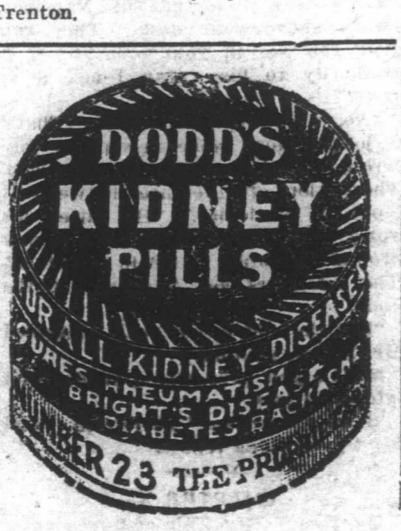
CHECKED EVERYWHERE. Official Bulletins Say Germans Are Held All Along Line. PARIS, Oct. 27. - The following official information was given out by the French War Office last night: "In Belgium, Niueport has been vigorously bombarded, and the effort of the Germans has continued on the front between Niueport and Dixmude, without, according to the latest advices, any result whatever having been reached."

On the remainder of the front there is nothing to report. The official communique of the French War Office, issued yesterday afternoon, says: "During the day of yesterday (Sunday) our front along the general line between Niueport and Dixmude was maintained. The German force which crossed the Yser between these two towns has not been able to progress."

Want Belgian Settlers for Territory Opened by Grand Trunk Pacific. Transportation experts agree that the European war will result in a rush of settlers to Canada and a special effort is being made to obtain for Central British Columbia a large number of Belgian farmers driven from their homes by events in the war area. These people are known to be good farmers and very thrifty people, and will be a great factor in developing the agricultural possibilities of this section of the Dominion recently thrown open to cultivation by the completion of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway. It is planned to settle a large tract in the Stuart River District with Belgians and their families. It is expected that after the war is over a large colony will be placed on the land there, as well as in many other valleys along the line of the Grand Trunk Pacific in Northern and Central British Columbia.

Big Catches of Fish at Prince Rupert. How rich the waters of the Pacific Ocean are in fine fish is shown by the September statistics for the port of Prince Rupert just received at the Grand Trunk Pacific headquarters in Montreal. Through the local fishing fleet during the month, comprising 11,002 cwts. of Halibut; 4,440 cwts. of Cod; and 10,552 cwts. of Salmon. The catch at ten cents a pound would produce \$300,120. Prince Rupert has now begun to ship its fresh fish to the East in special refrigerator cars over the Grand Trunk Pacific and the October fishing in therefore expected to be productive of even larger catches.

Well Known Railway Man Has Splendid Sport in British Columbia. Mr. L. A. Robison, General Passenger Agent New York Central Lines, has just completed a successful hunting trip in the Yellowhead Pass region of British Columbia. He bagged two grizzly bears, three caribou, and a moose and he declares that he is going back next fall. He is enthusiastic over the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway and the territory which it has opened up. He was a passenger on the second through train between Edmonton and Prince Rupert, over the newly completed western section of the line. He says the C. T. R. will lead to largely increased trade between the northwestern part of the United States and Canada.

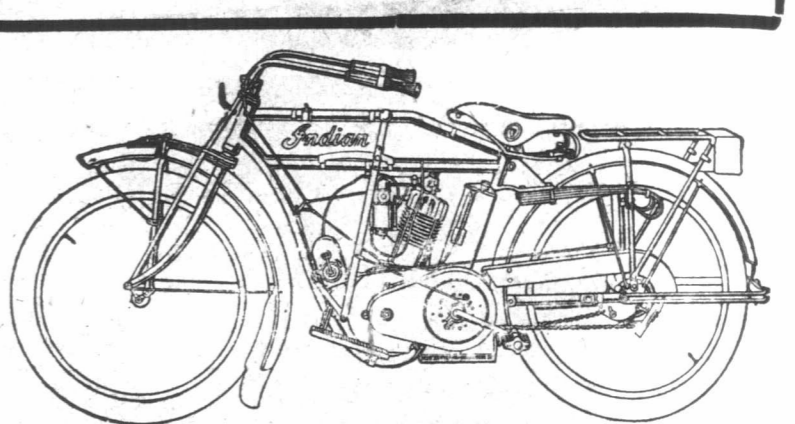
