Liberalism in Italy.
The despotism, which, under the name of Liberalism, has been inaugurated in Italy, is being exposed by the lying pretences of regard for the Church. In a recent speech of one of the Liberals in the Italian Parliament, he is reported as saying:
"Regarding the relations between Church and State, extensive liberties granted to the Church ought not to impair public liberties. The Government should, therefore, propose bills for rendering efficient the reservations in the laws respecting the Papal See."
It is not difficult for one who reads "between the lines" of these remarks, and interprets them in the light of the action of the revolutionary government of Italy, to arrive at their real meaning. "The extensive liberties granted to the Church" by the Italian usurpation are simply the small remnants of freedom that have been left the Church, after hampers and plundering, robbing and attempting to subvert the Church's rights to liberty.
