Queen's Counsel. It will be rembered by our readers what a long and warm dispute took place between the Dominion Government and the Ontario Legis. lature as to the right to appoint Queen's Counsel. In consequence of this dispute, and to set the matter at rest, a correspondence took place between the Minister of Justice and Colonial Office on the subject, all of which has been laid on the table ; and we learn from it first, that the Governor-General has the power, as Her-Majesty's representpower, as Her-Majesty's represent-ative, to appoint Queen's Counsel: second, that a Lieutenant_cGovernor appointed since the union has also such power: but, third, that the Legislature of a Province can confer by statue on its Lieutenant_cGovernor the power of appointing Queen's Counsel, and, with respect to prece-dence or pre-audience in the Courts of the Province, has power to decide as between Queen's Counsel appoint-ed by the Governor-General and the Lieutenant Governor, as above ex-plained.


Lieutenant Governor, as above ex-plained. The Minister of Justice, under date September 28th, 1872, calls at-tention to the appointment made in the Province of Ontario by the Lieu tenant Governor, and expresses grave doubts as to the validity of such ap-pointment. He mentions that by the law of Upper Canada, Queen's Coun-sel can, in certain cases, perform cer-tain judicial duties; and recom-mends, under the circumstances, that commissions be issued by the Canadian Government to such of those gentlemen as wish to receive them.

This document is followed by a despatch from the Ontario Govern-mant, dated Oct. 25, 1872, which refers to the extraordinary private circular sent to the newly appointed Queen's Counsel by the Minister of Justice ; and expresses regret that the Gov-ernment of Canada had not seen fit to transmit a copy of the opinion of the law officers of the Crown to the Government of Ontario ; and sug-gesting that before any further ac-tion is taken a joint case should be submitted for the decision of the Judical Committee of the Privy Council in England. The last document of importance

Judical Conmittee of the Privy Conneil in England. The last document of importance is a minute in Council enclosed to the Lieutenant-Govenor of Ontario, which, after alluding to the docu-ments already referred to, concludes as follows :— "The Committee of the Council do not apprehend- that any inconveni-ences or complications can arise from the Queen's representative exercis-ing the Royal prerogative in making such appointments. It is obvious that when the Supreme Court or other Dommion Courts are establish-ed, commissions issued by the Lieu-tenant Governors would not, as of right, give precedence or position in those Courts. At the same time it might be advisable that such com-missions should be recognized. The Committee of Council, are, therefore on the whole, of opinion that his Ex-cellency the Governor-General, as the queen's representative, should not refrain from appointing.






