REPORT  
OF THE  
**Provincial Rifle Association of Nova Scotia.**  
FOR 1869.

---

THE Council of the Provincial Rifle Association beg to submit the following report.

They regret to say that there has been a large decrease in the numbers of members and competitors in comparison with former years, which is in a great measure owing to the change in our militia organization. The difficulty of obtaining rifles also prevented a great many from competing, as the arms had been all called in and only a very small number of Snider Enfields issued.

The Treasurer's account is herewith submitted shewing a balance in his hands of \$307.47 to the credit of the Association; there are however some accounts outstanding to the amount of \$100 which should be included in this year's expenses. A list of the winners of prizes at the annual match together with an analysis of each competition, has been prepared by the Secretary, from which it will be seen that there has been a decided improvement in the averages at the long ranges. In consequence of the reduction of the size of the bulls-eye at the short ranges, no comparison can be made.

The new method of keeping the registers, adopted by your Council at the last match was much approved of by the competitors and register keepers, and your Council were thereby enabled to declare the names of the winners very shortly after each competition was concluded.

Your Council regret to report that in consequence of the refusal of the Government to issue any rifles except to the

active militia, a large number of our old members who now belong to the reserve, will be unable to compete in future, and the county Associations will in all probability be broken up. The loss of so many members will be deeply felt, as a large portion of them have belonged to the Association since its organization, and took a lively interest in its welfare.

His Excellency Sir J. Young, Governor General of Canada, was pleased to present to this Association a handsome silver cup, for competition at the annual match, which was fired for at the long ranges, and won by Captain Piers.

The Association is also indebted to General Sir W. F. Williams for his valuable present of another gold watch and chain, in addition to that promised last year, which his absence from England prevented his sending before.

The challenge gold medal of the Association, having been won twice by Sergeant Walsh, has become his property, and it will be necessary to provide another before the annual match.

Your Council record with much pleasure their thanks to his Excellency Lieut.-General Sir H. Doyle, for his kindness in placing at their disposal, the services of a musketry instructor, and a sufficient number of non-commissioned officers and men to act as markers, and also for the use of the necessary tents. Their thanks are also due to L. Carvell, Esquire, Chief Superintendent of Railways, for free passes granted to the Council and competitors.

The meeting of the Dominion Association of Canada was to have been held in this Province in 1869, but at the instance of your Council it was postponed until another year; this course was deemed expedient, as in consequence of the incomplete organization of the active militia, and the difficulty of obtaining arms, the riflemen of this Province would have been very poorly represented.

Your Council cannot close their report without directing attention to the very unsatisfactory condition of the Bedford Range; the fences have all been removed, and it is now and

has been for the past year an open common; there appears to be no one in charge of it, and the butts and firing points are rapidly going to destruction. When the Minister of Militia was in Halifax last summer, your Council applied to him on the subject, and offered with the assistance of a small annual grant to keep the Range in proper order and open for the use of the local forces, but no notice of any kind was taken of their application.
