FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF THE
St. George's Society
OF THE
CITY OF TORONTO,
FOR THE YEAR 1888.

The Committee of Management beg to present to the Members the Fifty-fourth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1888, to which is attached the Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditures, and the Auditor's Report, and certified Statement of the Investments of the Society.

RELIEF.

There have been 1,120 Applicants relieved during the year. In the early part of which the Applications were very numerous, but in the latter part they were less than usual. Probably different causes may be given for this circumstance, but there is little doubt that the unusually mild weather has been the principal one.

The cost of the relief given has amounted to \$1,075.33, which was distributed in various Articles of Provisions, &c., Assisted Passages to various places, and in Money.

* Every effort that was practicable has been made to find employment for those seeking it, and a variety of other services rendered in cases of necessity.

There have been orders given for the burial of ten adults and seven children in the Society's Plot in St. James's Cemetery. The Instalment of one hundred dollars was duly paid on the Plot, leaving one of the same amount to complete the purchase.

FINANCIAL.

The Treasurer's usual Annual Statement, duly audited, will be found herewith.

The financial position of the Society continues to gather strength. Four hundred dollars having been added to the Investments of the Society during the year. One hundred of that amount being a legacy, left by the late Miss Ridout, to be added to the Ridout Fund.

MEMBERSHIP.

There have been twenty-four Life Members and twenty Ordinary Members, elected during the year, who have paid their subscriptions; but fifteen of the Life Members elected, had previously been Ordinary ones. men of high standing in Toronto. Ordinary Members, 401; eight having died during the year, viz., Messrs. James Cox, J. C. Dent, T. A. Lockington, R. H. Lear, W. C. Mollington, — Moore, H. Nuttall, and W. Rawlin, all highly respectable members of the community. Messrs. Cox and Rawlin were among the oldest members of the Society. Mr. Dent was one of the foremost Journalists of the country.

ANNIVERSARIES, ENTERTAINMENTS, ETC.

The first regular Anniversary Service was held in St. James's Cathedral, on Sunday, April 22nd. The Rev. Septimus Jones preached a very excellent Sermon. The attendance was good. As usual our brethren, the Sons of England, turned out in full force, and we had a very good collection.

The second Service was held on the following Sunday in Broad Street Congregational Church. Dr. Wild preached a vigorous, patriotic Sermon.

The Musical portion of the Services, conducted by Mr. W. E. Haslam, and Mr. J. G. Lawson, was very efficient. The Choirs taking much interest therein. The Churches were placed at the disposal of the Society in the most courteous manner, which was suitably acknowledged at the time.

DINNER.

The Annual Dinner was again held at the Walker House at which the President presided. One hundred and seven gentlemen sat down, and a very enjoyable evening was spent in speeches and song. The dinner itself sustained the established reputation of the Walker House.

EXCURSION.

The Excursion this year was to Lorne Park, on the Steamer *Rothsay*, on July 31st, the attendance was not very numerous, but it passed off very pleasantly, the net results were \$31.57.

ADDRESSES TO THE GOVERNORS GENERAL.

On the 8th of May a number of the members assembled in the Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens, to bid farewell to His Excellency the Marquis of Lansdowne, on his departure from Canada; and on the 10th of September, the officers and members waited upon His Excellency Lord Stanley, the newly appointed Governor General, at the Queen's Hotel, where a loyal and dutiful Address was presented to him, on the occasion of his first official visit to Toronto, and to which he graciously responded.

NORTH AMERICAN ST. GEORGE'S UNION.

The meeting of St. George's Union of North America was held in Philadelphia this year, from August the 28th to the 31st. The President being, *ex-officio*, a member, the three Vice-Presidents were elected to accompany him, but owing to adverse circumstances, Vice-President J. W. Stockwell only attended the meeting, which was a very successful occasion.

CONCERT.

Continuing in the same practice, the Pavilion in the Horticultural Gardens was again secured for the Concert on the evening of Thanksgiving day. The whole arrangements for which were left entirely in Mr. F. H. Torrington's hands. An excellent programme was furnished, and gave great satisfaction to the audience, but the financial results were small.

CHRISTMAS DISTRIBUTION.

The Christmas distribution this year was again on a large scale, owing to the generous contributions. It was made on the 22nd of December, in the large store on the corner of Yonge and Melinda Streets, very kindly lent by the managers of the Canadian Bank of Commerce.

amounted to \$948.95 ; and the expenditure to \$867.91 ; 835 families consisting of 4,455 individuals received the supply given.

There was more beef and bread purchased than last year. The beef cost about the same rate as last year, but the bread was higher in price. There were also many very generous donations, of beef especially.

BUILDING SITE.

In the early part of the year a Special Committee was named, consisting of the President, J. Spooner ; Vice-Presidents, Stockwell and Plews ; Past President, Symons, and the Secretary, to consider and report as to providing suitable premises. The Committee presented a full report at the May meeting of members, recommending the purchase of a vacant site on the north side of Elm street, commencing 160 feet from Yonge street, and having a frontage of 50 feet, by a depth of 107 feet, with a lane along the east side of the plot.

The owners were willing to lease this at \$300 per annum for 21 years, renewable in perpetuity, with the privilege of purchasing any time before 1st of June, 1889, at \$5,000, payable in cash or half on mortgage, at 6 per cent., with right of paying off at any time. This report was unanimously adopted, and the Special Committee, (to which were subsequently added Messrs. R. W. Elliot, G. W. Beardmore, and J. J. Allworth,) continued to carry it out. An agreement was then entered into with the owners embodying the foregoing terms, Messrs. Spooner, Stockwell, Plews, and Symons, assuming the responsibility, and entering into the agreement on the Society's behalf.

Subscriptions were asked for, and subscribed to the extent of \$2,255, leaving \$3,005 yet to be obtained to make up the purchase money. It was considered by the Special Commit-

tee, and so reported, that a building suitable to the business, and requirements of the Society could be erected on the plot for about \$5,000 making the whole purchase and cost of building, \$10,000.

It is to our best interest that the purchase be completed speedily, and very desirable that the new officers should give the matter their first attention. New premises are essential, our lease of the house now in use having expired; besides it has not proper accommodation. We should occupy a building of our own, laid out according to our requirements, with a due regard to the dignity of the Society.

CONCLUSION.

In conclusion, it may be said that, excepting the effort commenced to have a building of our own, the year that has passed, has been one of an ordinary average character, although there have been cases of affliction needing more than usual assistance.

The Officers and Committee who may be elected this evening, will find the work of the Society in good order.
