LIGHT HOUSES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; The Coast of New Brunswick; Northumberland Strait; Cape Race; Gulf and River St. Lawrence, and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax harbour. *A fixed white light, elevated 58 ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of Devil's Island, entrance of the Eastern Passage to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed red light, on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights, elevated 45 ft. and visible 8 miles. Octagonal dark brown Tower, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.*

SAMBRO ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed white light, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat. 44° 26' N. Long. 63° 35' W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Sambro Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of the trumpet will be of five seconds duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, audible from 6 to 10 miles in calm weather. In case any accident should occur to interrupt the operation of the fog trumpet, signal guns from ships will be answered by the discharge of two 24 pounders in succession.*

West from Halifax.

PEGGY'S POINT LIGHT—Entrance to St. Margaret's Bay (in course of erection).

CHESTER LIGHT, ON IRON BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to Mahone Bay. *Two fixed white lights, apart from each other 25 feet horizontally, and visible from sea from W. S. W. to N. E., elevated 50 feet above highwater. Lat. 44° 26' 15" N. Long. 64° 4' 10" W.*

CROSS ISLAND LIGHT—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. *Two lights placed vertically, 44 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles. Building red, Lantern painted black. Lat. 44° 19' N. Long. 64° 9' W.*

BATTERY POINT LIGHT—At the entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *A fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square building. Lunenburg harbour is easy of access, spar buoys have been placed in the bay and entrance to the harbour on the sculpin rock, haddock shoal, Battery point shoal, and head shoal. In approaching the harbour from seaward the buoy on sculpin rock painted red and black in horizontal stripes may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in.*

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT—Entrance to LaHave River. *A bright dash light, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is placed on a square white tower, on the southern side of the Island, 70 ft. above sea level, and visible from all points of approach.*

MOSER'S ISLAND LIGHT—Entrance to LaHave River. (In course of erection).

PORT MEDWAY HARBOUR LIGHT—On Admiralty Head, W. side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. *A fixed white light, 44 ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles. Spar buoys have been placed in the channel to Port Medway harbour:—On the breaking ledges, Nautilus rock, corner*

ground, and edge of flats off Bangs' point. In passing in from seaward the *red* buoys must be left on the starboard hand, and *black* buoys on the port hand.

LIVERPOOL LIGHT—S. end of Coffin's Island. *A revolving light*, appearing full at intervals of two minutes, 80 ft. above sea level. Building octagon, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT LIGHT—Entrance to the inner harbour of Liverpool. *A white fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbour.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND LIGHT—Off Liverpool. *A revolving red light*, 40 ft. above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situated nearly in the centre of the Island. Lat. 48° 48' 81" N. Long. 64° 47' 15" W. The lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

GULL ROCK LIGHT—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbour. *A white fixed light*, 51 ft. above sea level. Square white building. Lat. 48° 39' N. Long. 64° 66' W.

SHELBOURNE LIGHT—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbour. *Two white lights vertical*—the upper light 100 ft. above sea level and visible 18 miles; the lower light 88 ft. below the lantern at the top of the building and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

BARRINGTON LIGHT—On Baccaro Point, E. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A revolving light*, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49 ft., visible 12 miles. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—*A red fixed light*. Octagonal white building. Lat. 43° 27' N. Long. 65° 36' W. High Water at Cape Sable, full and change, at 7½ o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft., neaps 6 ft.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. *A fixed white light*, 80 ft. above high water, and may be seen, when approaching, from any point of the compass, at the distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. *The Blonde Rock*, lies about 3½ miles S. by W. from the Light House:—Between this rock and the Island, there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them.

PUBNICO HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. *A fixed white light*. 28 ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.) Square white building standing 50 fathoms from low water mark.

FISH ISLAND LIGHT—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tusket River. *Two fixed horizontal white lights*, visible 12 miles.

YARMOUTH LIGHT—On the Island of Cape Forchu, West side of the entrance to the harbour. *A bright revolving light*, 145 ft. above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute. Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. 43° 48' N. Long. 66° 09' W.

CAPE ST. MARY'S LIGHT—(In course of erection.)

BEIER ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the western side. *A white fixed light* 92 ft. above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building.

WESTPORT LIGHTS—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white fixed lights*, placed horizontally, to

distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water mark, visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

BOAR'S HEAD LIGHT—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. *Alternate flashes red and white, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.*

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. *A fixed white light, 76 ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically.*

PORT WILLIAMS LIGHT—Two *fixed white lights, 20 ft. apart perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.*

MARGARETVILLE LIGHT—*A red fixed light, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.*

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—*A white fixed light, 55 ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.*

SPENCER'S POINT—*A white fixed light is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.*

PARRSBORO' LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. *A white fixed light, 30 ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.*

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—*A white fixed light, 95 ft. above high water level (rise and fall 40 to 45 ft.), visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.*

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. *A white fixed light, 75 ft. above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.*

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—The Gannet rock is 66 ft. above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. *A flashing light, which flashes 3 times each minute, (visible 12 miles,) lies S. W. by S., distant 3½ miles from the Southern point of Three Islands, and S. S. E. ¾ E., 7 miles from the S. W. head of the Grand Manan. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northern-most and southern-most of the *Murr Ledges*, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the lighthouse about 4 miles. From this range, farther westerly, about 6 miles, lies a *dangerous breaker*, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.*

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—S. W. by W. ¼ W. from Grand Manan, lie the Machias Islands. On the eastern island two lighthouses are erected, showing *fixed lights*, distant from each other about 165 feet in

the direction of E. S. E. and W. N. W., by which they are distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 and 58 ft. above high water mark, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every 4 hours during a fog.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND LIGHT—On Swallow Tail Point, N. E. side of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 130 ft. above high water, visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W. This is a conspicuous mark in the S. Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER LIGHT—On an Island at the entrance to the River. *A white fixed light*, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

QUODDY HEAD LIGHT.—On the S. E. side of Quoddy head. *A fixed white light*, 138 ft. above sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles. It bears from the Southern point of Grand Manan N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., 13 miles, and from the Northern point of said Island W. N. W. $\frac{7}{4}$ miles. Has a fog trumpet.

CAMPO BELLO LIGHT—On the N. E. extremity of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 64 ft. above the sea. Visible 15 miles. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay to Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PREEAU LIGHT—Upon this projecting headland, *two fixed white lights*, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in stripes of 5 feet broad each, horizontally, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N.B. HARBOUR LIGHT—On Partridge Island, at the entrance of the River and Harbour. *A white fixed light*, 120 ft. above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Fog Horn or Steam Whistle is sounded at intervals of 10 seconds in a minute during the prevalence of fogs and snow storms, and can be heard at a distance of 4 to 6 miles. There is also a Bell Buoy anchored at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the Island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The sound of the bell can be heard 3 miles.

QUACO HEAD LIGHT—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light*, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River light in Cumberland. *A plain white light*, 151 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND LIGHT—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat. $45^{\circ} 43' 18''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 37' 25''$ W., 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. *Two fixed horizontal lights*, 40 feet above high water, visible 10 miles.—Square white building.

EGG ISLAND LIGHT—Off Jeddore. *A revolving light*, 85 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately red and white faces. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $44^{\circ} 39' 51''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$ W.

OUTER BEAVER OR WILLIAMS'S ISLAND LIGHT—*A revolving white flash light*, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat. $44^{\circ} 49'$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 21'$ W.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of the Island. *A bright flash light* of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal Iron lantern, 60 feet above the sea level.

CANBERRY ISLAND LIGHT—(Cape Canso.) *Two white fixed lights*, placed vertically 12 yards apart; the upper 75 ft., the lower 45 ft., above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. $45^{\circ} 19' 49''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 55' 29''$ W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Cranberry Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of the trumpet will be of five seconds duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, audible from 6 to 10 miles.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebucto Bay. *A fixed white light*, 30 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$ W.

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. Entrance to the Strait of Canso. *Two horizontal fixed white lights*, 24 ft. apart, elevated 25 ft. each, visible 8 miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE—*A white fixed light*, 110 ft. above high water, visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat. $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$ N.

POMKET ISLAND LIGHT—In course of erection.

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT—On the N. side of the Cape. *A revolving white light* every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 55' 0''$ W.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 52 ft. above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building.

BIG CARIBOU ISLAND LIGHT—In course of erection.

AMET ISLAND LIGHT—Off Tatamagouche harbour. *A fixed white light*. The lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Lat. $45^{\circ} 49' 39''$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 9' W.$

PICTOU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 65 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. *A small red light* is shown below the lantern. Building octagon, in red and white stripes vertically.

ARICHAT LIGHT—On Marache point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building.

E. W. SUTOLIFFE, Importer of Tea for family use, in 10, 15, 20, 28, 36, 45 and 84 lb. packages.

GREEN ISLAND LIGHT—Near the S. E. end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat. *A fixed red light*, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 28' 51''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling which is painted white.

LOUISBURGH LIGHT—On lighthouse point, N. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 85 ft. above high water, visible 16 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes.

SCATTARI ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. E. point of the Island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90 ft., visible 15 miles. Building white, Lat. $40^{\circ} 2' 12''$ N., Long. $59^{\circ} 40' 18''$ W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N. N. E., or to the southward of S.S.W., nor approached nearer than $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat. $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., Long. $59^{\circ} 47'$ W. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 sec., 65 feet above high water. Octagon white building.

LOW POINT LIGHT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B. harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building red and white vertically.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's, (E. coast of Cape Breton). *Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds*, elevated 77 ft., visible 14 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. $46^{\circ} 25'$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 25' 30''$ W.

BLACK ROCK POINT LIGHT—In course of erection.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND LIGHTS—On the S. point of the Island, Lat. $47^{\circ} 11' 20''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 9' 36''$ is an octagonal lighthouse exhibiting a *revolving white light every minute*, elevated 140 ft., visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S.S.E. southward to W. On a rock, 26 ft. from the end of the Island, in Lat. $47^{\circ} 18' 50''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 8' 20''$ is another similar building of the same height showing a *white fixed light*, visible 20 miles, between N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. northward to E.N.E. A bell is sounded during a fog, and a gun fired every 4 hours.

MARGARIE, or SEA WOLF ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the mainland. *A white fixed light*, near the centre and summit of the Island, elevated 298 ft., visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—*A fixed light*, shows *red* on the N. side; and *white* to the southward, elevated 54 ft., and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat. 46° N., Long. $61^{\circ} 31' 40''$ W.

PRIM POINT LIGHT.—*A fixed light*, S. E. point of Hillsborough Bay, 68 feet above sea level, visible 12 to 15 miles. Stands 100 yards within the point.

CHARLOTTE TOWN LIGHT.—*A small fixed harbour light*, at Block house Point, W. side of entrance to the harbour.

BEDEQUE RAY LIGHT.—On Sea Cow Head.—*A fixed white light*, S. E. side of entrance, 80 feet above high water, visible 14 miles.

NORTH POINT LIGHT.—*A fixed light*, 80 ft. above high water, visible 14 miles.

SHEDIAC BAY LIGHT.—A fixed light, from a lantern on a pole, on Chene wharf, white square tower. Lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 40''$ Long. $64^{\circ} 43' 30''$ W.

RICHIBUCTO HEAD LIGHT.—A fixed white light, elevated 70 ft., visible 14 miles. White square tower. Lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 40''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 43' 30''$ W.

ESCUMENAC POINT LIGHT.—A fixed light, 70 feet above high water, visible 14 miles, and serves to warn vessels of their approach to the reef which runs off 2 miles N. E. from the point.

BIRCH POINT LIGHT.—On Miscou Island. A fixed red light, 79 feet above high water, visible 12 miles. Wooden octagonal tower.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT.—At the extreme point of the Cape. A fixed white light, elevated 136 ft., visible 16 miles. Circular white stone tower, 6 miles to the Southward is Cape Gaspe. Lighted from April 1 to Dec. 15.

FATHER POINT LIGHT.—On the extremity of the point. A fixed light elevated 43 ft., visible when bearing W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., and E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., 10 miles. White octagonal tower. Lighted from April 10 to Dec. 10.

BIC ISLAND LIGHT.—A revolving light, at regular intervals of 2 minutes, 112 ft. above sea level. A gun is fired every hour during foggy weather or snow storms.

POINT DE MONTES LIGHT.—A bright fixed light, 100 ft. above sea level, visible 15 to 20 miles. Building white and low down close to the sea. A ledge of rocks lies off the point S. W. from the light, and S. E. from the extremity of the point, half a mile from the shore.

ANTICOSTI—There are three excellent lights on this Island : HEATH POINT LIGHT.—E. Cape. A bright fixed light from W. N. W. to N. E. by N., lantern elevated 110 ft. above the sea, visible 15 to 18 miles in clear weather. The lighthouse must always be kept open southward of Cormorant point. Conical tower 75 ft. high;—S. W. POINT LIGHT.—On the extremity of the point. A bright revolving light, every minute, lantern elevated 100 ft. above high water, visible 15 miles from N. N. W. to about S. S. E. Conical shaped tower 75 ft. high;—WEST POINT LIGHT.—A fixed light, elevated 112 ft., visible 15 miles. Tower circular, faced with white brick, Lat. $49^{\circ} 52' 5''$ Long. $64^{\circ} 32'$.

Four conspicuous Beacons are placed on the S. coast, each 40 ft. high, viz : At S. point; at Pavillion River; at East of Salt Lake Bay, 6 miles; and at Cape St. Mary.

CAPE RACE LIGHT.—(S. E. point of Newfoundland.)—A revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 189 ft., visible 17 miles. The S. E. face of the building is striped red and white vertically. Lat. $48^{\circ} 31' 44''$ N., Long. $58^{\circ} 7' 00''$ W.

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT.—On an Island at E. entrance of the Strait of Belle Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme S. point of the Island. A fixed light, elevated 470 ft. Building circular, faced with white brick, visible 28 miles. Lat. $51^{\circ} 53' N.$, Long. $55^{\circ} 22\frac{1}{4}' W.$

POINT AMOUR LIGHT.—Labrador coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the S.E. side of Forteau Bay. A fixed light, visible 18 miles. Building circular, faced with white brick. Lat. $51^{\circ} 27\frac{1}{4}' N.$, Long. $56^{\circ} 51' W.$ A fog whistle, or 9-pound Gun are used during a fog at the above two light houses.

III.—Thursday, Nov. 5. A transit of MERCURY over the Sun's Disc, *invisible* at Halifax. On the morning of Nov. 5, between the hours of one and five o'clock, Halifax mean time. A Citizen of the Dominion of Canada might possibly see the phenomenon, if he should happen to be trading down to the Island of Madagascar.

THE NEW STYLE in Catholic countries, by order of Pope Gregory XIII., was adopted in 1582, commanding to reckon the 5th of October as the 15th, thus omitting 10 days. Protestant countries adopted this rule in 1752, calling the 3rd of September the 14th, omitting 11 nominal days. Russia still adheres to the old style, the difference from the new being now 12 days. Up to 1752, the year was held to begin in England with the 25th of March; 1751 did so, but 1752 began January 1, by Act of Parliament, agreeably to the Gregorian or Roman Catholic Calendar, which is the true time, with only an error of one day in about 8,000 years.

THE SEASONS.—The annual revolution of the earth is accomplished in 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, and 51 seconds. In the course of this revolution the inhabitants of every clime experience, though at different times, a variety of seasons. Spring, summer, autumn, and winter, follow each other in constant succession. In those countries which lie in the southern hemisphere November, December and January are the summer months, while in the northern hemisphere, where we reside, these are our months of winter, when the weather is coldest, and the days shortest. In the northern and southern hemispheres the seasons are opposite to each other. During six months, from March 21 to Sept. 23, the sun shines without intermission on the north pole, so that there is no night there during all that interval, while the south pole is all this time enveloped in darkness. From Sept. to March the south pole enjoys the solar light, while the north, in its turn, is deprived of the sun and left in darkness. The sun is at different distances from the earth at different periods of the year, owing to the earth's moving in an elliptical orbit; but it is not upon this circumstance that the seasons depend. For on the 1st January we are more than three millions of miles nearer the sun than on the 1st July, when the heat of our summer is generally greatest.

EVERY farmer has a theory. Every sane man performs all his business in accordance with some rules which satisfy his mind. A man may strike his horse, or break his plough, without following, and indeed in opposition to theory; but all that he does deliberately, and of his free will, he does because he is convinced of its practicability and lawfulness—because he has a good reason for it; or he is no honest man. The farmer may affect to despise theory, and claim that he is purely practical man; but he is mistaken. For to suppose that a man can carry out the manifold affairs of a farm, through a whole year and through many years, without some mental basis for his operations, is sheer nonsense. This mental basis is theory, and to take pride "in freedom from theory" is to boast of inability to think. Practice is, like theory, good or bad. Good practice may be in part accidental and independent of good theory; but good theory, if it become active, must work itself out in good practice. Bad practice is the result of erroneous or imperfect want of theory. Bad theory can hardly fail to produce disadvantageous practice.

Magnitude, Motions, &c. of the Planets Vesta, Juno, Ceres, and Pallas.

The immense interval which lies between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter, led astronomers to surmise that a planet of considerable magnitude might possibly exist somewhere within this limit. Between the orbits of Mercury and Venus there is an interval of 31 millions of miles; between those of Venus and the Earth, 27 millions; between those of the Earth and Mars 50 millions; but between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter there intervenes the immense space of 349 millions of miles. No planetary body, however, was detected within this interval till the beginning of the present

Country residents may be divided into two classes—the neat and the slovenly. The former may be known on approaching their dwellings, by the air of finish and comfort which pervade the premises—the whole indicating that the man who has mastered one art, does not find it hard to master another—or, in other words, as he does not allow the intrusion of mullins and pig weed among his crops, neither will he allow the defacement of his door-yard by old rubbish in its countless forms. Of the latter class the indications are various—sometimes they consist in a broken fence bordered with an unbroken hedge of briars, elders and thistles—at others, the yard, which has been a neat lawn with shady trees, mostly occupied with burdocks and nettles, bordering old decaying heaps of chips and pools of kitchen slops, and the droppings of cattle, and cut up by the wheels of carts into mud-holes of unknown depth, until sounded in a dark evening by the unwary foot of a neighbor's wife or daughter. There is again an intermediate class—belonging partly to both the preceding—perhaps the largest class of all. Over these neatness and disorder seem to hold each a sort of doubtful jurisdiction—perhaps a neat picket fence in front, has its counterpart in a decayed rail fence in rear—a flower bed by the front door and a puddle of soap-suds at the kitchen door.

century; and instead of one large body, as was surmised, four small ones have been discovered. Of these four bodies the first discovered was *Ceres* at Palermo on the 1st January 1801. *Vesta* was discovered in 1807, by Dr. Olbers, who had previously discovered *Pallas*, and re-discovered *Ceres*. Mean distance of *Vesta* from the sun is about 225 millions of miles, its annual revolution is completed in about three years, $7\frac{1}{2}$ months; the circumference of its orbit is 1414 millions of miles, moving with a velocity of more than 44,000 miles an hour. Its diameter is only about 270 miles, and if this be correct, it will contain only 229,000 square miles, or a surface somewhat less than Great Britain, France and Ireland, and would contain a population of 64 millions of inhabitants, or about five times the number of the inhabitants of the United States of America, or nearly the twelfth part of the earth.

WHEN Spring comes every farmer will have a piece of ground, garden or orchard where he can profitably apply all the manure he can save or make during winter. Every shovelful of manure judiciously applied will increase the amount of his harvest. Now is the time to make arrangements and preparations for carrying it out. Let all manures be kept under cover or sheltered as much as possible. Save carefully all droppings from the roosts, this makes a near approach to guano. Let those near the sea shore collect seaweed—and those who live near saw mills draw home and put under cover sawdust. This may be used, to good advantage, in absorbing the urine of horses and cattle, and retaining the fertilizing ammonia which they contain. Sawdust and dry meadow muck, well saturated with urine, will be a fertilizer almost equal to guano. Save all, the bones you can and make your own superphosphate—your next harvest will pay you for all your trouble. Remember your manure is gold and your farm your mint!

Through this circuit it moves in 4 years and 128 days, at the rate of 1,860 miles every hour. Its diameter is 1425 English miles. Its surface will therefore contain 6, 880,000 square miles, and a population of 1786 millions, which is more than double the number of the earth's inhabitants. Its greatest distance from the sun is 316,968,000 miles, while its least distance is only 189,792,000. This planet is of a reddish colour, and is free from any nebulosity.

The planet CERES is about 263 millions of miles from the sun,

EVERY farmer should have now decided on what field to sow this or the particular crop. He now only awaits fine weather and a dry soil to commence operations. In the mean time there is work enough to do. Ploughs, harrows, whippetrees, clevises, harness, &c., should be examined, and if repairs are needed, they should be made before the busy season commences. Seed, wheat, barley, oats, timothy, clover, &c., should be procured now; and if it is intended to use guano, or other artificial fertilizers, the sooner it is in the barn and crushed ready for sowing the better. Too many neglect all preparations for their spring work, and when the fine weather comes, having everything to do in a few weeks, they are in too great a hurry to do anything well. They must flop over a furrow 16 inches wide, scratch it a little with a harrow, sow the seed, and trust to "good luck" and a virgin soil for a harvest. It is undoubtedly desirable to plough as much as possible in a day, yet we are far from being convinced that it would not be better to plough an acre narrow and well, than to turn over two acres in wide furrows.

This planet is of a slight ruddy colour, and appears about the size of a star of the eighth magnitude, and is consequently invisible to the naked eye.

"How does deep ploughing improve the soil?" asks an inquiring farmer. The simple answer is, by increasing its depth. "But," says the inquirer, "if I plough deep I shall turn up the clay and inert earth that contain no nourishment for plants." "Well, if clay and inert earth, containing no nourishment, lie so near the sun's face as to be within reach of your deepest working plough, they ought to be turned up and exposed to the influence of sun, air, frost, rain, snow, and manure, that they may become rich." "But," says the inquirer, (it is strange how many "but's" such people can find for use on such occasions,) "it would require too much hard work and too long a time to do this, would it not?" That depends upon whether you would prefer five dollars profit per acre now, and forever hereafter, to two or three dollars now, this year and the next, and ten or twenty dollars per acre hereafter. And so with seeding—farmers, as well as other people, like to make good bargains. Some of the worst bargains they make is with themselves—for example—to save five dollars of seed they lose twenty dollars of hay or pasture.

The planet PALLAS revolves around the sun at the mean distance of 263 millions of miles, and finishes its revolution in 1681 days, 17 hours, which is within a day of the time of the revolution of Ceres. Its distance is likewise nearly the same as that planet, and the circumference of its orbit will also be nearly the same. It presents a ruddy aspect but less so than that of Ceres—it is likewise surrounded with a nebulosity. The eccentricity of the orbit of Pallas is greater than that of any of the other planets, which is no less than 64,516,000 miles, so that this planet is 129 millions of miles nearer the sun in one part of its orbit than it is at the opposite extremity. Its greatest distance from the sun is 327,437,000 miles, and its least distance only 198,404,000 miles. Of course its rate of motion in its orbit must

KEEPING roads in good repair is generally conceded an object of much importance so long as men merely talk about the matter; but it seems to be otherwise when they are called upon to work; if the reluctance, indifference, shirking and dislike to that duty upon the public highways, may be taken as indications of the real state of sentiment existing on the subject. The indifference which many display in regard to keeping roads in good repair, and their unwillingness to do their proportion of work upon the public highways, have often been matters of surprise. For months and months farmers have been seen plunging through rough, racking and muddy places, with injury to waggons and harness, when a very little work would have removed the whole difficulty and the cause of it. But then others would have been benefited by their work as well as themselves, and therefore the ugly obstruction stands unrepaired for months to the disgrace and inconvenience of a whole neighbourhood, and especially of him who lives close by it, but it is submitted to for months just because some others would have received a little benefit, even though they would have secured to themselves many times more.

The greatest enemy of Fruit culture is the caterpillar—the canker worm—the borer—the grub—the bark louse—the black knot—the fire fly—the yellow—the curculio. The caterpillar sometimes strips whole orchards of their leaves, and for that year puts an end to the crop. But there is another enemy, greater by far than any one of these, if not than the whole list put together. This is a certain animal which the ancient philosopher singularly described as "a two-legged animal without feathers," the great epicure, Dr. Johnson, as "the only animal that cooks its victuals," and zoologists under the scientific name *Homo sapiens* MAN (under which general head boys also are included), is the greatest enemy that fruit trees have to contend with. The first thing he usually does, when he procures young trees, is to crowd them into a small hole in a hard soil, which mixed with sods, is thrown in among the roots and stamped hard with the foot. They are not unfrequently choked and killed the first year by sowing grain crops about them. He next "trims" them up without regard to form but a misshapen one.

of harmony, which we might suppose originally to have characterised the arrangement of the solar system.—In the first place, their orbits have a much greater degree of inclination to the ecliptic than those of the old planets; the orbits are in general more eccentric, and several of them cross each other. Another peculiarity is that they revolve nearly at the same mean distances from the sun, and perform their revolutions in nearly the same periods, and are all much smaller than the other planets. The anomalies and peculiarities of these bodies—so very different from the order and arrangement of the older planets—open a wide field for reflection and speculation.

As a general thing farmers do not provide themselves with good gardens. The excuse for this neglect is generally they have not time to attend to such small matters. The interests of the farmer, the comfort of his family, the good condition and health of his whole household, require a garden on every farm in this country. After a winter's diet on solid and generally stale animal food, the human constitution requires the detergent operations of a vegetable and fruit diet; and as a general rule no one can dispense with safety. Besides this, the natural appetite calls for it, and there are few pleasures that may be so safely and even beneficially indulged in. In the latter part of winter and early spring, measures should be taken to secure early vegetables of all kinds capable of early cultivation. When early potatoes, beans, cabbages, cucumbers, turnips, green corn, lettuce, radishes, &c., are in season and none of these luxuries then to be found on the table, nothing but *blue beef*, salt pork, and beans or potatoes of winter, the life of the farmer is not to be envied, nor his family their enjoyments.

TOBACCO, for destroying insects on trees and plants, is applied in various ways. The most common is to form a strong decoction in a tub or basin, with enough hot water to cover it, and let it stand some days. If strong enough it will destroy plant lice, and other small insects which infest fruit trees. It often fails for want of sufficient strength. A mixture of a small quantity of starch in solution, will add to its efficacy without increasing in any degree the danger to the trees. A mixture with it of a solution of soap adds to its effect, but if the soap be strong, it proves in some cases injurious to the young foliage. Tobacco, being a vegetable poison, will not do injury, however strong it may be. Small trees may be bent over and dip into the solution; it may be applied to larger trees by a showering syringe. Smoke from burning tobacco may be applied to plants by means of a fumigator.

evolves round the sun at the distance of 247,000,000 miles. In its distance and period of revolution, Astrea agrees most nearly with Vesta; in inclination, with Vesta. The planet Hesper was discovered in 1847. This body is considered as belonging to the smaller planets between Mars, and Jupiter. This planet comes between Vesta and Astrea. The planet Iris was discovered in 1847, about six weeks after that of Hebe. The planet Flora was discovered soon after that of Iris. Since the epoch of discovery, the brightness of this planet has considerably increased, and now equals that of a star of the eighth magnitude. From the above it appears that three new primary planets have been brought to light during the year 1847, and in the space of less than four months. It is remarkable, too, that they all belong to that class of comparatively small bodies—sometimes called



MUCH has been written on the subject of preparing meat, in the best possible manner for domestic purposes, previous to placing it in the smoke house; but little or nothing of the manner of smoking it. The best, most effectual, cheapest and neatest manner of smoking meat, is to place a shovel of live coals in an old pan, or some low dish, and lay on them a few sugar maple chips—dry ones are the best, for it requires too much fire to use green ones. No other wood will produce so sweet smoke as sugar maple; and the coals of it will keep alive as long, or longer, than the coals of other wood. In the absence of chips, corn cobs are nearly as good—three or four laid on a few coals will produce smoke sufficient to fill an ordinary smoke house. As a substitute for a smoke house, use a molasses hogshead, covered with boards on the top, and a hole cut in the side near the bottom, large enough to admit a pan of coals, with a cob or two, or a few small chips. Thus avoiding all danger of setting fire to the smoke house, and consuming meat and all. It is not necessary that the smoke be driven in, by heating the smoke house like Nebuchadnezzar's furnace, seven times hotter than it ought to be heated.

planet, was that planet inhabited? At what period did the disruption take place? And, if inhabited, what was the fate of its inhabitants? Were they entirely destroyed by the catastrophe? or did the inhabitants of the different fragments fly off along with that portion of the original planet which they occupied? are these bodies still inhabited? or, are they flying like shattered masses through the voids of space? And if so, are they ever again to be re-peopled? answers to such enquiries cannot be expected while we remain in the present state.

If we do not admit the hypotheses of a large planet having been disrupted, it is, on the other hand, very difficult to account for the present position, motions, and other phenomena of these bodies, so

A modern writer well remarks that "a deep soil is better than a shallow one, because it furnishes a more extensive feeding ground for the roots of cultivated crops." The soil may be deepened by thoroughly underdraining it. With no further working, save the operation of continued draining, it will in time become deep and mellow. It does this from three causes: *First*, the drains allow the surplus water to filter rapidly away through the soil, instead of remaining a long time just below the surface, hardening, and in a manner, puddling the soil. *Second*, if the soil is clayey, drying it by drainage instead of evaporation, causes it to shrink or crack, thus tending to its pulverization. And *third*, into the cracks thus formed, surface mould is washed, which not only keeps the clay from again uniting, but invites the roots of plants to follow the vegetable food thus supplied, thus increasing the pulverization until, in the course of time, it becomes equal to that of the drainage itself. A more rapid method of deepening the soil is by the use of the subsoil plough, or by deep culture with any implement adapted to the purpose.

very different from the harmony, proportion, and order which characterize all the other arrangements of the solar system. As already stated, they are nearly at the same distances from the sun, and perform their revolutions nearly in the same periods; their orbits are more eccentric, and have a much greater degree of inclination than those of the other planets; and, what is very singular and unaccountable, *their orbits cross each other*. Whatever view we may take of these anomalous orbs, there appears to us something inexplicable, mysterious, and incomprehensible. We may, however, rest assured that their present state, whatever it may be, is in full accordance with the wisdom, rectitude, and benevolence of the Supreme Governor of the universe.

Made on the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill, when vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an outpost.

For 1 square rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

" 2 Do. 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 3 Do. 2 balls close up, one out and one in.

" 4 Do. 2 balls separated, and 1 close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do. a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.

" 6 Do. a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

" 7 Do. a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do. a pendant under two balls close on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 9 Do. a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 10 Do. a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted at the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When sailing vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:—

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard, a second class Packet or Merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Two lanterns, one *red* and the other *white*, are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

The *red* lantern is always shown at the end of the yard arm, and the *white* one at the inner halliard, E. or W., according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

DOMINION OF CANADA.

THE Parliament of the Dominion consists of the Queen, a Senate of 72 members appointed by the Queen for life, and a House of Commons of 181 members chosen by the people. The number of Senators is fixed (except that six additional Senators may be appointed), that of members of the House of Commons is to vary according to the population ascertained at each decennial census, Quebec retaining the present number. The Privy Council consists of 13 members.

The Local Legislature of the Province of Ontario consists of a Lieutenant-Governor appointed by the Privy Council of the Dominion, and one house only, of 82 members, called the Legislative Assembly. Term 4 years, unless sooner dissolved, session annual.

The Local Legislature of the Province of Quebec consists of a Lieutenant-Governor, appointed by the Privy Council, a Legislative Council of 24 members, and a Legislative Assembly of 65 members. Term, &c., same as Ontario.

The Local Legislature of the Province of Nova Scotia consists of a Lieutenant-Governor, appointed by the Privy Council, a Legislative Council of 21 members, and a Legislative Assembly of 38 members. Term, &c., same as Ontario and Quebec.

The Local Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick consists of a Lieutenant-Governor, appointed by the Privy Council, a Legislative Council of 12 members, and a Legislative Assembly of 37 members. Term, &c., same as Ontario, Quebec and Nova Scotia.

If to this is added the area of Prince Edward Island, 2,100 square miles; Newfoundland 40,200 square miles; British Columbia, including Vancouver's Island, 240,000 square miles; and Labrador, the Hudson's Bay and North West Territories, say 2,750,000 square miles, there will be found a total for British North America of 3,389,345 square miles.

By the Act of Union there is to be paid yearly by Canada to—

And an annual grant to each Province equal to 30 cents per head of the population as ascertained by the census of 1861, and in the case of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, by each subsequent decennial census until the population of each amounts to 400,000 souls, at which rate such grants shall thereafter remain.

Canada becomes liable for the debts and liabilities of each Province existing at the Union—and the annual interest on such public debts to form the second charge on the consolidated revenue fund of Canada.

By the Act of the Union of the Provinces it is declared that the exclusive Legislative Authority of the Parliament of the Dominion extends to all matters coming within the classes of subjects hereinafter enumerated:

1. The Public Debt and Property.
2. The Regulation of Trade and commerce.
3. The raising of money by any mode or system of taxation.
4. The borrowing of money on the Public credit.
5. Postal Service.
6. The Census and Statistics.
7. Militia, Military and Naval Service, and Defence.
8. The fixing of and providing for the salaries and allowances of Civil and other Officers of the Government of the Dominion.
9. Beacons, Bucys, Lighthouses and Sable Island.
10. Navigation and Shipping.
11. Quarantine, and the establishment and maintenance of Marine Hospitals.
12. Sea Coast and Inland Fisheries.
13. Ferries between a Province and a British or Foreign country, or between two Provinces.
14. Currency and Coinage.
15. Banking, Incorporation of Banks, and the issue of Paper Money.
16. Savings Banks.
17. Weights and Measures.
18. Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes.
19. Interest.
20. Legal Tender.
21. Bankruptcy and Insolvency.
22. Patents of Invention and discovery.
23. Copyrights.
24. Indians, and lands reserved for Indians.
25. Naturalization and Aliens.
26. Marriage and Divorce.
27. The Criminal Law, except the Constitution of Courts of Criminal jurisdiction, but including the procedure in Cri-

minal matters. 28. The establishment, maintenance and management of Penitentiaries. 29. Such classes of subjects as are expressly excepted in the enumeration of classes of subjects by the Act assigned exclusively to the Legislatures of the Provinces.

The exclusive power of the Provincial Legislatures is to make Laws in relation to matters coming within the following classes:

1. The amendment from time to time, notwithstanding anything in the Act, of the Constitution of the Province, except as regards the office of Lieutenant Governor. 2. Direct taxation within the Province in order to the raising of a Revenue for Provincial purposes. 3. The borrowing of money on the sole credit of the Province. 4. The establishment and tenure of Provincial Offices, and the appointments and payment of Provincial Officers. 5. The management and sale of the public lands belonging to the Province, and of the timber and wood thereon. 6. The establishment, maintenance and management of public and Reformatory Prisons in and for the Province. 7. The establishment, maintenance and management of Hospitals, Asylums, Charities, and Eleemosynary Institutions in and for the Province, other than Marine Hospitals. 8. Municipal Institutions in the Province. 9. Shop, Saloon, Tavern, Auctioneer, and other Licenses in order to the raising of a Revenue for Provincial, Local or Municipal purposes. 10. Local works and undertakings other than lines of Steam or other Ships, Railways, Canals, Telegraphs and other works and undertakings extending beyond the limits of the Province. 11. The Incorporation of Companies with Provincial objects. 12. The solemnization of marriage in the Province. 13. Property and Civil Rights in the Province. 14. The administration of Justice in the Province, including the Constitution, maintenance and organization of Provincial Courts, both of Civil and of Criminal Jurisdiction, and including procedure in Civil matters in those Courts. 15. The imposition of punishment by fine, penalty, or imprisonment for enforcing any law of the Province made in relation to any matter coming within any of the classes of subjects enumerated in this Section. 16. Generally all matters of a merely local or private nature in the Province.

In each Province the Legislature may exclusively make laws in relation to Education and Agriculture, subject to certain provisions.

The Governor General appoints the Judges of the Superior, District, and County Courts in each Province, except those of the Courts of Probate in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

The following Provincial Public Works and Property become the property of the Dominion:—

1. Canals with lands and water power connected therewith.
2. Public Harbours.
3. Light houses and Piers and Sable Island.
4. Steamboats, Dredges and public Vessels.
5. River and Lake improvements.
6. Railways and Railway stocks, mortgages and other debts due by Railway Companies.
7. Military Roads.

8. Custom Houses, Post Offices, and all other public buildings, except such as the Government of the Dominion appropriate for the use of the Provincial Legislatures and Governments.

9. Property transferred by the Imperial Government, and known as Ordnance property.

10. Armouries, Drill Sheds, Military Clothing and Munitions of war, and lands set apart for general public purposes.

The wisdom of Her Majesty Queen Victoria's selection of ORTAWA as the capital of the Dominion of Canada having been fully recognised, the sum of £75,000 was voted for the erection of a Parliament House, competition invited, and a premium of \$1,000 offered for the best design not to exceed that amount, and although the design of the successful architects by many was considered as too costly, responsible contractors were found who tendered within the government vote. Upon examining the spot selected for the erection, formerly known as Barrack Hill, it was found from the inequality of the ground, immense excavations were necessary, which made in solid rock, added enormously to the original cost, and could not have been foreseen by architects or builders. The government finding no provision for this work in the grant, and fearing it would cost a large portion of the original sum voted, stopped the works, and for some considerable time there was no progress. A commission of inquiry was appointed, fresh contracts were signed, and the whole of the works placed under the superintendence of Mr. Fuller, under whose management the present highly creditable structures have been reared. The corner stone was laid with great ceremony by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in September, 1860, on which occasion the rejoicings partook of the nature of the place, the lumber arches and men being a novelty to most of its visitors, bullocks and sheep were roasted whole upon the government grounds and all comers were feasted. The site of these buildings has been very happily selected in the most elevated part of the city, they consist of the Parliament and two Departmental Buildings, forming three sides of a large square, facing the city, and from their position overlooking most of the houses. In the rear of the Parliament Building the rock descends almost perpendicularly to the river Ottawa, from here the view is truly magnificent, and cannot be surpassed on this continent nor in Europe. The broad river is in itself a beautiful object, but the vast extent of distant forest and hill completely absorbs every attention. From this point the Chaudiere Falls are distinctly

seen, and by some considered more romantic than those of Niagara ; beyond can be traced the island dotted rapids of the Upper Ottawa. This river must always be interesting on account of its slides, booms, and distinctive race of lumbermen, it is only seen, however, to its full advantage in the spring of the year, with high water, crowded with rafts. The group of buildings form a most picturesque object from every approach to the city, and can be seen at a great distance. The Parliament Building forms the head of the square, and has more architectural pretensions than the Departmental Buildings ; they are all in the Italian Gothic style, acknowledged at the present time as that best adapted to the requirements of a northern climate, and are of stone found in the vicinity, which is of very fine quality, two colours are used, the principal part being a warm tint, set off with lighter dressings, there is no unnecessary ornamentation, but from the nature of the materials used, the building has a rich and ornate appearance due to the knowledge of the contractor in leaving the stories undressed, and thereby reflecting the light and giving a sparkling effect in the sun. The Parliament Building is about 475 feet in length, and irregular height ; the body of the building is about 40 feet high, with slanting roofs ; it contains the halls for the Senate and House of Commons, with numerous offices, behind which is the Library, built in a circular form, capable of containing 300,000 volumes. The floors of this, as well as of the Departmental Buildings, are made of concrete, thus perfectly fire proof ; an invention lately adopted in Europe. In the internal arrangement nothing appears to have been spared to make the building as perfect as possible. The wants of the government and its officials have been most carefully studied. Great care has been given to heating, lighting and ventilation ; and although there are immense boilers for warming thoroughly the whole buildings, grates have been provided in every room. When the grounds in front of the buildings are laid out in terraces, with fountains, &c., and all is completed, the beauty of the situation, combined with the elegance of the buildings, will enable the capital of the Dominion of Canada to compare with any in the world.

LAND MAI LS.

Letters posted in NOVA SCOTIA, for any place within the Province, if *prepaid*, 5 cents; if *not prepaid*, 7 cents. Letters mailed for delivery within the County 2 cents; if *not prepaid* 7 cents. Letters pre-paid may be sent from one Way office to another, if unpaid they will be sent to the nearest Post Office, and taxed 7 cents.

Letters to QUEBEC, ONTARIO and NEW BRUNSWICK, 5 cents—*prepayment optional*. Letters to PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 5 cents, *must be prepaid*; if wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded and taxed 5 cents in addition to the postage. Letters for the UNITED STATES, (except Oregon and California) 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents—*must be prepaid*.

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments, are exempt from prepayment.

Registered letters for the Provincial Public Departments and the Military Departments, addressed to HALIFAX, can be sent without prepayment of postage or registry fee.

REGISTRATION.—Letters for registry must be posted *half an hour* previous to the closing of the Mail by which they are to be sent. The postage as well as the Registration fee *must be prepaid*. The registration of a letter to any place in Nova Scotia, British North America, or the United States is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 8½ cents, to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents.

Registration is applicable to all descriptions of letters and parcels, whether they contain articles of value or not. Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a letter; but a registered letter can be traced when one unregistered cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A registered letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an unregistered letter against actual dishonesty on the part of the Post Office employees, a registered letter is incomparably more secure than an unregistered one—an unregistered letter leaves no trace behind it, whilst passing in the great stream of ordinary correspondence, though its presence as a money letter, and the nature of its contents, are to any person accustomed to handle letters, as manifest, as though the letter had been singled out, and marked by the registered stamp. If the consequences were limited to the mere risk of the loss of the money so sent, the senders of money in unregistered letters might reasonably urge, that if they choose to encounter the risk, they are free to do so; but higher considerations are involved, and the chance of loss to the careless remitter is really but the smallest part of the evil associated with the practice. The department has gone to a great deal of trouble and expense to ensure as far as it is possible, the sure and safe transmission of money by mail—the safest mode of remitting is by *money orders*,—where there are no money order offices, the *Registration system* is available.*

* Attention to the above remarks by those who are in the habit of sending money by mail is strongly recommended, and it is further suggested that letters containing money should invariably be secured with the best wax, and not by wafer, mucilage, or self-sealing envelope.

WOODILL, BROS., Importers of Drugs, Medicines, Seeds, Spices, Perfumery, Soaps, Brushes, Varnishes, Oils, Paints.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters *prepaid* by stamp dropped into the box during the night and up to 4.30 A. M. will be forwarded by the mails despatched the same morning.

Semi-daily Mail to and from Dartmouth, postage 2 cents. If unpaid 4 cents.

All letters are charged by weight irrespective of distance, and a uniform rate of postage of 5 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce has been established throughout British North America. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a *single letter*. If it exceeds the $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. it is charged double and so on according to weight. Ship letters 5 cents. Letters for Consignees, *free*.

Stamps to be affixed to letters or pamphlets on the upper right hand corner. Postmasters to stamp the name of the office and date *distinctly* on every letter.

PRINTED Books transmitted through the Province are charged one cent per oz. up to 48 ozs. Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews or Pamphlets, binding rollers for prints or maps not exceeding two feet in length, markers and every thing appertaining to such publications, are sent between Nova Scotia and the United Kingdom, and also between Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the British West Indies, at the following rates:—for a single volume not exceeding 4 ozs. 3d. sterling; above 4 ozs. and not exceeding 8 ozs. 6d. sterling; above 8 ozs. and not exceeding 1 pound 1s. sterling; and so on, adding 1s. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. *Must be prepaid*.

PERIODICALS, BRITISH OR FOREIGN, posted *within* the Province for delivery *within or without* the Province, two cents each number, *must be pre-paid*.—Those published in the Province, and all Agricultural reports, whether published in the Province, or elsewhere, pass *free*,—except Belcher's Farmer's Almanack.

BRITISH and COLONIAL NEWSPAPERS, and small religious periodicals, British or Foreign, posted *within or without* the Province, pass *free*. All other Newspapers are charged one cent each, if mailed *within* the Province; if mailed *without*, for delivery *within* the Province, the postage is collected on delivery. An exchange copy, of any Newspaper, addressed to a Publisher in Nova Scotia, passes *free*.

British re-prints of copyright works from the United States by Steamer, are taxed letter postage.

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars and other printed matter of like description, posted *within* the Province for any place *within or without* the same, one cent per oz. *Must be prepaid*.

All papers printed by order of the Imperial Parliament, or by Her Majesty's command, or by the Legislative Council or House of Assembly are transmitted by post, *within* the Province *free*.

No printed paper, whether newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other paper will be sent, either *free* or at a reduced rate of postage, unless it is sent, 1, Without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends. 2, No words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover, except the name and address of the sender and the party to whom sent. 3. No paper or thing to be enclosed with it. Where these conditions are not fulfilled the whole will be charged letter postage.

PARCEL POST.—The charge on Parcels, limited to places within the Province is if under 8 ozs. $1\frac{1}{2}$ cents; above 8 ozs. and under a pound, 25 cents; above 1 and not 2 pounds, 50 cents; above 2 but not 3 pounds, 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be sent, and must not exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, and six inches in thickness. *Must be prepaid.* The charge on parcels to New Brunswick, or Canada is, for a parcel under 8 oz. 25 cents; if more than 1 and not exceeding 2 pounds, 50 cts.; if more than 2 and not exceeding 3 lbs., 75 cents, beyond this weight no parcel can be sent.—Size same as above.—*Must be prepaid.*

PATTERN POST.—Patterns of Merchandise can be sent by post between Nova Scotia and Great Britain at the following rates:—for a packet not exceeding 4 oz. 7 cents; under $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. $1\frac{1}{2}$ cents; not exceeding 1 pound 25 cents; above 1 and not $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. $3\frac{1}{2}$ cents; above $1\frac{1}{2}$ and not 2 pounds, 50 cents; every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ pound $1\frac{1}{2}$ cents; no parcel to exceed 2 feet in length, breadth or depth. *Must be prepaid.*




