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


In the year 1902, one October day, half a dozen business men met together in the City of Vancouver and formed themselves into a Limited Liability Company, for the purpose of taking over the business of Mr. A. B. Diplock, applying for such powers for extension in various directions as were deemed necessary for the business in view. This small beginning was the origin of the

WESTERN CORPORATION, with its real estate, home building, general contracting, sawmilling, roadmaking, land clearing and other similar enterprises.

The staff at that time included the Manager, Mr. Diplock, and one assistant. It was not long, however, before it was found necessary to add to the number, as the business on the plans laid down by Mr. Diplock was found to supply a want in the community and thoroughly justified the

complete confidence placed in the manager by the directors. To-day there are over eighty employees, and the business still demands a further increase.

The south side of Burrard Inlet is practically entirely in the hands of the Canadian Pacific Railway, who naturally by their forethought, having secured such tremendous advantages, in no way welcome rival railways. The North Vancouver shore on the other hand is free, and any projected railways, in order to obtain deep sea wharves and other facilities must come to that side of the inlet.

These facts, which have been sufficiently proved by time, led to the establishment of a real estate department for the dealing in, primarily, of North Vancouver properties. A plan was suggested by the manager, by which the heavy blanket mortgage, which prevented the settlement of the choicest land was lifted, and as a consequence the pick of the municipality was put on the market and thrown open for occupation, on easy terms.

As was anticipated, success attended this policy, the only drawback being the lack of capital for proper development. The local capitalists were doing sufficiently well with their own projects, and what capital they could lay their hands on, was greedily absorbed for their own requirements. The little municipality of North Vancouver, with only about seventy-five inhabitants, could not afford to make any great outlay

for opening up roads, etc., and settlers were handicapped.

The WESTERN CORPORATION, after viewing the situation, decided to increase their capital and seek further powers from the supreme court, which was granted on March 17th, 1905, and immediately embarked in the business of road making and land clearing. The first practically at cost, in order to help

on the rapidly rising town. With the usual originality it was decided that the old fashioned methods of the stumping powder and mattock were altogether too slow and too expensive. A large donkey engine was purchased of the kind used by loggers in hauling logs from the forest by cable, and with this and a judicious use of blasting powder, immense stacks of roots and stumps,

forty and fifty feet high, were piled up and burned, leaving the land ready for the plough, for the garden or orchard, and for building—parenthetically one might add, the neighboring City of Vancouver watched this system of clearing, with the result that two large engines of similar design were ordered, and are now in use in the suburbs of the older city. As progress stimulates progress

and big dividends are the greatest inducement to investment, the shareholders of the corporation eagerly invested more money and declared the large profits in further shares, using the money to increase the ever-growing enterprise.

The WESTERN CORPORATION planned and built the first business block in North Vancouver, and was the means of in-

ducing the first tradesman to embark in business, a circumstance he himself has never for one moment regretted. Building operations, however, by reason of the expense in transportation and other difficulties, were still very expensive. Lumber and building supplies had to be brought over from Vancouver by boat, thus making small quantities practically prohibitive. and

although the improved roads did away with the necessity of packing every thing to the scene of operations, as was done formerly, still the erection of any kind of edifice was not a thing to be lightly undertaken. To meet this, the corporation went into the business of lumber merchants, builders and contractors, and thus enabled the consumer to purchase anything from a single

board, to a house and lot and garden ready for planting out, also giving the intending purchaser of property in the municipality, a reasonable certainty that he could erect a dwelling on his property at a moderate cost. This branch of the business, one might almost say, led to the owning and operating of a sawmill. The WESTERN CORPORATION already possessed some valuable standing

timber, and excellent arrangements were made with owners of adjoining properties for their timber rights, thus insuring enough material for a fair sized sawmill to convert into lumber for some time to come, while the prices in the local market, in consequence of the ever increasing demand, enabled a good profit to be made in this branch of the business and placed the corporation in a sound

position for undertaking the supplying of lumber.

While all these bigger and more imposing works were being carried on, the smaller, but no less important work, had been rigorously proceeded with. Inducements had been held out, successfully, to various trades and professions to settle, and several industries were established and nursed into

standing on their own legs. A splendid wharf site was secured and wharf erected into which the tram lines run, thus enabling supplies to be taken right up to the sawmill or vice versa, and facilitating the B. C. Electric Railway in landing their supplies, poles, etc., for the tramway and electric light system. Coal was also imported and delivered by the corporation teams, and all and

All the other offices, workshops, etc., are across Burrard Inlet, two miles by the ferry. Immediately on arrival at the terminus of

the tramway line are the corporation's wharves, warehouses, coal bunkers and lumber sheds, also the North Vancouver branch business office, where plans and specifications are made for new buildings, and where all the business connected with contracting, retailing of supplies and other undertakings are attended to. Mr. H. C. Wright, the Assistant Secretary, has the supervision of these departments.

Here it is not out of place to say that the WESTERN CORPORATION has to congratu-

late itself on the way it is served. The employees, who number in all something over eighty, make their employers business theirs. The system of bonuses, the personal care by the management of their interests, produces a mutual regard and a community of interests that makes for harmony and success.

Away up in the hills, two miles from the wharf, with which it is connected by telephone and by tram line, is the sawmill, and so great has been the demand for its product that it is impossible to turn out lumber quick

enough. Additional machinery, however, is shortly expected to meet this satisfactory condition, and what was originally a small sawmill for the purpose of economically using up the big logs removed in clearing the forest, and of helping the building department with plenty of rough lumber, is now an up-to-date manufacturing concern and a hive of industry.

As before stated, the business of land clearing, of converting the pathless forest into land fit for settlement, for the garden

and the orchard, was one of the first enterprises of the corporation, and so successful are the methods employed, under the management of Mr. Sam Martin, that the wilderness, in an incredibly short time, is transformed into the garden, a profitable transaction, not only to the community at large and the corporation, but also to the settler.

Land covered but a year ago with brush and forest is now supplying tomatoes and other fruits and vegetables earlier than they can be produced anywhere in the district for


