






NOT PERTINENT .- A late number of the Halifax Citizen announces, that the new Militia Bill exacts an oath of allece to the Dominion of Canada, and the editor desires to know how goal accommodation can be provided for the one hundred and fifty thousand recusants who will be found in Nova Scotia. There are two reasons why the "Antis" may make themselves easy. Any violation of their oath. Hon. John Magee, who died a few days since at his home in Schuyler County, N. Y, was one of the wealthiest men of the time, estivated at \$40,000,000. He was one of the original projectors of the Erie Railway, and for many years a leading director. He was also the originator and, up to his demise, president of the Steuben County Bank. The bulk of his fortune has been made within the last ten or fif-ten years by dealing in coal lands in Pennsylvania, which he bought and sold on a gigantic scale. Among other be-quests he left \$30,000 to the American Bible Society, and \$30,000 to the Ameri-can Tract Society. A young man murdered in a haunt of the social evil in New York, the other day, was a son of ex-Mayor Wescott, of Jersey City, and inherited a tortune of \$250,000.
