The 75 exhausted men gathered in groups on the flats for protection or lay on their faces on the floor. As the blazing furnace of logs was approached the heat became unbearable and the smoke was so blinding and stifling that the men were obliged to cover their mouths with cloths. Just opposite the millions of feet of burning logs there was a lurch, an ominous heaving and a shriek of despair as the train toppled over into the hell of fire beneath. Every survivor will bear to his grave a mark of that awful moment. The cars caught fire like so many paper play-things and the men within, half blinded and scarcely realizing anything except that they were being roasted to death, struggled fearfully to regain the track, where safety lay for a time at least.

Superintendent Badger of the Sinnamahoning Valler road was in charge of the wreck, where he had evidently slowly burned to death. It is known that six others also miserably perished at once or died soon after and 30 others of the party were badly burned, many probably fatally.
