A Bundle
Of Papers

Private Documents Mr. Eberts
Says Were Abstracted From
His Possession

Produced in Court By Mr. Cur-
tis' Counsel at Royal
Commission.

But Attorney General Quite
Willing That Contents Be
Made Public.

The Royal commission investigating the charges made by Mr. Eberts, M. P., against Hon. J. Mackenzie and Hon. J. Mann, M. P., in the Court House yesterday morning, the Hon. Mr. Justice Walker presiding.

The cross-examination of Hon. D. M. Eberts, M. P., was continued. Eberts, after entering upon the cross-examination, Mr. Bond asked for the production of all telegrams which had passed between Mr. Greenfield and Hon. J. Mackenzie and Hon. J. Mann, M. P., in connection with the E. & N. Railway company and the Pacific Improvement company.

Mr. Cassidy said any telegrams which had passed were of a private nature, and there was no such correspondence. Mr. Bond said he had stated on oath that there was no such correspondence, and that passed was that between himself and General Hubbard, which he had produced. Mr. Bond said he had no such documents which had no existence.

Mr. Bond insisted that it was necessary to his case that this correspondence should be produced. Mr. Cassidy said there are no such documents. Mr. Bond again asked Mr. Eberts as to the 2nd part of the clause, when his Lordship reminded him that the question was one for the Legislature. Mr. Eberts explained that the tentative agreement between Mr. Greenfield and Mr. Bond provided that the railway should be built by the Canadian Northern. This was changed subsequently to the Edmonton, Yukon & Pacific because the Canadian Northern had absorbed the charter of the E. & N. and was empowered by it to construct a railway in British Columbia.

The first contract did not give the company the title to minerals on their land under the contract. The company's interest in the minerals was not interfered with the rights of free miners. Changes were made in the agreement between Mr. Greenfield and Mr. Bond. None of the proposed contracts were made in the contract as it was made by the House.

The agreement called for the subsidy being paid in 3 per cent. bonds, at their market value of 97. These bonds, he believed, were now quoted in London at 100.
