

"Regarding the water Department, considering the unsatisfactory condition of the works, I have concluded as far as practicable to devote my special attention to this branch of the public service to the exclusion of all minor matters, which I think can be safely entrusted to my principal assistants, at least for the present. It is therefore with considerable regret that I find myself compelled to report that Mr. Hamilton's services can be dispensed with, and I have consequently given him notice that his office will be abolished on May 31 next. If I should find my time too much taxed to devote proper attention to the works, which I almost anticipate, it may become necessary to appoint an assistant engineer to take the general charge of the details of this department. Regarding this department generally, I may add that after the recommendations I have already made are carried into effect further changes and reductions in the staff can be effected without in any way impairing the efficiency of the service."

The Chairman was most bitter in his denunciation of measures which to ensure their success had to be sprung upon a meeting in this fashion. Although chairman of the committee he had not received the slightest intimation of the chaser which was to follow so close on the heels of Saturday's report. He pointed out that if the dismissal of Mr. Hamilton meant the engagement of an assistant engineer at a salary of about \$3600 per annum, there could hardly be a foundation for the plea of occommy which was advanced.

He then stated that on Saturday he learned that Mr. Hamilton's salary was to be reduced and offered no objection, but this sudden change in policy was a different thing entirely. Then followed a broad insinuation that the fine Italian hand of His Worship the Mayor could be discerned as tracing out the course of action which had been adopted. The Mayor defended the City Engineer in his recommendation and thought that the new policy was a good one.

In the report it was further recommended that the salaries
