Galt, the Financier.

At a Vidal meeting in Petrolia Village, a Mr. Galbraith "went fully into the monetary system of Mr. Galt, and finished by saying that Mr. Brown was an agitator, and Mr. Galt a statesman." Mr. Galt's grand financiering may be profitable to himself, but it is very unprofitable to the country at large. The public debt of Canada, under his manipulation, ran up from Twenty-nine Millions in 1854 to the awful sum of Sixty-seven Millions in 1862! But while the Galt-Cartier-Macdonald combination has nearly ruined the country by overwhelming it with debt, personally Mr. Galt has made a good thing of it. Shortly after his dismissal from the volunteer force for disloyalty, he entered the government poor as a church rat. He is now one of the wealthiest men in the country. His property, as might be expected from his leanings, is chiefly in Portland and other parts of the United States. We have no confidence in Galt as a Finance Minister.
