The bank statements for the morth of November polnt out very distlactis the mecesslty for caution In business transactions，already Insisted on br conmenvative mulnemen，mentl nob

times, as the final status! of the American and our own tarifts is decided. From bur geographical position tho Unlted States is naturally our largest supplier; and, when the tarlift cond. thomst are favorable, is alsoi our largest customer. The present uncertainty as to the tariffs of woth countries, then, has produced what may we termed practically a sitagnation in business on both sldes of the line. In both countrles merchants and manufacturers leel that a hand-to-mouth policy is far the saiest one at the present moment, and aro endeavoring to shorten sall in view of any prospect of bad weather ahead. When: once it is known in what shape the Wilson Bill will finally become law; and when once the extent of the projected tariff reform at Ottawa is announced to the country, trude will revive; but at present a "short-sighted" policy Is far the best, and the manufacturer who is making aheud is runuing a very daugerous risk.
This condition of affalrs is clearly indicated in the circulation, which for tha past month fell over $\$ 4,000,000$ uuder that of November, 1892. Of course much of thls is due to the fact that the harvest this jear was moved extremely early owling to the small yield of wheat in the Northwest, and that the low prices pulling forced, the farmers to market their crops at once in order to get money to meet their most pressing requirements. $r$ Considering that it takes 14 Aushels of wheat per acre at 42 cents to cultipate the land, and that, lay the Brandon distrlet, the crop only averaged $\theta$ bushels par acre, the poshthon of the Northwest farmer can ive casily imagined. Atter the mortgages and mplement men are pald there is ubsolutely mothlig left for the store keeper, ma, naturally he cannot pay the wholesalers. In fact certain lorge Wholeghe olothic houses in thl city,
who have piactically received nothlug fom the Northwest during the gear, are debatiang as to whether to with. draw thele travellers from that district or to supply thelr customers with new etocks of clothing on the strength of thext year's crop.
Fortunately Ontayp and Quebee are lan fairly good shape. Oue of the lead. lug Danks reports that 95 per cent. of the implementi notes falling due in these two provinces were pald on the due date; which is a very lail indication of the position of the farmer. The storebeceper has naturally benelited by this condition of affalrs, and a patient and Judicious contraction until the present perlod of uncertalinty is passed whl place the trade of Doth proviuces on a solld and substantial basis.
The lucrease of $\$ 857,000$ in deposits alter botice, and of $\$ 400,000$ in deposits on demand, emphaslzes the spirit of caution that is abroad. People are alrald to venture thelr money in new enterprises, and prefer to hand it over to the banks for safekeping. As the banks are payiur $31-2$ to 4 per cent. lor these deposits, and rates for good call loans run from 1 to $21-2$ per cent. In New York, and from $21-2$ to 25.8 in London, there is pot much money in them foy our fluanclal lastitutions: The limit of legitimato discount ini this country lhas been reached. If a banker desires to push fusiness he must resort to renewals or accomodation paper and in euch of these lines the risk is too great. Hence the volume of current loans 'and discounts in Canada has fallen off pearly $\$ 3,000,000$, and the vol. ume of mones left abroad for invest ment Has increased $\$ 2,300,000$. On every mand there is a disposition to zather, curtail than extend business here, and thls will continue untll ouce the Itariff queation is set ut rest for a whle:
The paldnces due to banks in the

Uuited Klngdom practically balance those due from them to thls country. They are $\$ 4,419,038$, as against $\$ 4,827$. 660 in favor of Canada. Cotion mills may close down, and woollen maminetures may frow nervous over the tariff; but the mannfacture of framutent ereditors remainst as brisk as ever. from al business situdpoint, the manfacture of logus ereditors may be divided fite three elasses- the erude the methodical, and the artistle. The firsa is, as its mame implies. the 'lowest grade fin tie art. It consists simply in ranking a friend or relative on the esfate for money leat. All that it re. quites is an indurated conseience and a talent for perjiny on woth sides. Buth this mothod is apt to uroise suspicion among the creditors, and to mintato against the success of the makernit when he wants to etart in bushess agan. The second method is say bettek. Like the first it requires an acconphes; but then, in place of a cumby relative, or a mervous wife, the accomplice is a bustiness hm" of
more or less reputable standing. In thise ease the debtor receives a certain proportion of goods from the fraudunont creditor and, in relurn, sigus notes for thee or four times their value. The accomplice firm rank as the principal creditors of the tbankrupt. The composition they ateept is usually acanuesced in also by the genaine eredt-pis-who argue that, if the flrm who have apparently most at stake feel that they can do $n 0$ better, what is the use of their holding out? By this method wo shir remalus upon the bablarupt. Sthe frandulent credtor is paid in full, and the others have the pleasure of taking so much off theitr own per-centages in order to do so.
The thisd, or artistic method, requibes that both flrms engaged in the deal shath fail together, aiter they have endorsed as mueli accommodation paper for each other as the banke and the mote sinvers can bo Inducel to discount. Tlicy then rank for the full amount on etch oblers estates as croditors, Bun onch recive dividends at the expense of the legitimate victims. This ls the most poitable, as wol as
the most honopmble, method of manufuecturlug creditors; because each lixm catn tate the higl ; moral ground that their own failure-was forced upon them by the insolvency of the other, and hence: thein eliaracter for busliness capubility escapes without a smlich from thelr suspension and may-posslbly be even enhauced by its occurreuce: At the same time bach ranks as the principal creditor of the other, and thus the wo can consummate a deal that will be to their mutual advautage while the unfortunate innocent outside creditor is compelled to lose hls hardearned money for the benefit of those "inside the swim."
This tmay be ealled a rough sketeh of the principal methods of manufacturing ereditors. That they are subject to many modifications goes without say. ing. The force of circumstances of ten invotves minor changes or accentur atlons. But the principle remains the stame. It la the placing, for the bencfit of the bunkrupt, of a fraudulent ereditor on his liablity sheat whose shate must we contributed by the genulne ones. It is a deliberate robbery of the Monest huerehant, and above all it is an lajury to trade becanse it cuables a dishonest man to conthue fu business upon money practically contributed ly his creditors.

## SUGAR PROSPEOTS.

The probable beet crop, and the quantity of beet sugar to be manufactured, is a tople of ammal interest in trade circles and in large speculative centres, all over the wortd. The value of beet singar is now more fully recognized, and jess secreey is maintained with regard to stocks, and the quantily, yoing into consumption.
The use of the beell has done much to reduce the price of the refined articlo, and prejudice is npt tor melt away rapday before such a convineing argument as lower cost, especially if times are hard. In Austria-Hungary 191 out of 214 factories, or about 90 per cept of the total number, sent in their replles. The data obtahed from German manufactarers point to a production slightly less than last year, wat the yield in sugar is nemply i per cent higher. France fill produce about the same as a year ago. Russia's beet crop of 1802 was a failure, and there is no doube that this year's sugar production will ennble this country tolexport considerable quantities sugar after a temporarymet importation, durlag the
past season. The area unider sugar beets is considerably: enlarged being 815;309 :acres as against $688,424 \ln 1892$. The beet crop is estimated iat: 14,433 libs per acre making a total of about $11,770,000,000$ lhs. The : yield of augar being about 11 per cent, the total productionj of sugar - In Russla for 1893-94 is estimated at over $1,300,000,000 \mathrm{lbs}$. Belgium and the Netherlands will exceed last year's crop. The production in Denmaik, Sweden; and Spain, the mora important of the remaining sugar producing countries is estimafed to exceed that of last year by about $\$ 4,002,000$ tons. The whole of Europe is expected to produce $8,057,000$ liss of sugar, an increase over last yenr of $600,000,000$ nos. The estimates for 1893.94 are as follows:-Germany $2,865,980,000 \mathrm{lbs}$ : Austria-Hungary $1,719,588,000$ : Russia $1,322,760,000$, Prance $1,278,668,-$ 000: Belgium 462,066,000; Netherlands 165,345,000: other ;countrics 242,506,000.
Large sections of the United States would seem to be adapted to the cultivation of the sugar beet. Last year for the first time, a crop of sugar beets was, railsed from domestic seed under the most rigid scientific culture. The crop was highly satisfactory. Experimentsi will ise continued by the central Government in order to verify the opinlons which have been formed. It is not Hely that further official tests in Sorgium sugar will be made. Results are fully known and the field is open for individual enterprise. The estimated yield of Sorghum per acre is generally lower than that reported of latte years. The range is from 43 gallons per: acre in Colorado to 120 gallons in Southi Dakato. The cause of thls dimjulshed yield is to be, attributed to the widely prevailing drougit during the summer months, which was broken too latel to allow the crop' to recover from tsi low condition.
In Florida, Governinent experiments anve been made with the sugar cane. These seem to justify the expectation that fthe latitude and climate of the lower portion of that peniusula are adapted to the production of a cane that will compete successially with the Cuban varicty. Results are not fuliy satisfactory, and further experiments will determine whether certain supposed deficiencles in the soin, can be economleally supplied. With the remarkable development of the sugar bect in Europe, and possibilties of what may yet be achileved lin the United States,
sugaris:lhely to remaln $a$ cheap article of:consumption in Canada unless for some umexpected cause: 3t: should "be agalu called upon to bear the burden of taxation. Such a contingency, we trust. will not arise.

## RAILROAD FALLURES.

The year now drawing to its close wlll be a memorable one fil rallway cir. cles on this continent, for during liss periodmo less than 73 railroads, with a mileage of 81,878 miles! of track and issuing stock to the extent of $\$ 1,611,-$ 284,000 have ween declared insolvent.

This is a formidable showing. It . means that nearly one-fifth of all the railroads on the continent of North America are hopelessly bankrupt, and that a volume of stocks and bonds whose par value is $\$ 636,085,000$ and a funded debt of $\$ 975,249,000$ have been subjected to severe depreciation, if not rendered practically valueless. The mere phrinkage thus involved-even if the aoads should be alle to pay ten per cent of their liabilities onan averageforms a total of loss that it is difficult to grasp in its total siguificance, but whose effect on the national prosperity it is impossible to, overestimate.
Out of this total of 73 fasolvent rall. roads only a few can ascribe their present condition to dishonesty or mismanagement. The freat majorlty lanve been not only monestly directed, but have ween controlled by men of unusual Wuslanss angaoly and adminlstrative power. And yot the regult has been the same, : They have sunk under the weight of steadily lucreasing debt and constantly dhninishing ireight rates. The volume of traffic hauled has shown very. little falling off; buti it has been carrled at rates that have rendered it unremunerative. The depression that has fllled the larger citics with starv. Ing poor, that has allenced the busy hum of machimery and stilled the sound of toll, has reacted upon them with a severity lail the more startling wecause it was unexpected. At the commencement of 1893 thoir prospects were considered. unusually Onlght. It was welleved that the opening of the World's Fair at Onleago would inaugurate a relga of prosperity for the rail. roads. The influx of visitors was expected to morease thenr passenger, recelpts, while it was hoped that the result of the exhibition would be an aug. mantation in the volume of imports and exports that would materlaily bes. nefit thelr traflic earnings. Nelther be-

Hef Hurned out wue. The Moziniey tarlff effectially kept imports within the narrowest limits, and also deterred many foreign vistors from coming to a country with whom they: were unuble to trade. The tariff wall sluyt out a class of men whose attendance mignt lave meant a stribing increase in both the import and export trade of the United Statec and conlined the attendwace at the great exposition practically to thelr own citizens. All this reactéd on the prallroads. Trafic fell off rather than increased, except in fust the last few weeks of tho faly or on certaly special yays. Competition wecame keener. Rates were cut, elther openly or by means of secret rebates and the allowance of claims. Freight curnlugs came down to the lowest noteh, and finally the burden became too great to carry any longer and the road went into the hands of a receiver: This ls practically the history of cach of the 73 companites who have gone to the wall in 1893. It is true of all of them from the glant forporations like the Philadelphia and Reading, Atchison, Topeka and Smita Fe, and the Union and Northern Pacifies, down to the smallest little struggling ifuc. In every case the causes of failurd are the same, ' and the prospects of cventual sticoess equally remote and unpromising.

## IS FORESIGFT A BAR?

Thef decision of the judge in the trial of Dr. Moyer, the alleged poisoner, that no man sagacions enough to avail himself of the benefits of Insumance shall be permitted tor serve upon the jury, seems an outrage on common scisa no matter how legally nceurate it may be. Bo. cause Dr. Meyer is accused of polson-: lag an accomplice in order to secure the insurance on his life, thed judge has accepted the demand of his counsel that any man carrying an insurance policy on his own or any other person's Iffe shall be peremptonijly challonged. In other words the exercise of ordinariy. foresigitt is suffecient to debar a man under this decision from exercising tha functions especially gunanteed to him as a free man under the constitution.

What clasis of jurymem the court expectst to secure under such a ruling it is casy enough to conjecture. The juryman eligible to serve on so importantt and difficult a case as the one in question must have never read a dally paper, never formed an intelligent opin. lor of the case, and never carrled in. surance In any form. In other words. the must be both lacking in education
and in common sense.. . It he possessed the finst he would certainly! peruse the mews. If he was glited with the second he would equally certainly be in. sured. And $y$ et, in a trial abounding in techinicalltes, and in which the case will rest largely upon the evidence of chemfenl experts requirhig men of unusual intelligence, education, and judlehal powers to understand, the court has practically decided that the jury khall we composed of men possessing mone of the necesstury quallitations for arriving at a true and just conclus. ion.
Thls is, we belleve the first time that any man has been debarred from service on a Jury because he recognised the obllgation of proviaing for the neces. alties of his wife and tamily when he sthould no longer be the breadwinner. So lar from the fact that a man's car. rylug lusurance should render him unIft to slit judicially and impartially the evidence in the Meyer case it should we his primelpal qualification. The mere knowledge that he does so argues that he, is a mani of prudence, of iore. sight, and of sugations and affectionate forethought. He does not leare his loved ones to the care of "Providence." He makes instead a sound and proflable investment for their beneflt and ensures that they shall eontinue in the same case fund comiort after his death that they have enjoyed auring bif, life. He toils for them while he is able and, thanks to lils signelty, when the busy hands are still and the honest brath no longer throbs, the fruit of his thrlif and prudence will keep his famlly above the rench of want.
No doubt such a man would be apt to deal severely with a erime against insurance. Necognising its benefits to the honest hasurer he wonld naturally resent any attempt to injuro it by fraud. Bull that it would lin any way warp his judgment, one is at hberty to doubt. The very knowledge that he displays of ite value argues him to be $a$ man of sound bushess sense, and such men are execptionally fitted to judge In cases like the one In question. Ye can neither we puzzied by experts, nor cajoled by lawyers. He silts hls evidence as he examines the goods he buys, and the polleles he takes out. No doubt the counsel for the defence were quite right to exclude such men from the jury from thelr stimed-point; but that the court should have upheld them by Its ruling seems to argue that it took the letter of the lay more linto abounnt than !ts gyplet.

THE DEPRESSION IN BREADSTUFES:
The returns of the British Board of Agriculture show the effect of unprofit: able prices on farming pursuits in Great Britain. The acreage under wheat, this year, was $1,897,488$ acres, against 2,307 . 277 in 1891 ; barley $2,076,097$ as against 2,112,708; oats 3,171,756, as against 2, 809,120 ; potatoes 527,821 as against 532,794 ind hops 57,576, as agrainst 66,142.

The sullen markets of November, just closed, are likely to be remembered as wheat fell below the lowest level ever known. English buyers were reserved bocause there was enough whant and flour in the granaries to last for the three most trying winter months. Then as to spring contracts it was feared by the trade that if an advance of $2 s$ on the extremely low prices could be established it would attract an unmanageable bulk of offers. The gathering of a fine new harvest in Argentina promises a considerable surplus for February-March shipment at about 2 is per quarter and the crops are roady for the sickle in Australia, where 40 million bushols of wheat are expected to be secured. Free trade Las 'open water all through the year, and Russian harbors and American canals may be 'rozen, and yet India and other sources of supply may be actively shipping. A leading Euglish authority, comparing the present position with December last year and the jear previously, is inclined, to express some encouraging views. That Lulia, with a good crop can hold much of it back, is proved; Russia may do the game. The year 1801 drove down prices in 1802-93 to a level that may be regarded as abnomal, and therefore musubstainalike. The great mistake was to allow gloom to be east over the world by the Russian famine, when the disnater was simply confined to Russia which is mi over-producing country that, even in ita distress, did not need to import grain. The deficiency of the French harvest that necessitated a wheat import of 104 milLion buakels, was the chief event of 1801. Watters are now settling down. There is plenty of wheat in sight but no more than should warrant a material advance on present prices, if ouly Europear whoat imports do not overload themsolves with a heavier supply than the market can carry.
The figures of the yenr's Dnited States erop by the department of agriculture are an interesting atudy. Prices at the farms, averageil for the whole country, certainly record remarkable fluctuations. From 1870 to 1879 wheat averaged 104.9 cents per bushel and from 1880 to 1880 , 82.7 cente. The year 1800 saw it 83.8 ; $1801,83.0$; 1892, 02.4 and 1808, 52.1 cents. Corn was 42.6 cents from 1870 to $1879,30.3$ from 1880 to $1859,50.6$ in $1890,40.6$ in 1891, 39.4 in 1802 and 87.0 in 1893. Proilucers of corn are not sufferiug to the same extont as the whent growers. Their returns were large in 1801 and 1892 and about even with ox: penses in 1893. A fow years ago the Illinois Board of Agriculture made a carelul computation by countries of the cost ofl growing corn and wheat. Cost of trorking for corn averaged $\$ 5.50$ por
acre 'and for theat: $\$ 6.50$. Adding $\$ 2.50$ for tental of land this gives a total of $\$ 8$ for cornand $\$ 0$ for wheat. The gross receipts fer acre. iń Illinois were \$11.22 in $1890, \$ 15.50$ in 1801, $\$ 11.01$ in 1802 and $\$ 0.61$ in 1893. North Dakota, which is a winter wheat State, fared as follows: Gross receipts per acre in 1800 \$4.83, in 1891 $\$ 15.26$, in $1802 \$ 7.49$ and in $1893 \$ 4.80$. The occupation of the wheat grower secme to have jone ; but we may hope that better times are coming. Taking $\$ 9$ as nost per acre there was a round profit of $\$ 6$ per acre in 1891. A farmer who had 100 acres in whent would clear $\$ 600$, over all expenses and interest from that crop alone. All the wheat States, winter and spring, shared in this great profit. In the following year receipto did little more than pay oxpenses. But trade with the farmers was brisk in 1892 because the large profits of the preceding year were not yet all spent. There was enough in 1891 to pay off some of the mortgages and indulge in a fow huxaries ind things did not look at all gloomy. in 1892.
The present year has brought dinaster, as the receipts per acre ald not meet the cost of production. Four sample States have tho following record: Grose receipts per acre in Illinois $\$ 5.61$, Misisouri $\$ 4.70$, Minnesota $\$ 4.59$, North Dakota $\$ 4.80$. Bo it remembered that the cost of production per acre was $\$ 0$, including an averago charge for interesit and rental. The farmer enters upon the new crop year with his resources at a low ebb. He has been floored by the unusual combination of low prices and a poor yield. Two years bofore he was most fortunate in having heavy crops and high prices. Latterly he has been compelled to sell below cost to mect his store bills. It is not likely that this state of things will continue, but the supplies in sight are so large that an immediate improvement is improbablo . Low prices should leep the consumption of wheat flour at its maximum.

## SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS.

The number of petitions and lettora before the Government at Quebee is ovarwhelming, and especially uneasy lies the hipad that now bears the honors of the Provincial I'reasury. There is every expectation that the burdens imposed on city properties contiguous to the large number of streets openod or widened latterly, may be distributed more equitably. The so-called improvements-which we owe to the recent "people's" favor-ites-are no more benefit to citizens two or three or four blocks distant than to. those who own or reside hali a mile or a mile away. Indeed in the case of busiuess thoroughfares the offect of widenfing a street closo by is rather injurious thau beneficial, as tending to divert trado and traffic. When Napoleon III Haussmanized Paris, the needed propertios were bought by the city at largo and tho improved portions resold on its account. Those in business or living on the boulevards thus opened out are evidently better natisified than the citizens of Mont: roal along or contigupu to nuck ergage
at Cathedral, Palace or Inspector streets. if the city must be bontified or improvod for business or convenience, it is surely but fair to ask the people to pay for the necessary changes proportionate to their interests. But Montien has too many "heelers," too many droues, too many people whose chief occupation in life is to make an easy living out of the public. The city of Dublin may fairly be held up as an example of what it must all come to, soouer or later, a city of which it was once epigrammatically said by a chief-secretary when more than usually pressed by the importunities of place-hunters,-"Erery man in this city wants a place, and, when he's goti it, he wants his son appointed deputy."

## NOVEMBER'S EXPORTS.

The statement of exports for Noyember, complied at ottarra, indiente that the figures of the present fiscal year may possibly exceed those of its predeccssor. During the month the movement of exports amounted to $\$ 14,004,502$, of which $\$ 13$,085,353 whs the produce of Canadr and : $1,270,140$ the produce of other countries. Compared with the same month last year this shows an inceense of $\$ 3,134,678$, of which $\$ 2,775,624$ is in the produce of Canada and $\$ 355,05 \pm$ in the produce of other countricsl. Takiag the first five monilis of the fiseal year the total exports aroounted to $\$ 07,706,056$, as compared with s65, 090,437 for anme period last year. or an inerease of $\$ 2,610,619$.
This increase is represented principally by the growth in the export of fisi products and manufactured goods. In fislit tho increase is unatly $\$ 2,000,000$, while in manpiactured artielces there is a gratifying increment of 8300,000 . The falling off in tho eatile trade, owing to the secheduling of Canadian eattlo in Great Britain, appears to have lieen offect by an increaso in the export of buttor and cheese, while the shipments of lumber are practically stathomasy. In agricultural products thera is an apparent declino of nearly ten per cent.; lut this is due to the low prices now ruling for wheat and not to any deeline in the volume of cereals exported. In fact, taken as a whole, tho roport shows that Canada's export trade is on a sound and substamtial busis.

## THEY WANT CINADIAN PINE.

There will be po pposition to the removal of the tariff on lumber by the Michigan lumber mex; for they feel that some concessions must be made to Canadian intercste or their mills will have to close down. Hence the Wilson bill has no terrors for them ; for since the export duty on logs was taken off by the Canadian Goyerment, their mills have practically lived on. Cauadian pine. During the past year upwards of $300,000,000$ fect of loge hapo becn brought acrose Lako Huron and converted into lumber by the mills of the Sagtinaw river, and the shore tomus. Canadian logs have furnished labor for the cmployes of fully fiftecen large saw mille. Uulegs there is an axport duty placed on loge this winter the amount brought oyer soxt gumer will undopbtedry excoed thet
of the past year, for nearly all the lumb bermen havo arranged or cutting a much, or more, during the present winter:
The business of rafting logs across the late enploys hundyeds of men, who sort the logs and man the tugs which do tho towing. One firmin Bay City, the Saginavy Bay Towing Association, has ten poweriul tugs for the work. About half the output cameg from Snanigh River, and the romainder from Freuch River and Little Current.

## LOOK OUT FOR HLAM.

A clever phasible talker hos been swindling men prominent in charitable works in Ontario, and will doubtless not confine his operations to that provingeonly. Hence our readers would do well to look out for him. He is woll-dressed and speake of the pripeiple and practice of charity os an active prthusiast. His piety is adifying to witneis. He reprêsents himself as a lawser, and the thusted solicitor of a revered old lady, recently deceased, who has loft a large sum of money to divide amonget various chariting, onte of which is the particular charity in which his rletim is interested. But unfortunately, when the old lady died sho left no money with whieh to probate the will, and this will cost from $\$ 50$ to $\$ 100$. Will the victim advance that sum and cnable him to distribute their legacies to these deserving institutions? In two instances, at least, he lins got the monoy, His fervor, onthusiasm and plausiblo manuer have carriod conviction as far as the pooket-books of his hearere, and they have given up the money with which to probate the will. But they aro still Waiting for the thousand dollar legacies for which that interceting doequment provides, and are likely to do so for a long white to come.

## THE CURRANT TRADE.

Things look very bluc in the eurrant shipping buequegs, nud four important houses at Patuas have goue into insolvency, although prices on the lower grades of fruit have advarced somewhat of late. In order to help the currant growers the Greek government has taken off the exeiso duty on apirit maling, and a Jarge quantity of the currante will be used for distilling. This, with a project for levying an export duty on them, hus strengthened the position of londere, but it has coms too late to heip luterior producers who, this year, have not received the price of cultivation for their Suit Canadn's congumption of currants continues to fall off. This year it was only 1,079 tons, as agniust 1,328 tons during the same period of 1802.

## NEW MORTALITY TABLES.

The insuranee companies of England havo decided to complete a new set of mortnlity tables at their own expense, as they are diesatisfied with those now in use on the ground that they are baed upon the exporience terminating in 1803 , and are thus not up to dato. They wish to ascertain the experience of the paet thirty yearg, and beliere that it will show a consilar: able improyement in the vitality of the populetion. Circulare anking tor the mecen.
sary information have bsen sent out $\therefore$ tdain every. company by the Instituto of Actur aries, ant aithough the compilation vill. tuke both time and mony, it is felt that the matering to work on is so much more nople today than it was thirty yeara ago that the rosult will fully justifytho outlay.

## SULNG THE COMPANY

A. Lefebre, formerly al merchant at Laprairie, has instituted a suit againgt the Royal Canadinn Insurance Co. for $\$ 17,000$ for damages and interest arising out of their refusai to pay certain losses to hluy fromptly. In 1880 his hay barn, on which there was insurance to tho extent of 000, was burned down. The company contested his claim and ho was forced to as: sigh. The curator to his estate continued. the suit and eventually wou it, and the money was paid into court. Lelebyre now sues on his own account for damages from loes of busivess, law costs and interest to date, and places his damages at the ligure elainued.

## THE COMMERCLAL TAXISN.

The changts in the commercial taxes pro: bosed by Hou. Johu S. Hall, provincial treasurer, may be summed up briefly as follows. The tax on real estato tranglers ig reduced fiom one and a half to one per ecuth. Estatcs in the direct lino will be exempt from taxation up to $\$ 3,000$. From E 3,000 to $\$ 0,000$ they will pay a half per ecnt, and from that up to $\$ 10,000$, oue per eent. Up to $\$ 50,000$ the tax will bo $11: 4$ per cent., over that and up to $\$ 100,000$ it .ivill be $11-2$ per cent. Dstates over $\$ 100$, 000 , but under 8200,000 , will pay two pet cent; estates orer $\$ 200,000$, three per cent. Ae regards collateral estates and strangers the law remuius as it is.
The distinction hilharto existing betweon: manufacturers, traders and profespionail men has been swept away. In future all will pay six per cent. ou their rental in adrance in the cities of Montreal and Quebec. In other places the existing rates will rule. dembers of the civil service and publice employes, drawing over $\$ 400$ yearly, will be tuxed $21-2$ per cent., and this tax will ba dedueted from their sularice.
Thi following are the uew tax recolutions in full:

That eyery person or firm, other than on incorporated company, curaged in the manufacture of any articie of commerce or in any maunfacturing industry, within this p:ovipee, shall be obliged to take out each year, ou the fiat day of October, a liegnie. from the collictor of provincial reveniee of the district in which ha has his principal Astabighment, for which license ho ginili, previous to obtaining the same, pay for bai collector the sum hereinfter deternined:
2. That every shop-keeper, trader, person or firm, other than an incorporated company, who keeps a shon, cartee on trade or business, or who sells, within this province, by wholcsale or retail, any tim ber, lumber, conl, tobacco, cigare, goode, wares or merchandise of any kind and who hae not already. taken out a license, under he curbec License law, for the gale of intoxicating liquors, slatl bo obligad to take out, cach year, on or before the first day of October, a license from the collector of provincial revepue of the district in which tie has his prineipal establishment, for which license he mhill, previous to obtalin?: lag the game, pay to the sold gollogtor the

Tlith persons holding a licenso who during the courge of the yens, romove their establishment to other premises of a higher aumual valuo or rent, shall be linble to pay a supplementary license fee in..proportion to such incrensed value or rental; which shall be due from the first da*y of the month in which such change is oficcted.

That if any person makes any false or incorrect statement in any declaration uade under the provisions of the fourth of these resolutions he slanll be lipable to a penulty of $\$ 100$, with costs, and in default of payment an jmprisonment of one month;
That in all the above cases, if a firm is in defant, the penalty shall be incurred by each member of the firm, and, in deliualt of payment, each shall be liable to the imprisomment above mentioned.
13. Ever's advocate, notary, physician, dentist, lund surveyor, civil engineor, veterinary surgeon, artist; painter, musician, sealptor or architest, practising his profession within the limite of the provine , shall pay an aunual tax, the amount whereof shall be that indicated in the following tariff:
If he has his principal office or place where he exercises his profession:
n. In the city of Montreal or Quebec, six per cent. on the rent or annual value of such office or place;

That every person linble to the tax mentionel in the fifteenth resolution, who shall neglect to pay the same at the time therein indieated, shall be liable to a fine equal to double the tax imposed, with costs, and iu dofanlt of payment an imprisonment for one month, without prejudice to the right of instituting an action for the recovery of the eaid tax.
16. That members of the Executive Council of the province, wembers of the Civil Service, and public employes and officers, receiving a fixed salary, shall pay a tax of two and one-half per cent. upon their respective sularies, over folfr hundred dollars.
17. That the tax-imposed upon the members of the Executive Council of the province, and upou the members of the Civil Service, public officers nud employes above mentioned, shanl bo retained, monthly, out of their salary.
[20. That all suits; institutod under the act to be based on these resolutions, for nay tax, license fee or penalty, shall bo taken, on behnif of Her Majesty, by thie
collector of provincial revenue, in' hie own name, according to the amount claimed, in the Superior or Cireuit Court of the district in which such amount is payable; and that such suits shall be considered as summary matters, and shall be governed by the provisions of articles 887 to 800 a , both inclusive, of the Code of Civil Procedure.
18. That any sum that may become due to the Crown, in virtue of the act to be bred on these resolutions, shall constitute a privileged debt, ranking concurrently with any other privilege of the Crown, immediately after law costs.
That the collector of provincial rovenve, who collects any sum, in virtue of the act to be based on these resolutions, slati be entitled to such remuneration as the Lt. Governor-in-Council may deterrine.
19. That the Lt. Governoi-in-Qouncil may make, amend, replace and repeal all regulations and forms that he may consider necesbary for the exceution of the provisions of the act to be based on these resolutions, and that such regulations and forms shall come into force fifteen daye after the date of their publication in the Quebec Oifficial Gazette.
20. That the license fees and tayes due, nuder the act to be based on these resolutions, for the jear ending on the thirtieth day of September, eighteen hundred and nincty-four, are payable and shall be paid on or before the first day of March, eightcen hundred and ninety-four.

## FREE LUMBER AND PULP.

Prominent in the discussion over tariff reform in the United States is the question of free lumbor and pulp from Canada. As our neighbors are likely to dovote a good portion of half a year to the whole of the issues, each item being up for discussion on its own particular merits, and likely to be cousiderably modified by the influence of those particularly. interested, we may look for a thorough and final treatment of this: question as bearing upon the fiscal and international policy of the country foit yoars to come. The following article communiented to the Now York "Journal of Commerce," evidentiy by some one thoroughly cont versant with the sulject, enters so fully into the present aspect of the lumber question that we need not apologizo for placing it in full before our readers. It will be seen that the views enunciated by Mr. Charles Mageo, president of the Bank of Ottawh, at the recent annual meeting of that bank are fully concurred in by tho writer:
The Ways and Means Committe thas done well is putting lumber on the free list, but it was hoped that it put all lumber and wood pulp on the free list. iWe aro brouglit to a consideration of this subject from the remaris made by the Hon. Mr. Foster, Finance Minister of the Canadian Government, in which he intimates that the existing conditions of the interchange of forest products between this country and Canada cannot any. longer be permitted to remain in thoir present unsatisfactory state. The threat made by our Western lumbermen that they will make the waters of tho Lake amooth towing over Canadian logs to stock their mills in Michigan now that they have used up their own timber, has forced the Canadian Government to inquire into the conditions; and although Mr. Foster does not appear to distinctly state that it is the inton tion of his Government to re-impose the export duties, he leaves no question that this must be the outcome in case we still persist in exneting heary duties on Canadian lumber and julp: His yemates are sulli ciently clear on this point to leavo littlo
doubteofithe result. When ho says: "If conditions rewain as thay are, when Par limuent meets it will become a subject for very grare condideration whether the interests of Canada and hor lumber aud pulp productions geucrully, both present and prospective, will not reguiro astroug remeay," andintimates that remedy to Do "the inposition of an equivalent export iuty on logs exported to any counby which imposes heayy, duties on Candian lumber and pulp."
It is well suown that there is in Cunadin very strong lecinge, among those at least whose mills have deong forced to close down, trous what they chim to be all untair "iserimination m invor of the manuiaturers on this country by the Gannain Guverment; and some go so far as to ask tor an export nuty higher than the United staces impurt duties on Camadam lumber and pulp, as our lumbermen have always insiscea that \% 2 a thousand feet was only a dair rato of duty to protect the baw-miiling industry of the United states, so long us they had timber; and the Canudians think, now that the Michigan millmen must depend on Candian fimber for the future, that it is but just their own argument should apply Co protect the Canauian milling industry, but this idea Mr. Foster does not appear to entertain, loe he speaks only of "an equivalest rate oi export duts," nad fearos it optional with us to have free logs and pulp wood in exehange for free lamber und puip.
Many of our best informed people bejieve, ircespective of protective ur : free trude principies, that the time has arrived when the conditions of out forests, especially those containimg white pino and sprice, require most carernl eomsidexation to try to extead their uselulues ais long as pussjble, so as not to leave us in a position of having to depend on tho generosity of others for our own requirements of sueb indispensubie material as whito pine and spruce lumber and pulp. Liven now the aepect is by no meane reassuring, for we get from the Extria Census bulletin of 1890, relating to the sawmilling industry of our great white pine producing States-Michigan, Wiscousin and Minnesota-an insight into their.condition, at that time, when it would appenr that outside oi that owned by the l'ed eral aud. State Governments, the quantity of white pine barely reached 50,000 , 000,000 leet, while the amount eut durriag the cemsus yenr reached the enormous total of $10,670,000,000$ feet, or over oneFifth as much-the remarke made on this point being: "'The manufacturers' holdings of such timber are only sufficient to supply them for about live years at tho present rate oi cutting. The quautity in reserve is believed to be principally that standiug on lands owned by the Fedoral and State Governments." Siace then the three geare' cutting of pine in Michigan has about gleamed the lower penin sula of this timber held by the millmen. The largest amount now heid by any one party is that of Mry. David Ward, of Detroit, Which he is withholding from the market at present. And, while the Sag inaw River is largely dependent on Canndian logs to stocls its mills, the Muskegon, the next largest producing river, is styled in a recent issue of the Chicago "Timbermen," "A Worn Out StreamA sud picture to those who remember what the Muskegon River was in its carlicr days; and Muskegon-itself has dropped from one of the grentest lumber produciug centres of the world, to a position of unimportance. From over $750,000,000$ feet of annual protuction only a few years ago, it has fallen to about 100,000 , 000 feet at tho present time, of poor aver age quality-the mere clearings up of the great lumbering operations of the past.' And the same may be said of the great tributary of the Sagimaw, the Tittabaunssec, Which in 1882 turned out over $600,000,000$ tect of loge. In fact, the lower penineula of Michigan, which up to last year gave the largest production of sawn
pine lumber of any State in the Union, way be naid to be now out of tho fieldior the future as a pine lumber producer. Theve then remains, outside of Wisconsin and Mimesotn, but the limited tracts of white pine still unent in tho dlleghapy Mountrins south of Pennsylvania, which, like ber sister States, has now parted with its white pine of commercial importanee, while Wisconsin and Minnesota are fast usiug up the limited quantity left there. Su that in so far as regards white pine, it would appear that the chse is even now past repair.
And whaterer may beceaid about the whito pine will apply with fully as grent force to spruce, for this being a peculiurly Northern wood, we must, whether we lise it or not, depend on Camada for future supplies of this timber, both for lumber and puip. An examination of the reports of Professor Sargent respecting the amount of epruce remnining-uncut in 1880, showing at that time barely a supply for ten ycars in the New Eugland States, which would have been pretty well harvestod by this time if the same quality, and amount had been cut continuouslly since his report was made, and the almost mathomaticas accuracy of his estimato of the white pinc of Michigan, when carefully considered, should canse us to regard his other estimates with confidenco. For when we consider his estimates of the white pine of Michigan were to include only trees of 12 inches in dinmeter, 20 feet from the ground, whercas most of the fimber cut for the past hand dozen years has been from trees that were not to be taken into consideration, and whicle should have been allowed to grow to sup: ply timber for the future, and not leavo the State, as now, wholly gleamed of pine timber. Piue and spruce lumber and pulp should be admitted free.

## BRITAIN AS A CONSUMER.

It groes almost without saying that Connaid and the United Statos would be in an sorry plight if they did not have Greint (Britain us a cousumer, always ready to absorb their surplus produce. It is one thing to rinise crops, and breed cattle, but it would not bo quito so: easy to turin them into moiney, if the people of the British islos obtaiged their aupplies olewhere.
In both countries agricultural exports easily take first rauk and are likely to continue fo do so, judging by their present preponderance. The Secretary of Agriculture for the United States tells us that the exports of agricultural products from the United tSates for the fiscal year ended Tune 30, 1802, attained the enormous figure of eight hundred million dollare in round numbers, boing 78.7 per cent. of the total exports. In the fiscal year following, this aggregate was greatly reduced, but nevertheless attained tho respectable figure of six hundred and fifteen fimillione, being 74.1 per cent. of all American commodities exported. In almost every line the Uuited Kingdom absorbed the largest proportion. Of cattle, the total United States exports aggregated in value, for 1892 , thirty-fipo million dollara, of which Great Britain took thirty-four millions, rind nil 1803, forenty-aix 血illions, of which the home eountry took over twenty-five millions: Of Weef products of all kinds, the total exports for 1892 exceeded in value thirtyone million dollars, of which 25 mlliion went to Groat Britain; and in 1893, 28 million dollarg, of whicht England took 24 millions. Of pork products, tho total exports for 1802 aggregated in value 85 .
million dollars, of which Britain tool 47 millions, and in 189384 millions, of Which she took 53 millions.
A. Tow more examples may be givem; all tending to show that when the United States developes a larger appetitetwith the increase of her population, tha Do minion may forge still more ahead and do quite a snug trade with the old country. ' Corn and cotton realize a respecttry, Corn and cotton realize a respect ada must, of yecessity, relinquish these markets. Wo may do bettor in wheat. United States exports of this ataplefior 1802 were valued at 161 million dollars and of this amount Britain paid 68 mil liens. For the fiscal year 1893 the ex ports were valued at 03 million dolyaro England 'payiug out 58 millions. 0 wheat flour, the total exports for 1892 were 75 million dolhars; to Groat Britain 47 millions. In 1898 the total ex ports were about the same as for 1892 while Britain took 48 millions. If we except cottons, corn und tropical Iruite, Canada produces the same producta" Bo largely sent abroad by the United States und, with equal enterprise, should olitain a larger share of foreign trade.
American agents are now endeavoring to find out why American meats are practically exeluded from eertain countries: why American tobacco is not more "de manded; why american whent ilour can not be more generally marioted in Europe; why eranberries are not sold thero why American wines are not called för, and Why Europeans crenerally should not be consumers of American canned goods To theso may be added, has the "ligh United States tariff induced retaliatory measures against the products of "that country?
The linited area of Great Britain'precludes that country from supplying lier own wauls, and her extended commerce and great wealth, makes hor the best of customers. Owing to our favorable geographical position, it is difficult to seo how she can buy cheaper than on this con* tinent. It is a curious fact that the annual ngricultural imports into the United States reach a value of $3 \overline{0} 0 \mathrm{mil}$ liou dollars, and most of the articles could be raised in that country, since they include hides, fruits, nute, wince, fibres (including wool and silk), sugars, tobaceo, otc.

## MONTREAL HHOLESALE MAREETS.

## Thursday Evg; Dec. 28, 1803.

The holiday feeling hite been apparent in all brauches of wholesale trade, the disposition beling to delay new business until alter' the tury of the gear. Mont firm
will, no doubt, be glad to close up their books and hope for better luck in 1894. The tariff uncertainties, on both aides of the line, will be more or lese harmiul, ab . uperations abead.will necessarily be delayed, or curtailed. It is more than probable that the first few montis of tho year will be dull and uneventful. Prices are - low and consuming countrics appear to bave a burpius aupply of the chief products which we have to aell. It is encouraging to note that some of our people are bestirring themselves about more dis* tant markots, such as Australia, New Zealand and South Africa, sister countries of such a different elimato and capabilities, that an exchange of industrial and soll products, chould be mutually advautageous.
Ashes,-Recoipts of pots are very fair for the нeason, 83 brls: for December, to date. Prices aro steady at $i \$ 4.45$ to $\$ 4.50$ as to tares for final pots, seconde $\$ 3.80$. Pearls $\$ 5.50$ for firsta. Receipts since 1st Jan. 1,601 br's. pots, 150 brls. pearls; deliveries 1,626 brls. pots, 1.71 Dris. paarls; in atore 28 Dec., at 3 p.m. 60 brls. pots, 37 brla. pearls.
Butter and Cheese.-Fine table butter is steady, but demand is moderate. Buyers nppear to be eupplied for the time being. Finest fall oreamery may be quoted at 23 e to 24c; finest Townships dairy 21c to 22c, finest westerí and Kamouraska 101 -2e to 20e. There is no stir in tho. cheeso market and holdors for the English trade have nothing to eay. Prices are firm at 11e to 111-4e for finest.
Dry Goods.-The holiday cash sales should insure grood collections fori the wholeale trade in the fifist half of Jannary. Fospunately the weather, although changeable, has been more seasonablo than for some yeare. Considerable rain fell for a day or so, but being soon followed by frost the sleighing has not been stopped. The fact that a few houses have hail more goods returned to then, than they expected, has been made more of, than the occasion warranted. Travellers may be ovarzealous and force more stock ou the small customer than ho is able to take care of, or put out, whilo the soason lasts. This is something to be avoided at thie time. If goods returned are not too much pulled about, they are certainly better back than rauking, later on, among tho assets of an insolvent, who found too late that he was carrying too heary a load. The country may be solvent enough, but there is nothing at the prosent time to encourage loity ideas, and induce buyers to "load $u_{1}$ " with more than the average quantity of etock, for the period of the jear. New York cottou spots quict; uplands 7 7-8e, culi $81=8 \mathrm{c}$, futures steady; sales Dee. 7.48 c , Jan. $7: 4 \mathrm{c}$, Fob. 7.75 c , March 7.68c, April 7.76 c , May 7.8*c.

 lie at $\$ 22$. Recent prices for wheat-in Chicago 65 3-4c May and July, 601 1-2c Dec. With regard to the Manitoba crop of wheat officinl estimates put the amount already marketed at $0,244,550$ bushels, leaviug a bnlance of $6,371,307$ still in the hands of the farmers. The Red river valley was the most favored disrtict this fear, the sonthwestern and wesctru parts of the Province having sutfereil from hot winds and want of rain. The whent was almost frec from smut and the yield per acre was 15.56 bushels. The ont crop was $9,823,935$ and barley 2,547 ,653. English cables show slight change, but the quautity avilable for export is cess than a year ago, and when stocks get a little lower a change for the better appenre certain.
Groceries.-There was absolutely next to nothing doing in the grocery trade. Some brokers said they were completely. idle and could not report a salc. Even the wholesale jobbers are doing little as the holiday rush is over. Some sorting up orders are, of course, required for the New Year, but things aro becoming more restiul, and they will soon find all the time wanted to take stock and balance up the jear's business. Profits have not been large in any line of staple or fancy. goods, in spite of combinations the evila of which have not been dilated upon in the daily press, as in some former years. Sugar is dull and unchanged here, our quoted prices still being subject to a reduction of 1-10c at refinery for large lots. In New York, standard $A$ is down to 4 8-16e, and is only moderately active. The price may be reduced there to meet importationa of German sugar. A cable quotes the market abroad at 12s 6d.
Green Fruits.-A large business has been done by the fruit auction company, many outsiders being buyers. At one sale this week some 5,000 packages changed hands. There was a good supply of seasonable lines. Only fifteen furnaces were blowing, but with the normal supply of fuel, conseciuent upon the close of the Scotch coal strike, others will soon start up again. Special shipping branda are scarce but there is no pressing call for them. Recent advances in steel are maintained. Copper has more than maintained its position. Tin has been quieter but is cheap: An American demand, which scems likely under the new tariff, would cause higher prices. Lead steady. There is some activits in the ship building yards in the north of England, more, in fact, than in. Scotland; where operntions have been impeded by a sectional strike.

Had there beon in London one-half of the accidents at level erossings which have occurrod in Chicago this summer, such an outery would have been raised as would havo obliged the railways to apend enormous sums in providing bridges and subways. As an illustration of what is
considered $a$ sufficient bariier to keep back the traffic when a train is approaching we .illustrato on anothes. page the Bogue \& Mills pucumatic gate, which our readers may compare with tho style of gates thought necessary here, oven in quiet suburban ronils. The gate is further: interesting considered as a mothod of operating mechanism at a distance by menns of compressed nir. Two examples are presented in the ligure, the upper having one bar ouly, and the lower
two bars. Each of these bars is in two parts; a main counterweighted portion that overhangs the rondwar, and a tailpiece, geared to the first, crossing the footpath. When the line is fres, and may be crossed with safety, these brite both assume a verticul attitude, but on the approneh of a train they are put into the positions shown.
