The Bishop has appointed the Rev. Arthur Henry Baldwin, M.A., Rector of All Saints', Toronto, and the Rev. Charles Leycester Ingles, M.A., Rector of St. Mark's, Farkdale, to be Canons of St Alban's Cathedral.

A general Ordination was held in the Cathedral on Sunday, 18th December, when the Rev. Henry Richardson Young was ordained Deacon, and Revs. Herbert Thomas Archbold and James Nankivell were advanced to the Priesthood.

Mrs. C. C. Robinson has carved and presented to the Cathedral an oak pedestal for the altar cross.

Some of the offertory envelopes for 1905 have, unfortunately, been very badly numbered, the red figures in some cases being almost illegible. It would be well for those who have such defective envelopes to write upon them either the correct number or the name of the donor.

PAROCHIAL MISSIONARY COLLECTIONS.

REPORT OF YEAR FROM DEC. 1903
 TO DEC. 1904.

This work has been undertaken by the collectors whose names are given in the list of workers. House-to-house collections have been made monthly. In addition to this, the envelope system has been introduced, and some subscribers find it more convenient to give in this way. Six new collectors have been appointed during the year, and there are now nineteen envelope contributors.

It has been a satisfactory year, the balance sheet showing an increase of \$46.00 over that of last year.

The fine old Christmas Carols sung after Evensong on Christmas night, and repeated on the following Sunday evening, gave great satisfaction. They were beautifully rendered, and shewed evidence of careful preparation.

This system of contributing for the maintenance of public worship is far away the best known, and will be found most helpful to those who give conscientiously. Over one hundred families in the congregation are now using the Offertory Calendars.

The special envelopes for the Choir Boys' Christmas "squidge" were somewhat delayed this season, but we hope the response of the congregation to this very reasonable appeal will be generous and prompt. About \$30 is needed to make up the apportionment.
