HERE'S ASKING WHAT YOU THOUGHT TO BE INVESTIGATED AT ONCE!

Has an Infamous Crime Committed by the Government on the Members of the Second Contingent?—Was the Emergency Ration Spurious?

Ottawa, June 6.—(Special)—Has Canada an embalmed beef scandal on her hands? Did the Militia Department provide the members of the second contingent with emergency rations, that were on a par with peas? Has an infamous crime been committed?

For a day or two the tired troops of Lord Roberts are resting and he is filling the magazines and warehouses at his new base, Pretoria, preparatory to a long chase after the retiring Boers in the direction of Lydenburg.
