# GERMANS HARD PRESSED IN EAST AND WEST; LEFT WING BEFORE WARSAW IN GRAVE DANGER 

> Allies Pressing Enemy in West and German System of Fortification In Danger of Being Demoralized-Small Advances But Every Foot of Ground Gained Brings Hour of German Retirement Nearer-Heavy Fighting Yesterday With Allied Fleet Playing an Important Role-Russians Checking Austro-Germans In Galicia-Allies' Warships Active in the Da rdanelles.

L- (fdon, Dec. 22.-Heavy fighting is taking place on both eastern and western fronts, but without producing any material change in the positions of the opposing armies.

In France and Belgium, the Allies offensive is being pressed and while some ground has been gained at widely spearated points, other attacks have been repulsed by the Germans from their strongly entrenched positions, In the northern arena the artillery and warships yesterday took up the battle, giving the infantry a rest, but lower down the line and from the Oise to the Meuse fierce fighting took place in many distrlcts.

While the progress of the Allies is extremely slow, it is the belief of military experts here and in France that the turbing the German system of fortifications at vital points, and will, if successfully continued, compel a retirement by the Germans from their present lines,
