Prior to the passage of that law, the electorate' of St. John'and Portland, which now now the united city, numbered about 5,800 persons. The names of 2,770 persons were added by the Revisors from the assessment list, and since then, the names of 1744 have been added, most of them on application of Mr. Thos. D. Henderson. In round numbers the new voters list exceeds that of last year by 4,500 names, a greater number than is usually polled at an election. 
