

## Minutes of Annual Meeting,

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation was held in the basement of the Church on the afternoon of Wednesday, 28th of December. The Pastor opened the meeting with devotional exercises.

The minutes of last Annual Meeting were read and adopted. The Treasurer then presented his report for the year and showed the balance to be on the right side. Reports were read from all the Societies and Sabbath School, all of which were most encouraging. There was every reason to believe that the Societies were doing good work as well as the Sabbath School.

The same Auditors were re-elected for another year. Mr Neil Morrison's name was added to the Board of Managers. The Secretary-Treasurer and Assistant were re-elected. The appointing of a Caretaker was left in the hands of the Board of Managers. The meeting was then closed with prayer.

### Report of Session.

It is with pleasure that the Session of Guthrie Church present their report for the past year and in doing so acknowledge the loving kindness of God in his dealings with us as a Session and Congregation. Changes are constantly taking place amongst us, as well as in other Congregations, but the good work has gone on steadily and we can safely say that 1898 has been the best in the history of the Church judging from the reports given from the kindred Societies of the Church. The attendance has been most regular and the pews have been filled with attentive listeners, and Eternity alone can tell what the results will be.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed three times during the year and the attendance was most gratifying. Seven new members were added to the Communion Roll and five removed, one by death and four by certificate. The membership is now 98. 'Number of baptisms, three.

In closing the report we call upon all the families who worship with us here to be devoted to their God and to His Church, and may His hand lead us ever onward to nobler service and more self denial in seeking to further His cause and establishing His Kingdom upon the earth. Let our motto for the coming year be Joshua 24, 15, "As for me and my house we will serve the Lord."

Our hearts are filled with love and thanksgiving to God as we look back over the year just about closing and see all the way He has led and prospered us. Thirteen meetings have been held during the year with an average attendance of ten. There are now twenty-one names on the roll. Our meetings have been very helpful and tend to give us a more united interest in the work we are endeavoring to do. Programmes are arranged for every meeting and many of the mission fields carefully studied. Mrs. Cameron, of Allandale, visited the Society and spoke some very encouraging words. Twenty copies of the "Missionary Tidings" were distributed monthly through the Congregation. The sum of seventy dollars and fifty-six cents (\$23.56) of this amount was raised by monthly contributions. Twenty-four dollars and seventy-six cents (\$21.76) was proceeds of the Thank-offering envelopes. Five dollars (\$50.0) members' fees. Special contaibutions, seventeen dollars and sixty-eight cents, (\$17.68). Our expenses were, for clothing, \$11.19; sundries, \$4.35. The bale of clothing sent to the Northwest Indians was valued at \$15.10.
