MARS will be the Morning Star until Oct. 4, after which it will be the Evening Star to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the Morning Star until March 15; then Evening Star until Sept. 27; after which it will be the Morning Star.

SATURN will be the Morning Star until March 18; then Evening Star until Sept. 27; after which it will be the Morning Star.

DIRECTIONS FOR FINDING THE TRUE TIME.—The Sun is on the meridian at 12 o'clock on four days only in the year. It is sometimes as much as 15 minutes before or after 12, when its shadow strikes the noon mark on the sun-dial. Thus on January 25, when the Sun is on the noon mark, the watch must be set 12 min. 44 seconds past 12, which will be the true time. The practice of setting time-pieces by the rising or setting of the Sun or Moon is not strictly correct, as the unevenness of the earth's surface and intervening objects, such as hills and forests, near the points of rising of the Sun and Moon, also the refraction of the Sun's rays occasion a deviation in every place from the time expressed in the Almanack, which time is adapted to a smooth level horizon. The only means of keeping correct time is by the use of a meridian line or sun-dial.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

Column

LEFT HAND PAGE.

1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.

3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.

5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.

6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time; and there are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing; namely, about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.

7—Days' length in hours and minutes.

8—The rising of the Moon.

9—The setting of the Moon.

10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.

11—The symbols in this column indicate the Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

1—Contains the days of the month.

2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.

3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.

4— “ “ Pictou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine, N.B.

5— “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.

6— “ “ St. Johns, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establisment du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h., and at St. Johns, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.THE EPHEMERIS OF THE PRINCIPAL PLANETS.—The hour of *meridian passage*, *right ascension* and *declination* of each of the principal planets is given for the 1st and 15th of each month. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m. 55.91 s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day—to be added for an earlier day—subtracted if for a later day.

Let him thoroughly understand our political institutions; and be able to judge of his political rights and duties, without the aid of demagogues, who would rather devote his time to watching over the public interests, than to the pursuit of honest industry. Let no farmer's wife think her children too good to labour; but on the contrary, let her strive early to fix habits of industry. Let every mother teach her sons, that while labour on the farm is honorable, idleness, ignorance, and vice alone bring reproach. And when the lesson is thoroughly impressed on the mind of her son, and corresponding habits are formed, that son will be likely to make an efficient man, and a useful citizen.

The keeping of roads in good repair may be generally conceded as an object of much importance, so long as men merely *talk* about the matter; but it seems to be otherwise when they are called upon to *work*; if the reluctance, indifference, shirking, and dislike to that duty upon the public highways, may be taken as indications of the real state of sentiment existing on the subject. The indifference which many display in regard to keeping roads in good repair, and their unwillingness to do their proportion of work upon the public highways, have often been matters of surprise. For months we have seen farmers plunging through rough, racking and muddy places, with injury to carts and teams, when a very little work would have removed the whole difficulty and the cause of it—but then others would have been benefited by their work as well as themselves; and therefore, though right in sight of their own windows, and though passing it frequently, the ugly obstruction stands unrepared for months, just because some others would have received a *little* benefit, even though they would have secured to themselves *many times more*. This is truly an astonishing exhibition of selfishness and perverted and depraved human nature.

THE season for commencing active operations in the field having arrived, it may not be out of place to submit a few remarks on the subject of ploughing, as this is perhaps the most important operation in field culture, and one which should be performed with most care and attention. No amount of extra labour in the after culture can compensate for a defect in the ploughing of the ground; and he is certainly an improvident and unwise farmer who will allow his grounds to be imperfectly broken up in the preparation for a crop. There has evidently been great improvement in this branch of farming in the last ten years, more indeed than in ten or twenty previous ones, but still not one half of the land is well ploughed even in this age of improvement. Deep ploughing is one of the most efficient agents in the improvement of soils, as it is in the continuation of good soils. Never omit it. It may scantily pay you for a year or two; but it will ultimately repay you an hundred fold.

EVERY farmer has now decided on which field to sow this or that particular crop. He now only awaits fine weather and a dry soil to commence operations. In the mean time there is work enough to do. Ploughs, harrows, rollers, carts, harness, &c., should be examined, and if repairs are needed, they should be made before the busy season commences. Seed wheat, potatoes, oats, timothy, clover, peas, &c., should now be procured. The shortness of our sowing season makes it pre-eminently desirable that the farmer, above all others, should take time by the forelock. Too many neglect all preparation for their spring work, and when the fine weather comes, having everything to do in a few weeks, they are in too great a hurry to do anything well. They must flop over a furrow 16 inches wide, scratch it a little with a harrow, sow the seed, and trust to "good luck" and a virgin soil for a harvest.

WHY is it farmers pay so little attention to the cultivation of the onion? That onions are a healthy, palatable food, when properly cooked, there can be no doubt, and yet how few farmers raise 20 bushels a year? How seldom are they seen on a farmer's table?—twice the amount of nutriment can be raised, in this climate, from an acre of onions as from an acre of potatoes. Onions are better adapted to our dry, hot summers, than turnips, potatoes, &c., and it is surprising they receive so little attention. But it may be said they require much more labour in preparing the ground, sowing and weeding. It is true they require a little more labour, but if the ground is thoroughly prepared, and manure free from seeds is used, and the onions are sown in rows 15 inches apart, and the hoe is run through them as soon as the plant can be distinguished from the weeds, the trouble and expense attending the crop need be but little more than that of any other hoed crop.

In raising young apple trees, the stocks should be seedlings, and not suckers, as the latter furnish less perfect roots. Transplanting apple trees is generally performed with far too little care; though their hardiness will enable them to endure bad management, the thriftiness from good treatment far more than compensates all additional labour. For several years after young trees are transplanted, the ground should be constantly cultivated. This is easily performed so long as the trees remain small. When they become large, an occasional cultivation, with intervening crops of grass, may be sufficient for extensive orchards. It is a common practice to neglect not only cultivation but pruning. Irregular and stunted trees, and small and inferior fruit are the consequence. These may be prevented by moderate, frequent and judicious pruning, if the trees are not already too old. Pruning should never be done in Spring when the sap is flowing, but may be performed either in Winter or in Summer.

PARTICULAR attention should be paid to the milking of cows. Children should never be trusted with this business, and there are many grown people who never milk well, though they have been brought up to the business. If you would obtain all the milk from the cow, you must treat her with the utmost gentleness; she must not stand trembling under your blows or threats. After the bag has been brushed, and the ends of the teats been moistened, the milk must be drawn speedily, or you will not get the whole. You must not sit and talk—you must not delay one moment, if you would have all the milk she is ready to give. A careful and expeditious milker will obtain more milk from a cow, especially if it be the person who has been in the habit of milking her, than a slow careless milker. If farmers would consider the much greater quantity of milk a cow will yield in a season that is in good condition in the Spring, than one that has "been on the lift," we are confident there would not be so many skeleton cows on our farms as there now are.

WITHIN the last few years the cultivation of the carrot has engrossed a greater share of attention than formerly. This plant may be brought to great perfection in any part of Nova Scotia, and with suitable attention will abundantly remunerate the farmer for all his necessary care and labour. If our farmers would devote a spare acre or two to the cultivation of this root, they will find themselves in possession of a large store of feed of valuable and rare qualities for sheep, horses and cattle, which will save largely of hay and other fodder, in time of scarcity of such crops. The soil best adapted to the carrot, is a deep rich loam free from gravel or sand. If it be too adhesive or lumpy, ashes or lime may be mixed with it. If manure be used, it should be entirely decomposed or rotted, and intimately mixed with the earth. The ground should be ploughed or spaded fine and deep, the whole being made mellow. The seed should be planted early in April, in drills not less than 22 inches apart. The yield will be 6 or 700 bushels per acre.

HORSES that are kept up, or in the stable, all the year through, and especially when they have no change or variety of food, but only hay and oats everlastingly, are very apt to get indigestion, or derangement of the stomach or bowels, in the form of want of appetite, feverishness, quick breathing, colic, gnawings of old wood, &c. When a horse kept in the stable all the time falls off in flesh, or in appetite, or has any of the above symptoms, the most natural and simple mode of management is to change his food, as by giving him roots, or corn stalks, or green fodder, or turning him through the day to grass. When the bad symptoms do not yield to the employment of some such change of diet, perhaps the next best thing to do, would be to make use of the following powders, which have been prescribed by Dr. Dadd for a case of this kind:—Powdered gentian 1 oz., do. ginger ½ oz., do. charcoal 1 oz., mix thoroughly and divide into 8 equal parts. Give one with the food night and morning.

AUTUMN TRANSPLANTING.—Apple trees are very hardy, and generally succeed best if set out in Autumn, as the soil becomes well settled about them, and they have nothing to do early in the Spring but to commence growing. In this way they get an earlier start. If the roots of a Fall transplanted apple tree are examined in Spring about the usual time for digging trees, a new set of rootlets will be found pushing out from the old ones, at least a week or two in advance of any that may be emitted by Spring set trees. If, however, they are dug in the fall and well laid in, the same rootlets will be formed early in spring, and such trees, if set out carefully so as not to injure these, will possess a decided advantage over such as are dug in spring. Cherry and pear trees are nearly as hardy as the apple, and may be advantageously removed in autumn, if the precautions pointed out are observed. It is absolutely necessary in all cases, and with all sorts of trees, to secure them from being blown about by the wind.

That manuring usually pays when employed with tolerable good judgment, can be abundantly proved and established. Many, however, have great doubts and uncertainties about the matter; and hence never purchase a dollar's worth of any marketable manure, nor save nor manufacture what they might, without much trouble, at home. The aggregate produce of the country would be much greater, and also the prosperity of the farming community, could these doubts and uncertainties be removed. Farmers can never be too much nor too earnestly urged to increase their manure heap. The one great question with every farmer should be, not the price of guano, nor super-phosphate, nor poudrette, but how can I, on my own farm and with the least expense, make the most manure? If farmers generally exercised the same economy in the care and management of the animal manures about their premises, that they do in many other things pertaining to their pecuniary interests, there would be less complaint about short crops.

There is no great amount of labor to be done out of doors during this month. The most important labor of the farmer now, is the care of his domestic animals, to see they be well sheltered from cold and wet, and properly fed and watered. The year's profit or loss depends greatly upon the manner in which he winter's his stock. The milk of the ensuing season, the wool, and the ability for labor, all depend in a great measure upon the care the farmer gives his cattle, sheep and horses, during the winter. Regular hours for attending to all matters, is important, but in no department of the farmer's business is it more important than in milking cows, foddering or feeding, watering or carding stock. Cattle should be fed often, and but little at a time,—say three or four times in the twenty-four hours, will keep cattle in better condition and at less expense than to feed but twice a day, being careful never to give them so much at a time that they will leave their feed before it is all consumed.

The Mails for the UNITED STATES by the Mail Steamers from Liverpool, G. B., to Boston, are made up on *Tuesday Evening* of the week the Steamer is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *Supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer arrive *previous* to Tuesday Evening, the mails will then close *immediately* upon her arrival. Letters 8½ cents; Newspapers 2 cents—*must be pre-paid*.

Mails for CANADA are made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be specially addressed, "Closed Mail for Canada." Letters 12½ cents—*pre-payment optional*

The Mails for BERMUDA and the BRITISH WEST INDIA ISLANDS, are made up *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston at 8 o'clock, once a month the year round. Letters 8½ cents, *pre-payment optional*; Newspapers 2 cents, *must be pre-paid*. Also for Cuba, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the Foreign West India Islands. The rates of postage vary to these places. The postage on letters and newspapers must be prepaid. A Mail is also forwarded *via* Bermuda, Chagres and Panama, to places on the Western Coast of America. Letters 33½ cents; Newspapers 8½ cents—*must be pre-paid*. In all cases the Inland postage to Halifax (5 cents) must be paid in addition to the above rates.

The Mails for ST. PIERRE and MICHELON are forwarded to Nfld. by Steamer. Letters 8½ cents, and if posted in the Interior 5 cents additional; Newspapers 2 cents—*All to be pre-paid*.

LAND MAILS.

Letters posted in NOVA SCOTIA addressed to any place within the Province, *must be pre-paid*, postage 5 cents—if posted unpaid they are taxed *double rates*, Newspapers free; On letters to CANADA, NEW BRUNSWICK and PRINCE EDWARD'S ISLAND the rate is 5 cents, *pre-payment optional*; on letters to the UNITED STATES (except Oregon and California) postage 10 cents—and for OREGON and CALIFORNIA 15 cents, *pre-payment optional*. Newspapers *free*.

Letters dropped in the letter-box during the night *prepaid by stamps*, will be forwarded with the mails despatched the next morning.

For Dartmouth daily—postage 2 cents, *must be pre-paid*

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, or other printed matter of a like description, when unconnected with any written or manuscript communication whatever, passing between any office in Nova Scotia and any place in British North America, or the United States, will be 2 cents per oz. *and must be prepaid*.

Pamphlets, Magazines and Periodicals passing as above, when under 2 oz. pass *free*; for every oz. above 2 oz., 1 cent per oz., *to be prepaid*.

Books also passing as above are charged 1 cent for every oz. up to 48 ozs., *must be prepaid*.

British re-prints of copyright Works from the United States, *by steamer*, are charged letter postage.

Parliamentary papers pass *free* throughout Nova Scotia, if by Mail Steamers 2 cents for every 4 oz., *must be prepaid*.

Letters posted in any town in the Province for delivery in the same town, are charged 2 cents, *must be prepaid*.

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments, are exempt from pre-payment.

REGISTRATION CHARGES.—For the registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia or British North America, is 10 cents; to the

United States, 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 12½ cents; to Australia, foreign countries, and other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. All to be *prepaid*, as also the postage.

Letters for registry must be mailed *half an hour* previous to the closing of the mail by which they are to be despatched.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels by mail can be sent through a Post or Way office to any part of Nova Scotia. For a parcel not over 1lb. 25 cents; more than 1lb. and not exceeding 2lbs. 50 cents; more than 2lbs. and not exceeding 3lbs. (beyond which weight they cannot be sent) 75 cents; 10 cents additional if registered—*both must be pre-paid*. No parcel must exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness.

☞ All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage has been established throughout British North America. A single letter must not exceed ½ oz., exceeding that it is charged double, treble, &c., according to weight.

☞ All letters, parcels and newspapers, when marked in the foregoing "*to be prepaid*," must be paid by having stamps of the amount affixed to them, as money is not received at the offices. Postage stamps can be obtained at any Post or Way office, and at the Druggists and Stationers in Halifax.

☞ All letters not prepaid, posted for places where pre-payment is required, are taxed double rates.

☞ Masters of vessels arriving in the Province, are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver to the Postmaster at the first Office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate, when inward bound, 3 cents.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying letters throughout the Province. Persons receiving and conveying letters incur a penalty of \$1 for every letter so conveyed, except—1. Letters sent to be mailed in the nearest Post or Way Office. 2. Letters to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel, not being a Packet. 3. Letters sent by a Messenger purposely, on the private affairs of the sender or receiver. 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Office. 5. Letters of Merchants, Ship Owners, or of cargo sent by Merchant vessels, and delivered to the party to whom addressed without charge or fee.

When the mail arrives from Liverpool, G. B., before 9 p. m., they are delivered the same evening; after that hour at 7 the next morning.

All other mails arriving before 7 p. m., are delivered the same evening; after that hour at 7 the following morning.

The Postmaster General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

No person is obliged to send pamphlets, books, or newspapers, by Mail.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, Nfld.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbor. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax harbor. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbor, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white Belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg harbour. Two lights—*flash light above; fixed light below.*

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to LaHave River. *A bright, flash light*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the Southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain, revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbour light, at the head of Liverpool Harbor, southern entrance. *A bright, fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbour.

PORT MEDWAY—Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted *white* with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

SHELburne—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light*, of fifteen seconds.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in Lat. 43° 39' N., and Long. 64° 66' W.

PUBNICO HARBOR LIGHT.—A Beacon light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico Harbour, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A fixed red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high water level, (rise and fall twelve feet), and stands fifty fathoms from low water mark. The point of beach is bold.

CAPE FORCHU LIGHT—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth harbor—*A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted *white*, and is elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

A **FOG BELL** has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

CAPE SABLE, SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*; elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. *A fixed, white light*.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*,—exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles, *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a green light*. Port Williams is distant from Digby light house, E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock light house, W. 27 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*, exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a red light*. Margareville is distant, E. 37 miles from Digby light house, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock light-house.

These lights in the above beacon lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed, white light*.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas, 95 feet above sea level, high water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greatest part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blowmedon), and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An Octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty-feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach.

Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shews a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted *white*. Bearings and distances. Cape Blowmedon, N. 70, W. 26 5, 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52, W. 7 5, 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36, W. 3 9, 10 miles.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall, six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

EASTERN BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A revolving light.*

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights, one above the other.*

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU—*A fixed light.*

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU LIGHT—On the south east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high water mark.

ARICHAU BEACON—A light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbour. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea-level.

LOUISBURGH—On the east side of the entrance to the harbor. *A fixed light.*

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbour. *A fixed light.*

SEA-WOLF, OR MARGERIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a-half miles. *A plain, white light.* The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above the sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliffs, or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from the Margerie and North Canseau lights.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT. On Flint Island, off the eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. 40°, 11 5 N., and Long. 69°, 45 to 50 W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every 15 seconds, visible from all points of the com-

pass. The light is 65 feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of 12 miles.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND. *A fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end.

SCATTERIE ISLAND. *A revolving light*, on the east end of the Island.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT. This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about 4 miles. From this range further westerly, about 6 miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull, this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS. *Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, 45 feet above high-water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, (British or American). Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as will be, then, not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the E. of the lights.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT. Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* with a *red cross* on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS. Upon this projecting headland, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant 28 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, 5 feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT. At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light*. The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT. Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S.S.E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT. *A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT. On the point of that name in Westmoreland,

nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain, white light.*

WEST QUONDY LIGHT. This is an American Light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A **LIGHT HOUSE** has been erected upon **CAPE RACE**, Newfoundland, a *fixed, white light* from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The Tower is striped *red and white* vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Light House is Lat. 46 degrees 39 minutes 19 seconds N., Long. 53 degrees 2 minutes 38 seconds W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 degrees W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle:

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT. An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south west point of the island. *A single fixed white light.* Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color. Lat. N. 51° 53' 00"; Long. W. 55° 26' 00" Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT. Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Forteau Bay, Lat. N. 57° 27' 30"; Long. W. 56° 53' 40". *A single fixed white light*—two thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather—18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. 49° 52' 3", Long. W. 64° 35' 00". *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT. East Coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. 48° 51' 00", Long. W. 64° 15' 30". *A single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light color.

Signals will be given at, or near, each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

STAGE COACHES AND STEAMERS.

King's Stage Coaches, conveying H. M. Mails, leave Windsor for Kentville every day immediately after the arrival of the morning Railway train from Halifax; and Kentville for Windsor daily (Sundays excepted.) Leaves Windsor for Annapolis on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, also immediately after the arrival of the morning Railway Train from Halifax, returning on the intervening days. Leaves Halifax for Lunenburg, Liverpool, Shelburne and Yarmouth on Monday, Wednesday and Friday Mornings at 7 o'clock, returning on the intervening days.

The Steamer Emperor, during the Summer season, leaves Windsor for St. John, N.
