





Introductory.

BETWEEN four and five years ago the Editor of the GENEALOGIST began, at the solicitation of friends, the work of collecting information, personal and genealogical, regarding the families of U. E. Loyalists and other pioneer settlers, by whom Ontario has been transformed from an uninhabited wilderness to a prosperous province, and of whom have been many of the persons whose names are familiar to us in our public history. It was, and is, considered most desirable that as much of such information as it is possible to secure should be recorded for the use of future generations before it passes out of memory, as indeed much of it has already done which would have been of great interest and value to us at the pre-

sent day if it had been preserved. "Many things are lost to us which were known to our grandfathers, and our grandchildren will search in vain for things which to us are most familiar." Some of the result of that work has been published in "Ontarian Families," of which two volumes have been issued. Experience, however, has shown that the usefulness of that publication has been greatly impaired by its unavoidable costliness, and it has therefore been decided to continue the work, putting forth the results in an inexpensive form, the publishers placing the subscription price at a figure which will bring it within the reach of everyone, and relying upon receiving sufficient support to enable the venture to be carried on successfully. It is obvious that a numerous list of subscribers is necessary to enable this to be done. We especially solicit the assistance of the members of the various historical and similar societies which exist among us, in furthering this important and interesting branch of the objects which they seek to promote.

It is not only in building up a subscription list that we ask for co-operation from our friends, but in the furnishing of material also, for while there is much already available, the object of our enterprise will be better attained if those who can furnish information, regarding their own families or other vise, will place it at our disposal.

Furthermore, it is not proposed that our pages shall be devoted only to the production of genealogies, but we will seek to add other matters pertinent to our general purpose, which may be of interest to our readers.

Contributions of matter, and correspondence, are therefore invited.

Both with regard to genealogies printed in "Ontarian Families" and those which may appear in the GENEALOGIST, the editor will at all times be pleased to receive further particulars, and correction of any errors which may happen to be discovered, so that the same may be noted in a future number.

This number contains an article on the family of McCarthy, which had been partly prepared for the second volume of Ontarian Families, but not being completed in time, could not be inserted in it. A coloured plate having been prepared to accompany it is now used with it as here printed, but intending subscribers will please understand that its use is exceptional, and that such plates cannot form a feature of the GENEALOGIST.

Royal Descents.

MUCH amusement has been created by the recent formation in New York and Chicago of Associations of persons of Royal descent, or who claim that supposed honour. Associations more or less regularly constituted have frequently been formed in England and Canada to commemorate some important historical event in which the members or their fore-fathers have taken part, and such foregatherings are usually of a proper and laudable character; but the assembling of a coterie of persons who are, or are supposed to be, descendants of Royal personages, is a different thing. There may of course be some undisclosed reason or purpose, the attainment of which is sought for in this manner, and which if known might put a different complexion upon the affair, but if, as is more than likely, there is no special purpose, it follows that the only reason for such societies is one which is simply snobbish and nothing more—a claim, without warrant, to superiority over others. Royal descent manifestly confers no advantage of person, means or manners, and can hardly be regarded even as a sentimental distinction, for the fact is that the descendants of kings are a vast multitude; those of them among English speaking people, whose descent is known and plainly traceable, number many thousands, and are in every grade of society, from the highest to the lowest; some are sure to be found in every considerable collection of people. There are known to be a dozen or more families of such descent in Toronto, and a little enquiry would probably discover as many more.

McCarthy, OF BARRIE.

THE McCarthys are an Irish family of great antiquity, having been in ancient times a powerful sept of Munster. Of this family was

D'Alton McCarthy, who m. Martha dau. of Col. Bucknall, and had issue eleven sons and daus., of whom were Charles, the eldest, b. 1760, and

Bucknall, youngest, b. 1775, Barrister-at-law, of Dublin, who m. Anne, b. 1776, dau. of Walter Hussey Burgh, Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer in Ireland, and had issue, viz.:

D'Alton (only son), b. 14 June 1805, d. 15 Nov. 1873, Barrister-at-law, who came to Canada in June 1847, and settled at Barrie; m. 1831 Charlesina-Hope, b. 21 Sept. 1806, d. 14 Feb. 1898, dau. of Thomas-Richard Manners, W.S., of Edinburgh, Sco. [Crest: *A Peacock*. Motto: *Pour y parvenir*], and had issue, viz.:

1.—Bucknall-Henry, b. 7 April 1835, who went to sea. and d. in Melbourne, Australia in 1856, unm.


