THE RESOLUTIONS.
Interpretation of Terms and Expressions Used in the Customs Act.
The following are the tariff resolutions proposed by Mr. Foster:

Resolved, That it is expedient to amend the act 49 Vic., chapter 33, Revised Statutes, entitled "An act respecting the duties of customs," as follows:

(1) By repealing section 1 of the said act, and substituting the following in lieu thereof: "In this act, in any other act relating to the duties of customs, unless the context otherwise requires:

(A) The expression "proof" or "proof spirits" shall apply to wine or spirits of any kind, measured by the strength of proof spirit, as determined by the standard gauge.

(B) The expression "guage" when applied to metal sheets or plates or to wire means the thickness as determined by the standard gauge.
