CANADIAN DELEGATION TO THE SEVENTH COMMONWEALTH CONFERENCE, ACCRA, GHANA, MARCH 9-18, 1977

DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS MINISTÈRE DES AFFAIRES EXTÉRIEURES The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Don Jamieson, announced today the Canadian Delegation to attend the Seventh Commonwealth Education Conference being held in Accra, Ghana, March 9-18, 1977. Six previous conferences were held in Oxford (1959), New Delhi (1962), Ottawa (1964), Lagos (1968), Canberra (1971) and Kingston (1974). The theme of this Seventh conference is the Economics of Education. The Conference will consider the problem of financing education in the current economic climate and identify means by which further Commonwealth co-operation might benefit member countries.
