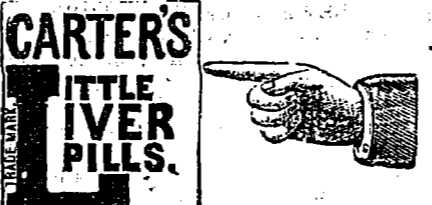

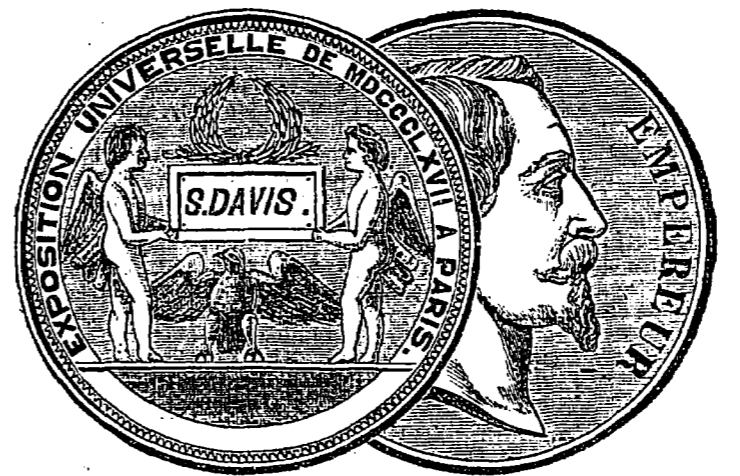

COLLISION AT SEA.

The SS. "Cimbrina" Sunk—Over 300 Persons Missing.

New York, Jan. 20.—The steamship Cimbrina, from Hamburg for New York, was sunk in collision in the German Ocean on Friday morning. Thirty-nine persons landed at Cuxhaven this evening. Other boats are still out. The Cimbrina collided with the steamer Sultan during a fog off Borkum Island...

London, Jan. 21.—The Cimbrina left Hamburg on Thursday with 850 passengers and a crew of 110. She ran aground before leaving the Elbe, but got off with a good tide, with the assistance of the steamship Hansa, without damage, and put to sea at 3.30 p.m. On Friday morning she came in collision, during a thick fog, off Borkum, with the steamship Sultan. The Cimbrina sank in a short time. With the boat with the 39 passengers arrived, the Company sent out the steamship Hansa and four of the largest available steamers to search for the Cimbrina's other boats...

FINANCIAL. TUESDAY, JAN. 23, 1883.

The financial markets to-day were fairly active. Money was steady at 4 1/2 per cent. Government and municipal paper was discounted at 7 1/2 per cent. (Sterling exchange was unchanged. WEEKLY REVIEW—WHOLESALE MARKETS.

The general condition of trade is discouraging, especially as far as the leading manufacturing branches are concerned. It is unfortunate that labor difficulties continue to interfere with work in the boot and shoe factories. Though the strike is over the men are dissatisfied and the rules of the Lathers' Union and those of the Manufacturers' Association are an equal source of annoyance...

The supply has been larger and a good business is being done at the various city yards and corporation market. MONTREAL CATTLE MARKET—Jan. 22.

At Viger market to-day 350 pretty good cattle were under offer. Best stock sold at 4 1/2 to 5 1/2 and interior stock at 3 to 4. About 150 sheep and lambs were offered, prices being 4 1/2 to 5. Dressed hogs sold at \$3.50 to \$3.75 per 100 lbs. No live hogs were reported. There were a few shippers' calves at Polk St. Charles and Viger markets...

AMERICAN AND CANADIAN IRON MINES.

A large firm of Southern iron miners who have works in Georgia, Toledo, Pittsburg and other places, will send a deputation to Ottawa to a few weeks to wait, and the Government in reference to the coal tariff. In the event of a re-arrangement being arrived at whereby the duty on iron ore is reduced to 10 per cent, a sufficiently low rate, they propose to develop the iron mines on the Kingston and Embree Railway in the vicinity of Onondaga Lake, where the rich iron ore is at present being worked...

THE PACIFIC SYNDICATE SUCCESSFUL.

Speaking of the Canadian Pacific monetary negotiations connected with their proposed capital, the Syndicate organ says:—"To-day a cablegram was received by the directors, informing them that the transactions had been completed in London and America. These two markets having taken what had not been previously provided for in New York. There need be no fear now that any inconvenience or delay will be caused in the construction of the Pacific Railway."

AN AMERICAN BRIG RUN DOWN BY A CANADIAN STEAMER.

SIX PERSONS DROWNED. New York, Jan. 20.—The steamer "Canima," from Halifax, N.S., early yesterday morning in the darkness of night's blackness, sank the brig "Hazel" of the captain's name unknown. Mike Kelly, Pat Donovan, a man named Norton and Charles Powers got into a boat, which was swamped, and all but Powers were drowned. The latter was rescued by the steamer. A man named Davis and another, name unknown, and the cook went into the cabin to secure the money and were carried down with the vessel.

A HERO OF THREE TALES.

Mr. W. T. Clark, a resident of Philadelphia, has in the past eight years come into the possession of three fortunes without any effort. He remarked to a reporter:—"You see I have known a great many people who have drawn large amounts from the Louisiana State Lottery, and knowing that its dates were always fair, I concluded to try my hand. In the Centennial year I purchased a ticket, and that drew \$5,000, which was paid to me in due season. I bought tickets in the drawings after this, and in one year from my first strike I drew \$300. I sent \$2 to M. A. Dauphin, New Orleans, La., for the two fifths of a whole ticket in the last November drawing, it being No. 33,719, and drew \$4,000, which was two-fifths of the capital prize of \$10,000. The agent of the Adams Express Company paid the full amount. This makes \$9,300 from my investments in the Louisiana State Lottery, and I shall continue to invest."

THE BONAPARTES.

A SKETCH OF THE CELEBRATED FAMILY AS IT EXISTS TO-DAY.

The recent events in Paris concerning the manifesto issued by Prince Jerome, have brought the Bonapartes again into prominence. The following sketch of the family will be read with interest:— Prince Jerome Napoleon, is about sixty years of age. He is the son of Jerome Bonaparte, brother of the first Napoleon, who was King of Naples, and who was married to Miss Patterson, of Baltimore, and afterwards divorced by the will of his great brother, who secured another wife for him in Stephaniea Maria, niece of the Emperor of Austria. He is married to the Princess Margherita, sister of King Humbert, of Italy, and daughter of the late Victor Emmanuel. He has two sons, Princes Victor and Louis, aged 20 and 18 respectively. The former is attached to the Artillery at Orleans, and the latter is a student at St. Oyr. By the tragic death of the noble hero, Louis Napoleon, the young and gallant Prince Imperial, in Zululand, he became heir to the Imperial Crown, although the last wish of the son of Napoleon III. was that young Prince Victor, son of Jerome, should become the heir, as he was the only one who really could unite the various sections of the party.

YANKEE EXPORTION.

THE MARQUIS DE LORNE HAS A ROW WITH THE RAILWAY MEN, AND SWears HE WON'T BE GOCCED—CURIOUS INCIDENTS OF THE VIRGIL TRIP. CHARLESTON, S.
