Trying to Make Buckingham Palace Exterior More Presentable - Archduchess

Thanks to the smoke and soot which fil o the extent of thousands upon thousand of tons, according to recent chemical investigation, public buildings and private residences have to be submitted periodic-ally to cleaning, scraping, and re-painting on the outside. Every now and again big

on the outside. Every now and again big blocks of this sooty deposit are removed from the external stonework of St. Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, the National Gallery and other places, while every London householder finds it necessary to re-paint the front of his house at least once in three years.

The facade of Buckingham Palace alone has received no scraping or painting for more than sixty years, and that is why it presents so extraordinarily grimy and dingy an appearance, now rendered all the more noticeable by reason of the whiteness of the great marble memorial of Queen Victoria at the entrance of the Mall, and to which the palace furnishes an extremely sombre background.

The exterior of King George's metropolitan residence has remained so long so because his grandfather, the Prince Consort, had a theory that if the facade were treated with oil, well forced into the material, a surface would be produced capable of resisting the deleterious effects of the London atmosphere. While this object has been accomplished as to actual deterioration, that is to say, crumbling away of the stone (Westminster Abbey and the House of Parliament need constant and costly repairs, owing to this process of disintegration of the stone through the chemical influences of the soot) no paint can be applied to the palace; and when at the outset of the reign of Edward VII., parliament voted about \$60,000 for the painting of the exterior, it was found that the

Dominion Coal Company to Build Towers and Otherwise Increase Facil-

It is announced that the Dominion Coal Ecompany is to enlarge its Halifax plant and three ninety foot towers will be set up on rails on the face of the wharf. They will permit of seven times as much work as with the old derricks.

All the existing sheds will be swept that the swept that the swept that the swept that the coal heap in the rear and a 66-foot bound receted midway on each of these towers will control the cars to and from the vessel at the wharf. Attached to each bound will be a clam shovel which will hold at least a ton of coal.
