our Church for many days to come. We invite you to unite in fervent and believing prayer to God that a spirit of wisdom may blessedly pervade all the deliberations and evidently characterize all the conclusions of the General Conference.

Brethren, let us live for God. Train your children in the fear and love of God. Sustain all Church interests and enterprises. Win souls. Be upright in business. Be courageous in maintaining your righteous convictions. Largely by your vote the Canada Temperance Act has been brought into operation in many counties. Be consistent with yourselves and do your part toward enforcing it. Be thoughtful and patriotic citizens. Remember that country is above party, and that only righteousness exalts a nation. Let no election excitement, let no party emergency, let no private considerations cause you for one moment to swerve from the path of truth and honor.

By a pure home life, by a wholesome public influence, by personal and organized efforts for the salvation of souls, continue the good work which our fathers began, and spread practical Scriptural holiness through all this land.

"Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong."
