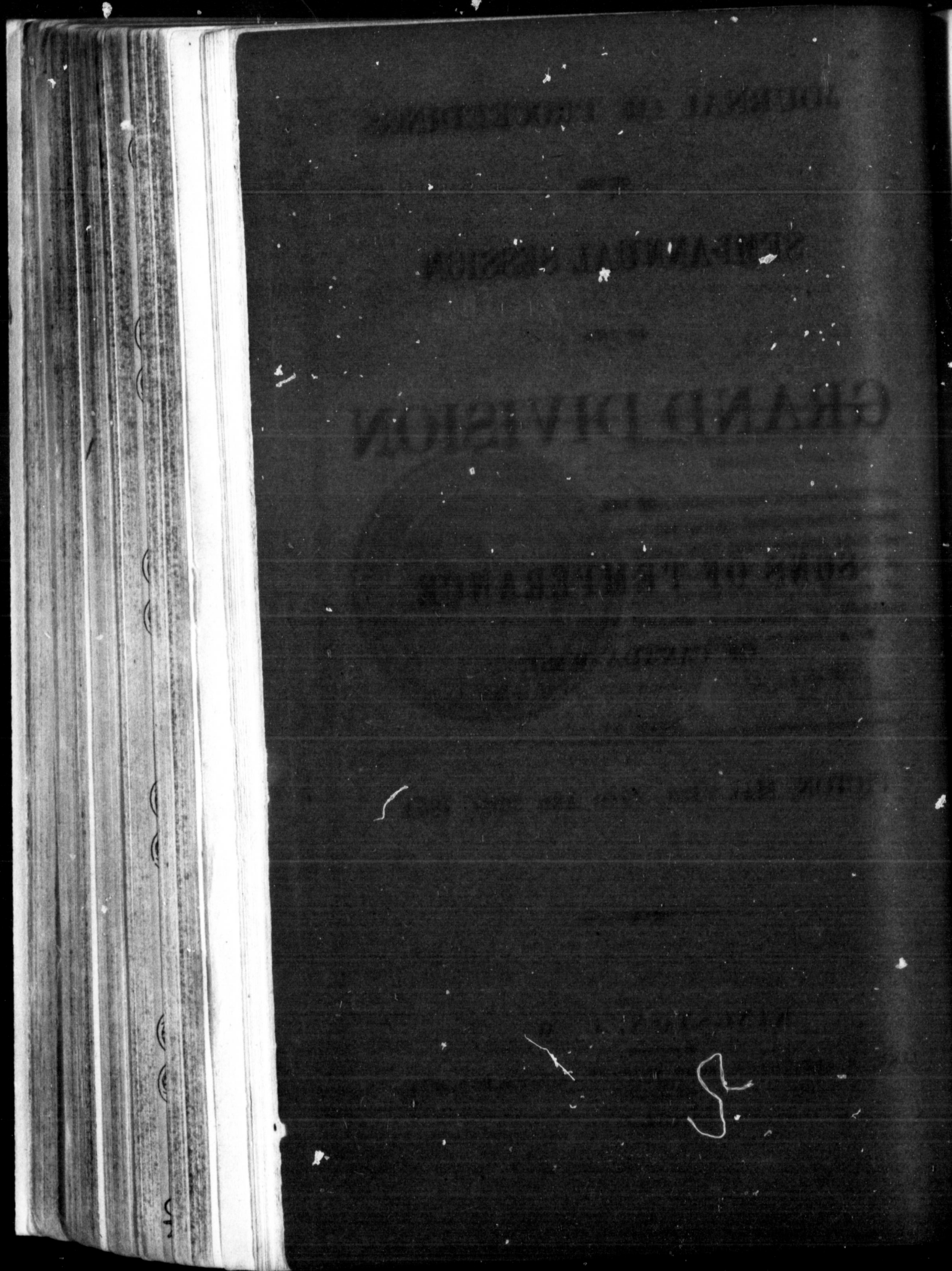

ADDRESS OF THE WORTHY PATRIARCH.

G. W. P. Ryerson in a very impressive manner delivered the following Address :—

To the Representatives in Grand Division assembled.

BROTHERS,—Your presence after another six months of toil, is a gratifying evidence that the Divisions you respectively represent, are still engaged in a work of mercy to the Rum cursed.

I am glad to meet you, and sincerely hope that, under the blessing of the Giver of all Good, the avenger of the oppressed this Session may be long remembered, in consequence of the efficiency of the measures adopted, not only to effectually reclaim the lost, but protect and save the endangered.

Your presence this day gives the *lie* to the *spiritual* prophets who with *ardent* wisdom predicted the funeral of our Order ere this Session, and speaks strong, soul-cheering, and hope-reviving words to our enslaved and rum cursed countrymen.—Our responsibilities have increased with fearful rapidity since last we met—responsibilities, however, which are being forcibly felt by all the Divisions under your jurisdiction.

The alarm cry uttered by this Order in 1852, and which was heard from Cornwall to Sandwich, was not lost in the buzz and noise of our country's political and commercial commotion. It was only drowned for the time, but to gather strength until it should awake a thrilling response from Canada's big heart. It is heard still—"God and the Constitution gives as a *birth right* to every son and daughter of our land—protection for the innocent—legal prohibition of every vice that preys on the interests of our common humanity, moral suasion for the poor drunkard—but legal suasion for the drunkard maker."

These common and just rights, through the instrumentality of this order, have been constitutionally demanded, but unrighteously refused.

To this order, as pledged to war in behalf of our Rum burdened country—to the death—the lovers of virtue, of morality, of religion, of social progress—again look—the drunkard's pale, heart-broken wife, and pitiable little ones; yea, the enslaved drunkard himself—again look, and with intense interest—for deliverance from the fangs of the destroyer. The victims of this progressive traffic have looked to the strong arm of the law for help; but instead of obtaining its rightful aid, they see that arm with all its vigor sustaining the fountain, from the streams of which they were poisoned—encouraging the monster by whom they were stricken down, and practically answering their soul-thrilling appeals—"you are enslaved, beggared, cursed soul and body, according to law."

Brothers, shall they look to you in vain?

Our Order is pledged to the country to do all in our power to reclaim the victims of Rum—save the tempted and promote the good of all mankind—shall we, in this exigency of our country's history—prove recreant to that pledge. The cry for help comes up to us from every part of the land; for since last we met—crime has continued to riot in our brother's blood—unfeeling frost has pinched its victims—hunger has devoured the living flesh from the bones of the famishing—human forms with human souls, have nestled shivering in cast off rags—mothers have wept bitter tears over their starving children—sickness has pined and suffered uncared for, on its pallet of straw—new victims for the prison, the Penitentiary, the Lunatic Asylum, and the Gallows have been made—cursings, wailings, lamentations and prayers of agony, mingled with the maniac's horrid laugh, and the fool's gibberish, have welled up from the low, dark, damp haunts of poverty, want, misery and vice—all the *legitimate* fruits of the infernal traffic, against which we are pledged to war.

I believe the Order was never in a better condition, and I am confident there never was a mightier call to engage in this struggle than the present time—for although numerically weaker than two years ago, it is in moral strength, and united and effective public influence stronger. The days of our puppyism, marked by display, have passed away, and the birds of vanity who loved *only* to show their pretty feathers, have passed with them. We are now engaged in men's work, which requires active brains, strong hands and big hearts. Our countrymen ap-

precipitate our responsibilities, and will respond to our call for aid by pouring the tide of their influence into the same channels, along which our own steadily and surely flows—that by the united flood we may wash away the legalized stains of black temperance. This work demands greater energy than it has as yet received and may profitably be the chief subject of consideration at this meeting of the G. D. In connection with this subject, I would respectfully suggest, that a Special Committee be appointed to prepare some effective plan for arousing the country to the immediate importance of this question, in order that constitutional measures may be taken to rid the country of this traffic—that this Committee proceed at once to this responsible work, and that this Grand Division do not adjourn its Session until we have a plan which if at once carried out, will result in honor to the Order, and blessings to the wretched.

I am happy to say that every report from my deputies breathes a spirit of determination to follow the traffic to the place of its intrenchment, viz.: Legislative sanction—even should they in the noble effort be guilty of striking a blow at the Polls.

The G. S. will furnish you with all necessary information respecting the state of the subordinate Divisions under your jurisdiction.

With few exceptions, every report I have received from my Deputies since the last Session of this body, have been of the most encouraging character—testifying to the increasing conviction among respectable and influential men of the value and importance of the Order and that our accessions in many localities have been from that class of society. I have reason to believe that the suspension of sick benefits and reduction of the initiation fee, has been promotive of the interests of every Division where it has been adopted, and I am confident that were all the weaker, and in a pecuniary sense, poorer Divisions to adopt the same plan, their prosperity would be materially promoted thereby—many Divisions have died from starvation, their means being entirely exhausted by incessant drafts for benefits.

I have had but few applications to settle constitutional questions, which indicates increased knowledge among the Divisions of the proper working of subordinate Divisions, and a more thorough acquaintance with the rules and usages of the order.

In consideration of the pecuniary resources necessary to effectively carry out any plan for the obtaining of a Prohibitory Law, I would suggest, that the proceedings of the semi-annual Sessions of this body, and only that part which involves any changes as affecting the subordinate Divisions, be published and issued on a Synopsis sheet in the form of a Circular.

By adopting this plan, a large amount would be saved annually, which can be appropriated to a far more telling purpose.

I am sorry to report that the Divisions have not realised the benefit anticipated by the introduction of the new Ritual. The extreme length of the initiatory ceremony, and the peculiar style of its composition—requiring in order to be at all bearable, practiced readers, or accomplished repeaters—has, as far as my knowledge extends, proved far less effective than the old work, with all its defects. It would be a great boon to the order, could we secure the privilege of materially abbreviating that prolix ceremony, which privilege might be granted without compromising either the talent, taste or judgment of the N. D.

In conclusion, Brothers, allow me to state as my firm conviction, that the Order in Canada West is in a far healthier state than at this time last year, and prepared, if properly directed, to exert a more powerful influence for the good of our beloved Canada, than at any previous period of its history.

To the Grand Division of Canada West.

OFFICERS AND BROTHERS,—In accordance with the requirements of our constitution, I herewith present you a Report of the transactions of this office during the past term of six months. In submitting this, my first report, it is gratifying in being able to inform you, that the cause and order within your jurisdiction, is in a healthy, and in many localities, prosperous condition. Although when entering upon my duties as Grand Scribe, the prospects of our beloved order appeared gloomy, and several of the Divisions had ceased working, it now affords me unspeakable pleasure to inform you that the G. W. P., assisted by his Deputies, have made strenuous efforts to arouse the slumbering energies of the Divisions, and consequently, a great improvement is manifest.

Charters free have been granted to Allenburg Division, No. 164, and Lattas Mills, No. 412, in consideration that their Charters were formerly surrendered under peculiar circumstances. These two Divisions are now in active operation.

It is deeply to be regretted that Divisions are not more prompt in forwarding the returns; my predecessors have so repeatedly complained of this irregularity, and neglect of duty, that it would appear superfluous in again taking notice of the matter, but the vital importance of this subject, in connexion with the welfare of the order, must plead my excuse. I have during the past term repeatedly written to delinquent Divisions, and failing to hear of their condition, have applied to the Deputies, and in some few instances have procured information. Punctuality in making the Quarterly Returns very much depends upon the faithfulness of the Recording Scribe, and the Divisions would do well not to change that officer too frequently. In many instances the returns are not made out in season, and the D. G. W. P. permits the installation to proceed contrary to law, on merely a promise to attend next meeting to the neglected duty. Now it would obviate the difficulty if the Deputy would notify the Division of his intended visitation, and request that the Quarterly Returns be duly ready, and insist upon the same with respectful firmness, before proceeding to install the officers. On the 21st of March, only 197 Divisions had rendered their Returns for December Quarter, from which it was utterly impossible to make a satisfactory return to the National Division; I therefore requested an extension of time from our Most Worthy Scribe, who kindly granted me another month. I was then under the necessity of writing, in many instances, two or more letters to the delinquent Divisions, and with considerable difficulty by the 29th of April, received returns from 292 Divisions; which number completed the Statistics of this body to the National Division. At the same date 52 Divisions remained in default with the December Returns. A full Report would shew at least one thousand more members, and a corresponding amount of receipts.

CAPITO TAX.

Judging from the information received at this office, the alteration in the per centage to the Grand Division has, with some few exceptions, been approved by the Divisions; in fact it is a matter of congratulation, and appears indicative of the earnestness and well-known liberality of the Sons in this Province to extend and promote the usefulness of the order. Still, a few Divisions desire to return to the old rate of per centage, as they apprehend the "tax is a stumbling block," and will cause them to be continually expelling members.

DUES.

There are many Divisions that have entered warmly into the temperance reformation, and desire to continue their connexion with this Institution, but they wish to adopt a lower scale for initiation fees and dues; many are not satisfied with the process of suspending benefits, and a division of funds at the end of each quarter, while others are of the opinion, that as the per centage is not now estimated upon the amount of receipts, they are at liberty to pay any amount for dues. Some Divisions, it is believed, pay merely a nominal amount for initiation fees and dues, while the minimum amounts allowed by the constitution as revised, is—for initiation fee 5s., and 3d. for weekly dues.

Several Divisions having suspended benefits, the "cash on hand and money invested" heretofore returned has been omitted, and should this system become prevalent, the "cash on hand" item will eventually dwindle down to an insignificant sum, which will materially affect the character of this institution, claiming to be a beneficial society.

NEW RITUAL.

Immediately upon entering on the duties of Grand Scribe, I received the New Rituals in good order, and many Divisions were desirous of being supplied with the

new ceremonies. Letters of inquiry and containing orders, poured in with each mail, and the Divisions were supplied as promptly as possible, at the prices decided upon last session. I found some difficulty in forwarding them at low rates by mail, with the cards and odes inclosed, without leaving the ends of the parcels open, and being the private affairs of the order, I deemed it proper to have the parcels securely sealed, and made arrangements to have the same forwarded by express; the agent engaged to have the parcels speedily and safely delivered, which I regretted afterwards to find was not the case; and a few parcels, after going to the Ports, were taken no further, and have since been returned to this office. In the meantime, I conferred with the G. W. P., and we decided on sending them by mail, with the ends open; and afterwards they have been conveyed by mail at small expense, and without difficulty or miscarriage. It will be advisable for the Grand Division to pass an order terminating the use of the old ritual, and requiring the new ritual to come into general use—otherwise to petition the National Division to leave the choice of the old and new ceremonies optional with subordinate Divisions, as many Divisions prefer the old ritual, with all its imperfections.

The sets of rituals comprised one Blue Book, five Officers' Cards, and twelve Ode Cards, consequently, to supply large Divisions with extra cards, I had to draw upon the sets, not considering myself authorised to procure them printed. You will please pass an order for the printing of Ode Cards.

CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP.

In accordance with a resolution of the Grand Division, I procured 1000 Certificates of Membership for Subordinate Divisions, from Bro. Hoover, in two parcels; the first 500 was received duty free—the second 500 were detained at the Custom House, and a duty of 12½ per cent imposed: the Collector insisting upon the duty being paid, as blank certificates are classified with engraved blank Bank Notes, &c., and therefore to save the G. Division from loss—the 500 were charged sufficient to cover expenses. The engraved Certificate of Membership for members of Grand Division, approved at the last Session, could not be altered as required to suit members of this G. Division. The cost of making the necessary alteration would be more than having a new plate engraved; it will therefore be needful to procure another certificate. 969 certificates have been supplied to S. Divisions.

CREDENTIALS

Have been forwarded to 323 Divisions for Representatives to the Grand Division, and charged one penny each. The Representatives would be spared much trouble, if the Subordinate Divisions would carefully comply with the instructions, contained in Sec. 2nd, Rule 2, Constitution of G. Division, and Art 2, Chapter 2, Revised Rules.

PRINTING.

The Printing bill for the last term will be found reasonable, when compared with the amount of work done. When the present G. S. came into office, he found blank Commissions for Deputy Grand Worthy Patriarchs, and other blanks nearly exhausted, which required to be renewed. Credentials for Representatives, and Synopsis Circulars, and also, 1500 proceedings of last Session were printed and circulated according to former precedent.

Should the Grand Division decide upon continuing having the proceedings of each session printed in book form, I would respectfully suggest, that the Divisions and D. G. W. P.'s be supplied at cost price, as the amount paid for printing the entire proceedings for the last two semi-annual meetings, amounted to the large sum of £66 13s.

At the commencement of the year, I forwarded to each Division a statement of their several accounts, debtor and creditor, with the Grand Division. It must be apparent that errors will sometimes occur to the most careful, and especially where a multiplicity of entries have to be made, and some hundred ledger accounts kept; however, I have much pleasure in stating, that with few exceptions, the accounts were found correct.

PROHIBITORY LIQUOR LAW.

It is necessary that this Grand Division take active and energetic means to improve public sentiment, to secure the enactment of a Prohibitory Law. At the last Session of the G. Division, the consideration of this most important measure was deferred; but the time has now arrived when an effort must be made for the legal suppression of the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors, the grand feature of protection from the evils of intemperance. The G. W. P. in his able report has given you satisfactory information and evidence from all parts of the Province, that a Prohibitory Law is required, and loudly called for, as the only effectual weapon we can use against the “all pervading destroyer” of our race.

A great responsibility rests upon the members of the Grand Division at this session assembled; and if there ever was a time in the history of the Temperance Reform in our Province, when bold, efficient and judicious efforts was imperiously demanded on the part of its friends—that time is now. Information must be diffused previous to the coming election, and in no better way could that object be accomplished than by the employment, for some time, of three or more efficient and good Lecturers.

I am happy to inform you that our Perth friends have taken the initiative, and with true magnanimity, have resolved to employ POLITICAL ACTION; and to support no candidate for Parliament, who is unfriendly or opposed to a Prohibitory Law.

STATE OF THE ORDER.

A good evidence of the activity and efficiency of the order is evinced by the fact, that twenty Charters for new Divisions have been granted, and also, fifteen Divisions have been resuscitated during the past term. It is evident that many Divisions, after a brief period of inactivity, are now acting with vigor, and some of the oldest continue in a healthy and prosperous condition, as an evidence of which many have

completed handsome and commodious Temperance Halls, the pride and ornament of many a happy village.

The number of members admitted during the last six months, for December and March quarters, are 2820, being 800 more than was admitted the previous June and September quarters.

BROTHERS, The Committee on Appeals have had before them the Appeal of J.M. Ring, W. A. of Rideau Division, No. 348. This case is one that comes under Article 7 of the Constitution of Subordinate Divisions—Rule 9 of this G. D., (being under head of "Exposition Article 7 of Constitution of Subordinate Divisions,") says, "Parties cannot Appeal to the Grand Division, unless they appeal from the decision of the Committee, and that appeal is tried before the Division." The course the appellant should have taken, was to have brought a charge in writing against the W. P., which charge should have been referred to a Committee of five members of the Division; they should have investigated the case, and reported their decision to the Division, and if the appellant was dissatisfied with their decision, he could then appeal to the Division, and if dissatisfied with the decision of the Division, then he could have appealed to this Body. Therefore, we recommend the adoption of the following:—

Resolved,—That the said Appeal be dismissed, the appellant not having proceeded in accordance with the rules of this Order.

Your Committee are happy to find that through the exertions of the G. W. P. and his Deputies, the slumbering energies of many Subordinate Divisions have been aroused, and a great improvement thereof is manifest.

In accordance with the Constitution it is optional with Subordinate Divisions to suspend the payment of benefits or not, as they please; therefore, your Committee consider they have no cause to complain, as the power is in their own hands.

Your Committee strongly condemn the practice, if any, such as is followed by Subordinate Divisions, dividing their funds at the end of each Quarter. It is contrary to the spirit of the Order, and would sincerely urge Subordinate Divisions to discontinue such practice, as the money could be much more profitably and correctly used to the promotion of the cause.

Your Committee state that if any Subordinate Division receives less than 8d. per week, and 5s. initiation fees from their members, they act unconstitutionally.

Your Committee would not recommend the procuring of any other certificate of membership, and do not approve of charging Subordinate Divisions and D. G. W. P.'s with the printed proceedings of the G. D.

ADDRESS.

The Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance of the Province of Canada West,

TO THE ORDER GENERALLY,

Greeting:

BROTHERS,—In view of the great and increasing evils which are daily growing out of, and consequent upon the legalized traffic in intoxicating beverages, and in view of the fact that you, in common with your fellow countrymen, will shortly be called upon to exercise the elective franchise, the Grand Division, as the great council of the order, conceive they would not be faithfully discharging the responsible duties of their position did they at this time fail to appeal to the whole order,

and earnestly and affectionately urge upon them the necessity of assigning to the question of legal prohibition, its proper place among the leading political questions of the day.

It is no longer denied by any who have studied with candour and diligence the subject of the liquor traffic and its melancholy results, that nearly the whole of the mischiefs, miseries, sudden deaths, lunacies, poverty and crime, which afflict our beloved country, are unmistakably traceable to this prolific source of wretchedness. That with our immense and rapidly developing resources, a happy and paternal government, a faithful administration of our laws, in the full enjoyment of complete civil and religious liberty, the chief impediment to our greatness and progressive prosperity, the only stain upon our system of jurisprudence is the curse of the license system, and the legal protection thereby afforded to the manufacture and sale of intoxicating drinks.

Abolish this system and no impediment remains in the path to social and moral improvement, material wealth and national greatness. Abolish this accursed system, and if you cannot restore to the unhappy widow her lost husband, and to the starving and perishing orphans their lost and murdered parent, you at least restore to the broken-hearted wife her lost and abandoned husband, and that husband purified by the operation of legal prohibition, you restore to virtue and happiness, and to the naked and famishing child you restore its natural protection and support. You wipe away the tears, and silence the groans of wretchedness and despair, and replace these evidences of misery with the smile of peace and joyful hope. Surely then this question of legal prohibition should occupy the first place amongst these great political questions of the day.

In view of these premises, therefore, the Grand Division exhorts all members of the order to extend the helping hand to suffering humanity—to lay aside all selfish and party considerations, and support hereafter only such candidates for parliamentary honors, as shall faithfully and honestly support the enactment of a sound and stringent prohibitory law; and no longer to depend upon those who are participating in the traffic, to elect for you prohibitory law men.

The Grand Division also recommends that in all your operations you invite and so far as possible, secure the co-operation of all organizations, and of every member of the community friendly to the exertion of our order in this great cause, as it appears certain that the unanimous action of all such, cannot fail to secure the enactment of a prohibitory law.

Moved in amendment by Rep. H. R. O'Rielly, and seconded by Rep. L. A. Betts, That the blank be filled up with the sum of £20.—*Lost*.

Moved in amendment to the amendment by Rep. MacKenzie, seconded by Rep. N. Fellows, That the blank be filled up with the sum of £5.—*Lost*.

The amendments having been duly put and Lost, the original motion was declared carried.

Moved by Rep. C. Mortimer, seconded by Rep. W. H. Ellerbeck, That a committee of three be appointed by this Grand Division to adjudicate on the Essays that may be offered. That their decision be rendered on or before the 1st day of August. That if the said Committee shall not consider any of the Essays offered worthy of a Premium, they shall be at liberty to decline awarding any Premium; that the G. Scribe be instructed to make the offer public, and that the following named be a Committee to adjudicate, viz.:—Rev. J. E. Ryerson, G. W. P., Reverends Messrs. Boyd and Ormiston.—*Carried*.

Moved by Rep. C. Mortimer, and seconded by Rep. W. H. Ellerbeck, That if any of the Essays offered under the foregoing resolution, shall be adjudged worthy of the Premium; then it shall be the duty of the Grand Scribe to write to each of the Subordinate Divisions, enquiring what number of copies they will purchase, and that the extent of the edition be proportioned to the amount ordered by Subordinate Divisions.—*Carried*.

The Grand Division adjourned.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

26TH MAY,—2 o'clock.

The Grand Division opened in due form, and resumed its business. Grand Worthy Patriarch presiding.

Moved by Rep. J. G. Bell, seconded by Rep. P. Hicock, That the Grand Scribe cause to be printed immediately 1000 copies of the proceedings of this session of the Grand Division.—*Carried.*

Moved by E. Stacey, G. S., seconded by Rep. Hargrave, That the Committee appointed at the last session of the Grand Division to settle the difference existing in the Hay Bay Division, be discharged.—*Carried.*

The G. W. P. appointed the following Representatives a Committee to visit the Hay Bay Division for the purpose of carefully investigating the difficulties which still exist, and to use their best endeavors to settle the same, viz :—Reps. Patterson, D. Conger and Grand Scribe.

Moved by Rep. J. Beatty, seconded by Rep. J. G. Bell, That it is the opinion of this Grand Division, that the operations of the Committee of our G. Division and of the League, especially so far as relates to providing for Lectures and Public Meetings, should be directed to the back parts of our Counties and Townships, and not as heretofore upon the principal towns and frontier portions of our Counties, and that not more than two lectures should be provided for any one neighborhood, so as that the Lecturers may cover the largest possible ground.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rep. J. Beatty, seconded by Rep. Bell, That this Grand Division is of opinion that W. F. Kellogg, Esq., possesses talent of a high order as a Lecturer, and recommend his employment by the Committee, and that great care be taken in providing for his reception as a Lecturer, wherever he may be sent.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rep. Beatty, and seconded by Rep. Bell, That this Grand Division is deeply impressed with the conviction that a large amount of the influence of our Order, upon the action of the Legislature, depends at the present juncture, upon the proceedings of the Committee appointed to act in connexion with the Executive Committee of the League ; and most earnestly and anxiously urge upon said Committee, and especially upon our esteemed brother, Rep. H. R. O'Rielly, Chairman of the same, immediate—continuous—and faithful exertions, in the discharge of the important trusts committed to their care.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rep. O'Rielly, seconded by Rep. Ellerbeck, That it is hereby declared to be the intention of this Grand Division, that

when a Committee shall be appointed for any specific duty to be performed during any recess of the G. D., such appointment shall only extend to the time of the next Assembly of the G. D., unless otherwise provided by resolution.—*Carried.*

Moved by Rep. Dr. Beatty, seconded by Rep. Dr. Aishton, That the thanks of this Grand Division be, and is hereby presented to Sheriff McDonnell, for the use of the Court House for the Session of this G. D., and that the G. Scribe be instructed to communicate the same under the Seal of the G. D.—*Carried.*

The Committee appointed to draft a Memorial to the Legislature, submitted the following

D R A F T S .

TO

The Memorial of the G. D. of the Order of the S. of T. of C. W.

HUMBLY SHEWETH,

That various laws have from time to time been enacted in this Province for the suppression of Intemperance, and regulating the traffic in Intoxicating Liquors, several of which laws are now in force.

That experience has proved that these laws have failed to accomplish their object; that intemperance has not been suppressed, and that the traffic as yet, carried on under the sanction of law, is productive of great social and moral evils, throughout the whole country.

That the laws now in force, enabling Municipalities to prohibit the sale of Intoxicating Liquors within their own limits, is insufficient for the accomplishment of its purpose, from causes which would cease to exist, were the prohibition enacted by a general law.

That among the causes referred to, the following may be mentioned as exerting a very powerful influence. First, that the prohibition of the traffic in any municipality fails of its full effect, unless adjoining Municipalities adopt a similar course, and that, while the persistence of adjoining Municipalities in licensing the traffic, renders the benefit of the prohibition but of partial and inadequate extent, the knowledge of this fact deters many Municipalities from passing a law, of which they cannot secure to themselves the full benefit; and secondly, that while the sale of Intoxicating Liquors is permitted in Houses of Public Entertainment, forming as it does, a very large proportion of their profits—there is, and will be a great difficulty in sustaining houses where the travelling public can be accommodated, and where the sale of Intoxicating Liquors shall not be permitted; and an argument is thus furnished to the advocates of the traffic from the alleged necessity of permitting the sale, in order to secure hotel accommodation.

That your memorialists are clearly of opinion that the system of licensing the sale of Intoxicating Liquors is in itself wrong, as opposed to the true interests of society, alike in a moral, religious and political point of view; that the license given by government, goes far to destroy the influence of moral suasion to suppress the traffic in, or the use of these sources of evil and crime; and that a traffic which produces the fearful effects every where witnessed, is not a proper source of revenue.

That the failure of all legislative enactments in this Province to remove or materially to mitigate the evils resulting to the community from the traffic in Intoxicating Liquors, has shown that the great object aimed at by such enactments, can only be attained by the prohibition of the traffic by a general law.

That your Memorialists are convinced, not only that a Prohibitory Law is the only remedy for the evils complained of, but that a great majority of the inhabitants of Upper Canada agree in desiring the enactments of such a law.

Your Memorialists therefore earnestly pray that a Prohibitory Law may be enacted, which shall prevent the manufacture and sale of Intoxicating Liquors; and that

if your Honorable House do not deem it advisable to pass the Law prayed for at the present Session, you will cause such measures to be taken, as will enable the voters at the next general election, to express their opinion on this important subject, for the information of the Legislature.

And your Memorialists, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
