Hamilton, Nov. 26.—(Special)—There are practically two declared candidates for the mayoralty of next year, Mayor Colquhoun says: "Most certainly I shall run," while Ald. Dixon says that he is considering it, an acknowledgment which, coming from the chairman of the Free and Water Company, after being called upon by several deputies, means a definite thing.

Mayor Colquhoun announces his platform as "Everything good for the people of Hamilton." He will go strong for bringing more radial roads to the city, one or two new being on the tapis, earlier more good roads and the Cataract Power Company.

Alderman Dixon declares that if he comes into office he will go strong for bringing a larger industrial centre to the city. He will urge the appointment of an independent "lookout" committee, which will be on the continual jump to get factories and business concerns into the city and to effect this without letting the whole country know what is going on during the intermediate and necessary secretive stages, and place a small appropriation at the committee's command.

The will, which left Harry Lawry, the eldest son, was not signed, and this neglect will necessitate the appointment of an administrator and postpone the division of the property until the two youngest children are of age.
