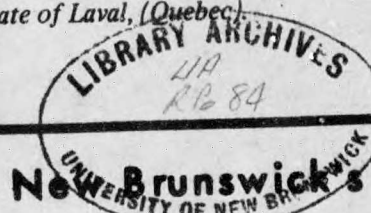

West wins in impressive fashion

They came here shouting the slogan "the West is the best". And then they went to work to prove it.

The Western Conference of the CWIAU swept to a resounding victory in the National Swimming and Diving Championships hosted by UNB last weekend. Along the way they amassed a total of 717 points - a comfortable margin over runner-up Ontario's 607 points. The Atlantic Conference was a distant third with 238 while Quebec was out of sight with 113.

The Smith sisters, Sue and Sandra, put on an outstanding display of swimming in leading the West to victory. The two University of Alberta students collected 6 wins between them as well as aiding their school's cause in winning both relay

events. Sue won three events the 50 yard butterfly, the 100 yard butterfly, the 200 yard individual medley, and was a member of both relay teams. Sandra took top honours in three events - the 200 yard freestyle, the 100 yard freestyle, and the 400 yard freestyle. She also swam the backstroke in the 400 yard medley relay as well as anchoring the 400 yard freestyle relay team.

Of the 16 events on the card the West accounted for 13 first place finishes. U of A alone were responsible for 10 of these - the six by the Smiths, the two relays and 2 by Glynis Thomas. The latter won the 200 yard breaststroke and the 400 yard individual medley. Kathy Rollo, of the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon, showed great form on the diving boards as she swept both the 1-metre and the 3-metre competitions. The last of the 13

victories was brought home by Rhonda Ross of UBC in the 100 yard breaststroke who just touched out Thomas.

Both Ontario victories were copped by Ann Walton of the University of Guelph. Ann won both the backstroke events - the 100 yard and the 200 yard - handily.

Janice Mattson of Acadia took first place in the only unaccounted-for event - the 50

yard freestyle. UNB's Debbie Prince was a star in her own right as she chased the Smith sisters to victory in three events. Her second place finishes in the 100 yard butterfly, the 200 yard individual medley, and the 100 yard freestyle were all outstanding efforts. She appeared to have the latter event won but was caught coasting into the final turn. Two other Mer-

maids placed as Suzanne Fitzgerald and Lynn Gray finished 5th and 6th respectively in the 400 yard freestyle.

There were many outstanding swimmers present at this meet. In addition to the awards given these people for each event, trophies were presented to the outstanding competitor from each division and the best overall diver. For the west

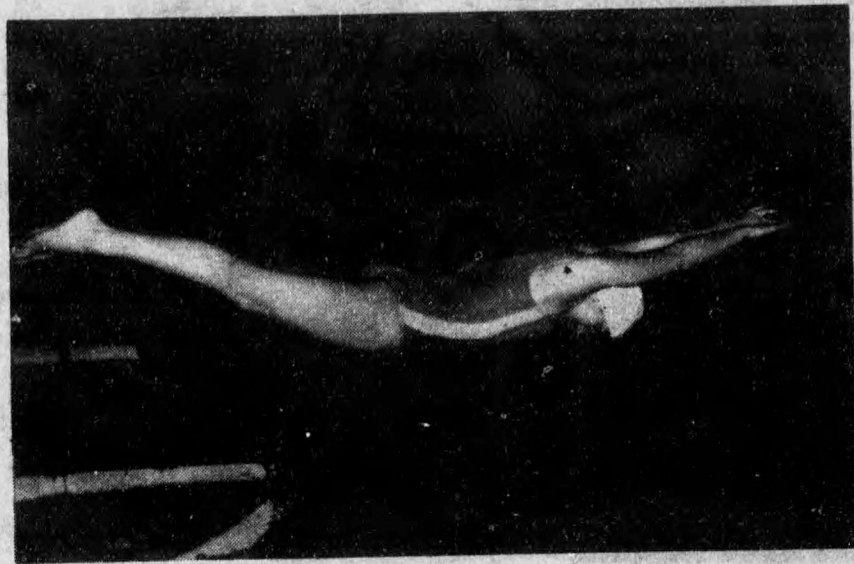

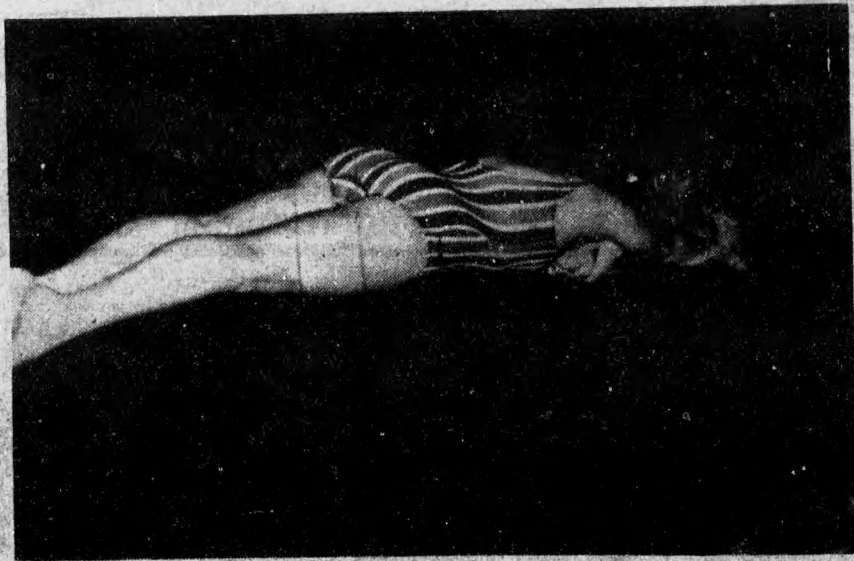

## U of A girls head list of new records

As last year was the first year of the CWIAU Swimming and Diving Championships, all the winning times were records. However, this year the swimmers had something to work on.

Of the 14 swimming events, new marks were set in 10. In one of these, Ann Walton set a new record in the 100 yard backstroke only to have it broken again by Sandra Smith

in the medley relay. Sandra set three other records while sister Sue established three new marks.

The other marks were set by Glynis Thomas, Ann Walton, and the U of A freestyle relay team. Debbie Prince of UNB bettered the old record in the 100 yard butterfly but it still was not enough for the victory.

Sandra Smith won the honour. For Ontario it was Walton while Diane Gate of Laval was the cream of the Quebec contingent. The winner of the Atlantic division award was a very popular choice - Debbie Prince. Kathy Rollo was easily the best diver in attendance.

The battle for the top university honours was very close as the University of Alberta edged out UBC by two points 267 to 265. The University of Toronto was far back in third place with 157 points. The top Maritime university was Acadia with 105, good enough for fifth place. UNB was close behind in sixth spot and 96 points.

Mrs. Mary Lou Wood, meet manager, should be given full credit for her efforts towards making this meet a successful one. She was ably assisted by Prof. Robert Stangrom, in charge of training and supervising all the officials; Miss Barb Pepperdene, documentation; and Mr. Amby Legere, hospitality.

The championships were well attended as the stands were full for the finals on both Friday and Saturday. Judging by the calibre of the competitors' performances and the closeness of some of the races, they appeared to enjoy themselves. The feeling seemed to be mutual as the swimmers had nothing but kind remarks for the manner in which the meet was run and UNB hospitality.
