## REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STATISTICS.

We have carefully examined the District schedules and find as follows : There are reported 43 ministers and 17 probationers—total, 60, of whom 51 are engaged in the active work. The total membership is 4,581, being a net increase of 135.

The total raised for Connexional Funds is \$5,750.10, a net decrease of \$1,000.47. For ministerial support there has been raised \$7,528.00, a decrease of \$2,644.00. From the Missionary Society, for ministerial support has been received \$20,384.00, an increase over the previous year of \$5,261.00. The total contributed to the Missionary Society is \$2,989.70, a decrease of \$684.40. Thus the amount distributed in this Conference, over and above our contributions, is \$17,394.30.

### REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee is pleased to report that all branches of the work show a healthy state. Evidence is given of a laudable anxiety on the part of our people that the instructors of their children shall be godly men and women. As the great object of the Sabbath School is the salvation of the young, we rejoice to be able to report an increase of conversions on each District.

We regret that so few schools hold regular teachers' meetings for the study of the lessons.

It is to be deplored that so few are memorizing our catechisms. We suggest that the catechism questions be brought before the open school so that doctrinal instruction may be more fully given to our scholars.

When the evils of intemperance, tobacco using and profanity are so rife, we recommend that the triple pledge, as found in our "Discipline," be urged on every scholar.

We rejoice that catechumen classes have been formed in several places, and hope that in other places the same work will be taken up. We are glad to note that our people appreciate the efforts made by our Publishing House to disseminate healthy literature for the young by taking their papers and helps almost entirely therefrom.

We suggest to the editors of our excellent periodicals the desirability of guarding against the frequent repetition of articles in the same papers.

We suggest to the Conference that provision be made for almost equal representation for our Sabbath Schools in the Epworth League conventions, and that subjects bearing on the relation of the Sabbath School to the League be introduced for discussion.

## REPORT OF EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

1. *Re* the letter of the General Superintendent in relation to the appointment of a member of Epworth League and Sunday School Board to represent this Conference, we nominate Mr. F. W. Davey, of Victoria, to be the representative.

2. *Re* the last clause of the Epworth League Committee's report of 1894, recommending amalgamation with another association, we call the attention of Conference and of Epworth Leagues throughout the Province to the fact that the General Conference defines the relation which the Epworth League Convention may hold to other young people's societies' conventions as that of affiliation and not amalgamation.

3. Since there are some Epworth Leagues which have not been reported to the District meetings, your Committee ask permission to present such amended statistics as may be furnished by the Provincial President of Epworth Leagues.

## SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT.

4. Your Committee after careful inquiry find that there are 22 Leagues and 1,200 members within the Conference, being an increase of 2 Leagues and 437 members. The reports of moneys raised by the Leagues are so imperfect that we cannot make any report.

5. We recommend that greater care be exercised by the Superintendent of Circuits in making out and reporting the Epworth League schedules this year.

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

The Scripture, which is our rule of faith and practice, is very plain and emphatic in all its teachings with reference to the claims of the Sabbath upon all men, but we are continually reminded of the great disrespect in which the Sabbath is held in this province, as evidenced by fishing, hunting, boating and picnic parties, excursions by train and steamboat, bicycle practice and ball games, not forgetting buggy and sleigh driving in quest of pleasure on God's holy day.

The action of the Vancouver and New Westminster councils, in passing stringent Sunday closing by-laws, cannot be too highly commended, but on the other hand we cannot too strongly condemn the action of the Provincial Parliament, during its last session, in its treatment of the Sabbath Observance Bill introduced by Mr. Kennedy, of New Westminster.

Whereas, we have not failed to notice a growing tendency, on the part of our people, to patronize Sunday trains, steamboats and street cars, and as it is not an unusual thing to see street cars on the Sabbath filled to overflowing with worshippers going to and from the churches, we recommend:

1. That this Conference place itself on record as being opposed to all such practices.

2. That all the ministers of this Conference bring before their congregations, at an early date, the necessity of discouraging all Sunday excursions, and of discontinuing the use of all public conveyances on the Lord's Day.

3. That this Conference take heed in arranging the various fields, not to make it impossible for a minister to attend his appointments without patronizing public conveyances on the Sabbath.

4. That such arrangements be made for Conferences, District meetings, conventions, and other public meetings of our church, as shall not necessitate travelling on the Sabbath day.

5. That Revs. C. Watson and J. F. Betts, with Messrs. D. Spencer and D. Donaldson, be a standing committee to co-operate with similar committees from other churches in such time and manner as, in the opinion of the co-operative committee, shall be most effective to secure such legislation as will bring about the better observance of the Lord's Day.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

With gratification we record the great change that, during the last few years, has taken place in public sentiment on the Temperance question. We agree with Neal Dow, that "what cannot be mended must be ended," and without qualification declare "that total prohibition is the right and only effective remedy for the evils of intemperance;" while, as a Church, we reaffirm our willingness to co-operate with all other Christian bodies in bringing to an end this iniquitous traffic.

During the year heinous crimes have been committed in this province, traceable to the liquor traffic, whose supporters trample on law, order and justice. Intoxicating liquors have been sold to Indians along the coast. Steamboats having licensed bars, have sold liquors to other than passengers and crew, while in port; and the Sunday Closing Act has been frequently and openly violated.

Whereas, club licenses are being granted in rural districts, we regret that the recommendation of last year, looking to the abolition, or control by the people, of such licenses, has not been carried out;

We recommend that this Conference appoint a committee to correspond with other churches and the officers of temperance organizations, in order to bring about a plebiscite on the Prohibition question; also, that said committee communicate with the Government requesting the institution of the "Curfew Bell," now in successful operation in many towns in the East; also, that this Conference impress upon all its ministers the necessity of more frequently referring to temperance subjects in their pulpits and Sabbath Schools.

In submitting the following report upon the work done by the Columbian Methodist College during the past year, as also upon the present financial position of the Institution, your Board of Directors cannot refrain from expressing gratification that in the face of almost insuperable difficulties, the College has continued its work without interruption during the year.



The record of attendance, while not so large as that of last year, cannot but be regarded as good, in view of all the facts.

Throughout the year discipline has been maintained without friction. Students have cheerfully and successfully prosecuted their studies, teachers have devoted themselves to their work with a self-sacrificing zeal which is beyond praise, and best of all, a most healthy and precious religious influence has pervaded every department of the College. There is a good prospect of an increased attendance next year.

In reviewing the financial condition of the Institution, though it is unfortunately true that, in spite of the strictest economy, a balance appears on the wrong side of the account, we cannot refrain from expressing our conviction that, taking account of existing financial conditions, the showing is better than could have been expected.

This statement, while containing much that gives cause for gratitude, in view of all the circumstances, yet reveals the fact that the affairs of the College have reached a crisis calling for loyal and immediate action. Your Board rejoices to be able to lay before the Conference for its approval a scheme which, if successfully carried out, will at once pay off all existing liabilities and place the Conference in possession of a beautiful property admirably adapted for our purposes and free of all encumbrances. The proposition is briefly as follows:

A short time ago the Board of Managers were informed that one of the finest residential properties in the Province was about to be placed upon the market at \$15,000, about one-fourth of its cost. If the amount of the existing liabilities were added, the total would amount to \$22,186, while the Conference would secure a property which the most conservative appraisers value at \$25,000, together with other assets valued at \$6,200. Almost at the same time, a letter was received from Mr. H. A. Massey, in which he proposed, if suitable premises could be obtained free from indebtedness for \$25,000, to contribute \$10,000 of the amount. The sum required to carry out this proposal would therefore be \$12,000. The Board of Directors at once resolved to avail itself, if possible, of an offer so favorable, and on April 27th secured an option of purchase on the property for thirty days. The Principal was at once despatched to the East to make strenuous efforts to secure still further aid, while a committee, consisting of the Secretary and Prof. E. Odum, were appointed to canvass this province. Up to last evening the Principal had not been heard from, but the local committee reports subscriptions to the amount of \$3,000.

The Board of Directors are convinced that upon the carrying out of their proposition the continued success, and even the existence, of the College depends; and therefore commend it to the earnest consideration of the Conference, recommending that immediate action be taken.

It is further recommended: 1. That the superintendent of each circuit and mission in the Conference, with the lay delegates to Conference residing in the bounds of each circuit and mission, be a committee to make a rapid canvass for funds in aid of the proposed college purchase scheme, results to be reported to the College Secretary not later than the 25th inst.; and further, that every preacher be requested to bring the matter before his congregations and ask for subscriptions on Sunday next, 19th inst.

2. We recommend that the following be the Board of Directors for the ensuing year: Revs. S. Cleaver, M.A., President of Conference, T. W. Hall, Principal Whittington, M.A., B.Sc., J. H. ### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

1. We recommend that every possible means be taken to create a greater enthusiasm among our ministers and people in our Quarterly Official Boards, Epworth Leagues, and Sabbath Schools in the cause of Missions, especially by the more frequent diffusion of definite missionary information.

2. We recommend that the Chinese missionaries be instructed to itinerate more among their fellow-countrymen outside of the cities wherein they are stationed.

3. We recommend, with a view to economy in the expenditure of missionary money, that for the ensuing year the Chinese missionary in Victoria reside in the apartments connected with the Chinese Mission premises, and the missionary to Indian tribes be given a part of the Chinese Girls' Rescue Home for occupation.

4. We urge upon those who have the oversight of the Chinese work in New Westminster and Vancouver, the importance of preaching the Gospel as frequently as possible to the large number of Chinese connected with the canneries on the Lower Fraser.

5. That the minute of Simpson District in reference to the *Glad Tidings* be endorsed, and a copy be sent to the General Board of Missions, as follows: "Whereas there is a strong desire for retrenchment in the Missionary Society's income, and whereas it seems possible to effect a saving in the cost of carrying on the evangelistic work done by means of the *Glad Tidings*, we recommend that the *Glad Tidings* be continued under the control of the chairman, and we pledge ourselves to obey the chairman's call to undertake evangelistic trips on the *Glad Tidings* at such times as our absence would not be prejudicial to the interests of our respective missions."

6. We recommend the Conference to give their written approval for the continuance of the Kitamaat Home for Indian Boys and Girls, to the Executive of the Woman's Missionary Society, and to recommend the Woman's Missionary Society to continue to aid the Home.

7. On this clause of the report it was, on motion of the Conference—  
*Resolved*,—That this Conference urge upon the General Board of Missions and the Woman's Missionary Society, the importance of establishing, as soon as possible, a central industrial institute for the Kitamaat, Bella Bella, Bella Coola and other Indian tribes in that neighborhood; and that we request the Board of Missions to negotiate with the Dominion Government with the object of getting a grant towards building and

equipping such institute. The following were appointed a committee to select a suitable place for such an institute, viz., the Chairman of the Simpson District, Revs. G. F. Raley, D. Jennings, R. B. Beavis and Messrs. Dr. Bolton, G. Robinson and W. H. Gibson.

8. We recommend that the following reports be adopted and published in the Minutes, viz., of the Coqualeetza Industrial Institute, the Simpson Boys' Industrial Institute, the Kitamaat Home for Indian Children, and the report of the Japanese work.

9. We recommend that Mr. Okomoto be continued at work among his fellow-countrymen, the Japanese.

10. We recommend that effective measures be adopted by the chairmen of districts concerned, for a thorough supply of missionary labor among the Indians connected with the canneries during the fishing season.

11. On this clause, after the report of the "Committee on Salvation Army Correspondence," the whole matter was referred to the Conference Special Committee for the ensuing year.

12. We recommend that the following resolution be referred to the Conference Missionary Committee: Copy of resolution moved by Rev. A. E. Green, seconded by Rev. J. W. Winslow: That it is the judgment of this Conference that whereas, for the want of a clear, definite and equitable method governing the action of the Conference Missionary Committee, the grant from the General Board of Missions to this Conference has not been so apportioned to domestic missionaries as to make full provision for necessary horse-keep, rent, travelling expenses and incidentals over and above an equitable amount for salary, board and fuel; therefore we think it important that the grant made to this Conference (which is a percentage of a basis intended to include horse-keep, etc., in addition to salary, board and fuel) be disposed of in effect as follows: 1st. That out of the total grant to the Conference each domestic missionary should receive the amount of his prospective horse-keep, etc., and 2nd, That the balance be divided equitably as salary, board and fuel, among all the claimants on the grant. Be it further resolved that in order to uniformity in filling out the schedule for ministerial support, the term "appropriation for salary, etc.," be understood to be exclusive of horse-keep, etc., the amounts for these expenses being entered in another schedule.

#### REPORT OF COQUALEETZA INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTE.

There were 63 pupils in attendance at the commencement of the year, 55 admitted during the year, 32 dismissed, and one died, leaving 85 pupils now in attendance.

There have been added to the teaching staff an assistant matron, a shoemaker, and a cook. This makes the number of seven (7) paid teachers in the Institute.

The annual grant from the Indian Department has been increased from \$1,300 to \$2,210. The health of both teachers and pupils has been generally good, any indisposition among the former being due to overwork.

The one pupil who died during the year, a boy of ten years, was delicate when he entered the school. During his attendance he gave his heart to God, and died trusting in the Saviour, and exhorting his relatives to meet him in heaven. The various departments have been efficiently worked during the year, and the progress of the pupils generally has been satisfactory. A most gracious revival of religion has pervaded the little community during the past few months, and nearly all the larger, as well as many of the intermediate, pupils, have been hopefully converted, and are making gratifying progress in the Christian life. This renders the work of instruction pleasant, and the administration of discipline easy.

#### REPORT OF PORT SIMPSON INDUSTRIAL AND TRAINING INSTITUTE.

This has been a year of good work by and for our few boys. Progress has been noticeable in each boy, and remarkable in some. Mr. and Mrs. Richards continue to evince a deep and personal interest in their charge, and their teaching and influence are salutary. The number of boys remains at eleven, two of the older boys having gone out—Alfred McKay and Sam. Hall; while they have been replaced by Alfred Price, a homeless boy, of Port Simpson, aged five years, and Frank Dayes, an intelligent and ambitious lad of fifteen, from the Naas Mission. We feel that invaluable good has been done in caring for and teaching these boys, especially as otherwise most of them would be homeless and subject to the very worst influences; but we hope that at no distant date we may be able to increase the number of inmates, and to the present teaching of Scripture truth and ordinary school branches, add that of useful trades.

#### REPORT OF HOME FOR BOYS AND GIRLS AT KITAMAAT.

Our attendance at the Home has increased during the year. We have had thirty children in residence, seventeen girls and thirteen boys. The general health has been remarkably good, and the conduct of the children excellent. We report an average school attendance of forty-two. While the definite object of the Home is to keep the children at school, our first and highest aim is to make them Christians. A debt of \$155 from last year is fully provided for.

#### REPORT OF "GLAD TIDINGS" COMMITTEE.

During the year the *Glad Tidings* has travelled about seven thousand miles, while by the missionary and in the visits of the Chairman, six hundred services have been held, and about eight thousand people, mostly heathen, have been reached. She has also carried lumber to different places for church and mission purposes, also supplies for different missions; and she has done other work to help pay expenses.

## MR. OKOMOTO'S REPORT.

About two years ago, when I was living in Victoria, I was called by the Lord to preach the Gospel to my people in Skeena. This call I obeyed, trusting alone in God. By His grace and the help of the ministers I preached the Gospel for one year among the Japanese on the Skeena. Last August I came, on the *Glad Tidings*, to Vancouver, by the kindness of Mr. Crosby, my purpose then being to visit friends in Vancouver and return again soon to Skeena; but "man proposes and God disposes," for God had a work for me here when I arrived in Vancouver. I first went to a prayer-meeting in the Japanese Society of Christian Endeavor, which was organized last January by a few Christians. At this meeting all Christians present stood up and expressed a desire to work for God, and would hereafter do all in their power to lead those in darkness out into the blessed Gospel light. Many have been gloriously saved, praise the Lord! Last October we moved to our present place, 226 Hastings Street East, Vancouver. Since that time over eighty have been brought out of darkness into the light. Six of our number have consecrated their lives wholly to the Master's service. Two of these have gone to the Union

Mines, where about two hundred Japs are working. By the aid of some Christians a small church has been built. This year we hope to preach to the Japanese fishermen who go in great numbers to the fishery on the Fraser. Our plan for this year is to build a small, cheap building in which to hold services. This comes a little hard on us, as we are doing our best to support the work at Union, Victoria and Vancouver.

Kind friends, can you not help us to continue this work of saving precious souls for Christ? God has most wonderfully manifested His power among us Japanese. Praying for His continued blessing, we are,

## THE ANNUAL PASTORAL ADDRESS

OF THE

BRITISH COLUMBIA CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH  
TO THE CHURCHES UNDER ITS CARE.

DEARLY BELOVED,—Being again assembled in Annual Conference, we send you affectionate greeting in the name of our common Saviour and Lord. "Grace be unto you, and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We thank our God upon every remembrance of you, always, in every prayer of ours for you all, making request with joy, for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now; being confident of this very thing, that He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ." "For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming? For ye are our glory and joy."

We render heartfelt thanks to Almighty God that in His abundant mercy the ministerial ranks of the Conference have been unbroken by death during the year. For several days in the early part of the session we were oppressed with anxiety on account of the non-arrival of the missionary steamer *Glad Tidings*, having on board a party of our beloved brethren and fellow-laborers from the North. But our God "holdeth the sea in the hollow of His hand." In answer to many prayers, they were brought to us safe and well, and we received them with great rejoicing.

We still count it our unspeakable privilege to preach a full, free and present salvation for all who truly repent of their sins and believe the Gospel; and we purpose to continue so to do, God being our helper. The great and well proved doctrines of the Gospel as proclaimed by the early Methodists; of ruin by the Fall; of Atonement by the death, and Justification by the resurrection of our Lord; of the direct witness of the Spirit; of the personality and divinity of the Holy Ghost; of future and eternal rewards and punishments—we are resolved still to hold fast and set forth with all fervor and fidelity, for we have found them in our own experience to be "the power of God unto salvation."

We record with gratitude that during the past year "our labor has not been in vain in the Lord." A goodly number have been added to the Church, and are witnessing a good confession, while a few have died in the triumphs of faith, and have gone to be "forever with the Lord." Yet we find abundant cause for humility and deep searching of the heart, that much more has not been accomplished. We may have depended too much upon self, and upon merely human agencies, and not enough upon God, who, whenever the Word is preached in its simplicity, with reliance upon

the Holy Spirit, makes it mighty to the pulling down of strongholds of sin. Pray for us, "that utterance may be given unto us, that we may open our mouths boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, for which we are ambassadors in bonds, that therein we may speak boldly as we ought to speak."

As it is God's plan to work by means, we may ask whether sufficient attention is given to the calling and employment of local preachers, a class of men greatly honored of God in the past, and by whose labors many of the most glorious triumphs of Methodism have been won. Are our class leaders all using their gifts to the utmost in leading the members of their classes into the enjoyment of "the fulness of the blessing of the gospel of Christ?" Are our stewards and trustees all men "full of faith and of the Holy Ghost," administering the temporalities of the Church for the glory of God and the advancement of His kingdom? Are all our Sunday School teachers and Epworth League workers doing all in their power to realize for themselves, and to lead those under their influence into the enjoyment of a "salvation from all sin"? Is the family altar an institution honored and cherished in the homes of all our people? Do Christian parents sufficiently consider their responsibility for the conversion of the children whom God has given them to train for heaven? Or is it, as we have cause to fear, sometimes the case that while father and mother are in the house of God, their children are learning baneful lessons in the school of sin? In view of the only possible answer to these questions, what wonder that while "the fields are white unto the harvest," so few sheaves are gathered in. Nothing but a mighty baptism of the Holy Spirit upon all our churches can enable us to do the great work to which God has called us.

"Oh, that it now from heaven might fall,  
And all our sins consume!  
Come, Holy Ghost, for Thee we call,  
Spirit of burning, come."

We grieve to note a falling-off in many of our connexional funds. This is doubtless caused in part by the severe commercial depression through which our province has been passing, but we are persuaded that the work of God will never be supported as it should be until all our people have learned to "honor God with their substance and the first-fruits of all their increase." We earnestly commend to you the practice of systematic beneficence, laying by a fixed proportion of your incomes to be used in the Lord's work. Only so can giving become a joy, the poor as well as the rich sharing in this delightful service. "Every man, according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give, not grudgingly, or of necessity, for God loveth a cheerful giver." "And God is able to make all grace abound towards you; that ye always, having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work."

We especially regret to notice a decrease in the amount contributed to the missionary enterprises of the Church, and fear there is some foundation for the conviction expressed by the Missionary Secretary after a recent visit to the coast, that in this respect we are not doing our whole duty. This is a Missionary Conference, receiving each year in grants

from the Missionary Society many times the amount raised for this purpose within its bounds. No pressure of local demands can relieve us from the responsibility of looking beyond self and home needs to the great world still lying in heathen darkness. For this world Christ died, and to it we are debtors, having been "put in trust of the Gospel." "If any man seeth his brother have need, and shutteth up his bowels of compassion towards him, how dwelleth the love of God in him?" If this be true of merely temporal necessities, how much the more when the need is that of a knowledge of the way of salvation. "Therefore as ye abound in every thing, in faith and utterance, and knowledge, and in all diligence, and in your love to us, see that ye abound in this grace also." Let our motto be, "Christ for the world, and the world for Christ." He died for us; let us be willing to die for Him, consecrating to Him ourselves, our children, our time, our substance, hastening the day when "He shall see of the travail of his soul and be satisfied."

We commend to your earnest sympathy and liberality the educational interests of our Church, and especially of our own College. In the providence of God the opportunity is now offered to put it upon a sound and secure financial footing. This done, it will soon become a glory and strength to our young Conference, and the training school of our rising ministry.

Our church periodicals deserve your continued support. Particularly the *Christian Guardian* as the official organ of the Connexion, and one of the strongest bonds of union between the East and West, should be in every Methodist home in the land, and now, at \$1 per year, is within the reach of all.

It needs not that we should urge you, with all faithfulness, to support every cause of moral and social reform. The great questions of Sabbath observance and the prohibition of the liquor traffic are still unsettled. Upon the unholy altars of the liquor Moloch, thousands of the youth of our land are yearly sacrificed. Against this iniquity we have many times borne our testimony as a Church. That it still flourishes is a reproach and shame to Christendom. "Deliver us from blood-guiltiness, O God of our salvation, and our tongue shall sing aloud of Thy righteousness."

Many other economic problems which, in our increasingly complex society, are inextricably interwoven with the social and moral well-being of the people, are pressing for solution; such as the best method of securing for all equal right of access to natural opportunities; insuring to every man undisturbed possession of the fruits of his own labor; removing artificial restrictions to the production and equitable distribution of wealth; the complete enfranchisement of women; the simplifying and purifying of government. The settlement of such questions according to the principles of the Gospel, and by practical application of the "Law of Love," is of supreme importance to the Church of God. You do well to consider them with the utmost care. Permit us to counsel you against a conservatism which rejects everything that is out of harmony with existing customs on the one hand, and on the other, against too readily accepting crude and half-formed opinions as though they contained the sum of all wisdom. Remember that no question is settled until it is settled according to the eternal law of right.

And now, beloved, we commend you to the God of all grace. During the year upon which we have entered temptation will assail many, sorrow and bereavement will visit some of our homes, but our God can give strength for every trial. If any hearts and homes are darkened by the departure of loved ones, heaven will be the richer. It may be the aged saint who will "depart to be with Christ," for some "the sun may go down while it is yet day," the tender bud of infancy may be "Nip't by the wind's unkindly blast."

" Yet these, new rising from the tomb,  
With lustre brighter far shall shine ;  
Revive with ever-during bloom,  
Safe from diseases and decline. "

Give us still the joy of saying as of old, " Our people die well." That this may be so, live near to God ; study to show yourselves approved in knowledge of the Scriptures, and of the precious doctrines of Methodism ; be much in prayer with your families, and in private ; gladly in any place to which God and the Church would call you. " And the God of peace sanctify you wholly, and we pray God your whole body, and soul and spirit may be preserved blameless unto the day of Christ."
