Nay, nay—and the answer blent


In chorus is southward sent:

On the men of the Northern Zone?”






*"Our lives are as free as the breezes that blow

*Dispatch from the front April 2nd, 1902.—In the battle of Hart's River, while the Boers were following up a bold attack on the 28th Mounted Infantry, they were met with a heavy fire from the Canadians, who, holding a point in advance and across the front of the semicircle, poured volleys into them at a distance of 200 yards. Private Charles Napier Evans, of Port Hope, Ontario, although mortally wounded, kept in the thick of the fight and after firing all the ammunition in his bandoller broke his rifle. He died on the field.*
