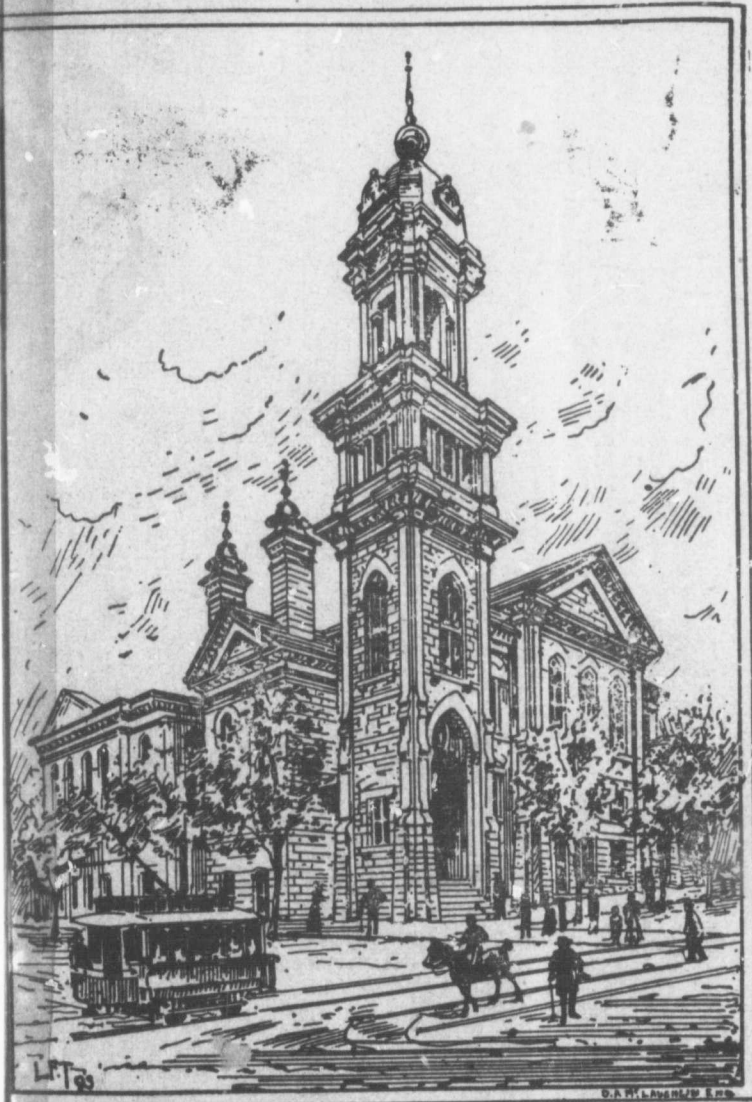

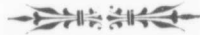

PASTOR'S ADDRESS.

TO THE CONGREGATION OF DOMINION CHURCH.

MY DEAR FRIENDS :—

I gladly take advantage of the issue of our Annual Report to address you in words of friendly greeting. I have completed the first year of my pastorate among you. SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Society has a membership of 83, who pay an annual fee of one dollar. Eight regular and three special meetings have been held.

The chief duty of the Society is to look after the internal comfort of the Parsonage. A Committee composed of 10 ladies was appointed for this purpose. Regular meetings have been held, and as far as possible everything necessary has been provided.

The Relief Committee is composed of 19 members, whose duty it is to look after the destitute. This work has been faithfully carried out. Regular meetings have been held, and each case carefully inquired into. At the beginning of the year the Committee asked for an appropriation from the Quarterly Official Board. The sum of \$150 was granted, to be sent to the Treasurer in monthly instalments. This amount was supplemented by some donations, which, with fuel and clothing, has been judiciously distributed.

The Visiting Committee is composed of 8 ladies, whose duty it is to look after and call upon sick members, as well as those who have lately come to the church. This has been attended to and many strangers made to feel more at home.

The Annual Supper was held on the evening of Thanksgiving Day, a lecture by the Pastor on the 13th of December, a Recital by Miss A. E. Paisley on February 2nd, an At Home on the 7th April and one on the 18th April.

Our Home Department has done good work, but ought to be more widely extended. It is a most helpful aid to intelligent, systematic Bible study ; is easily within the reach of every member of the congregation ; makes no heavy demands on any one ; and binds the Church and School more closely together. If you have not as yet inquired into it and do not understand its workings, let some officer of the School know that you would like information. To know its methods of work will almost certainly ensure your membership.

We are glad to be able to report a more prosperous condition of our finances than for many years past. The debt which has been our heavy burden for a long time has been changed into a small surplus. This, however, is not wholly a cause for rejoicing, since it has been accomplished only by such rigid economy that the work of the School has been hampered to a considerable extent.

The Library has suffered most severely ; large numbers of the books being wholly unfit for service. In order to make it even reasonably effective, at least \$200 will need to be expended for new books in the immediate future. Many other needed appliances for the School work have been denied in order that our debt might be wiped out.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Another milestone has been reached in the onward march of our society, and with it comes an opportunity to review the work which has been done during the year. Though the visible results are not great, and we regret that so little has been accomplished, yet we believe that the Master whom we serve will not let our efforts prove fruitless. Our meetings have been held regularly and have been well attended. To create a greater desire for the higher life, the life hid with Christ in God, is the chief aim of our meeting together.

The Missionary department is a live one and the members' interest in it is kept up most effectually by discussion of Missionary topics and the reading of letters from our native teacher in Japan (Mr. Watanabe). The Society feel encouraged to support Mr. Watanabe in his work another year.

Two very profitable evenings were furnished by the Literary Department, the first a lecture given by Rev. J. E. Lancely, of Toronto, and the second a paper on "The Early Days of Ottawa" by Miss G. Kenny, B. A.

The Social Department has been chiefly active in distributing flowers to the sick. On Good Friday and Easter Sunday flowers were also given to the patients in the Hospitals. A number of the members also visited the old Women's Home at Xmas, giving to each of the inmates some small gift and afterwards holding a song service to brighten their day.

Of the help and inspiration gained in our meetings we need not speak here, but we covet earnestly an interest in your prayers and pray that God will guide and use our humble efforts this year for His glory.

There were eleven Communion Services, at each of which an opportunity was afforded the members to contribute to the fund. The number of communicants at all but three of these services (held on very stormy days) was unusually large and the offerings were liberal. These generous givings, though there were no special Christmas Offertory, (Christmas falling on Sunday) enabled the dispensers of the moneys to extend timely help in every known case of distress or need. Two young children (see last report) who had been removed from bad influences and supported by the Church in the Salvation Army Rescue Home, were during the year adopted into comfortable homes and will no longer need assistance from this fund. Several times in the very warm days a short trip over the Electric Railways in the city or country was arranged for some weary mother and her young children, and carried out to their delight. Usual demands for aid came from the poor families connected with the congregation—to these the Ladies' Aid Relief Committee granted groceries, clothing, sometimes helping to pay the rent, &c. For their kind assistance in these necessary but often painful duties, the Quarterly Official Board passed a cordial vote of thanks, thus expressing the appreciation in which the work of the Ladies is held by the Church. Transient help in the very severe weather of last winter was often asked for. In every instance small sums were donated and thankfully received.
