Not exceeding 1 lb 24 cts.

Parcels for Canada must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth. They may be registered for a fee of 5 cents.

Parcels for the United Kingdom must be prepaid 30 cents per lb. or fraction of a lb., and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, nor 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth. A Customs Declaration of the contents and value of each parcel addressed to the United Kingdom must be filled up at the Post Office by the sender. Parcels for the United Kingdom are forwarded by Canadian Steamers only.

Money Orders to Canada.—All Money Order Post Offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward's Island, Manitoba and British Columbia, are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz:—

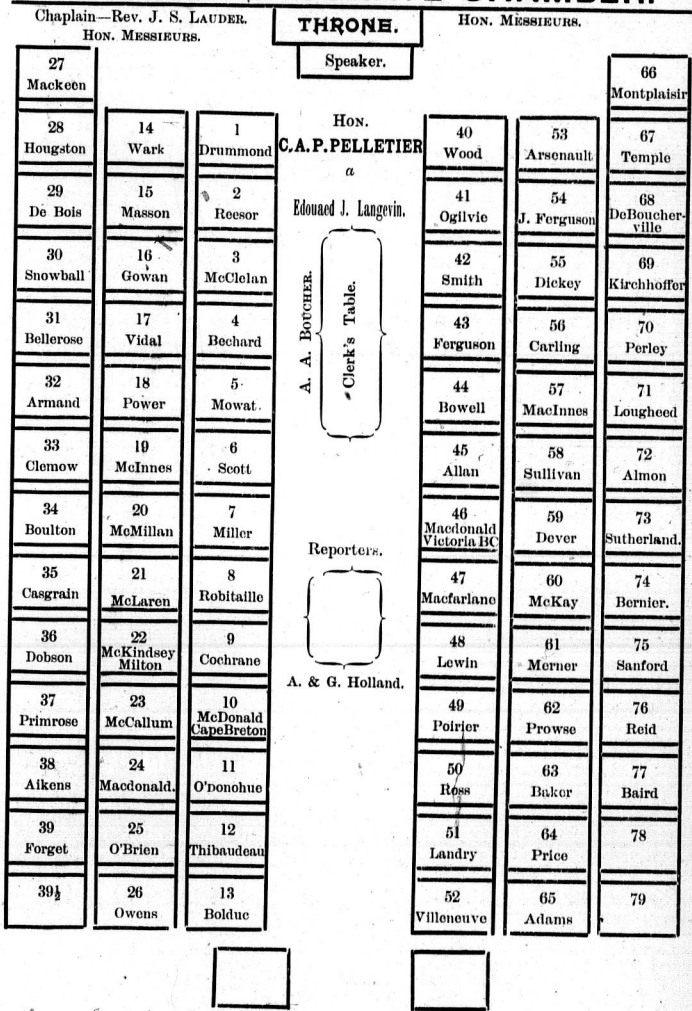

No person shall be entitled to resort to the Library during the Session of Parliament, except the Governor-General, the Members of the Privy Council and of the Senate and House of Commons, and the Officers of both Houses, and such other persons as may receive a written order of admission from the Speaker of either House. Members may personally introduce strangers to the Library during the day time, but not after the hours of seven o'clock p.m.

During a Session of Parliament, no books belonging to the Library shall be taken out of the building, except by the authority of the Speaker or upon a receipt given by a Member of either House.

During a recess of Parliament, the Library and Reading Room shall be open every day of each week (Sundays and holidays excepted), from the hour of ten in the morning until three in the afternoon; and access to the Library shall be permitted to persons introduced by a Member of the Legislature, or admitted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Library; subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary for the security and preservation of the collection; but no one shall be allowed to take any book out of the Library except Members of the Legislature, and such others as may be authorized by the Speaker of either House.

During the recess of Parliament, no Member of either House not residing at the seat of Government, shall be at liberty to borrow or have in his possession at any one time more than three works from the Library, and to retain the same longer than three weeks, and all such persons shall return the books so taken when required by the Librarian.

No books of reference, or books of special cost or value, may be removed from the seat of Government under any circumstances.

At the first meeting of the Joint Library Committee at every Session of Parliament, the Librarian shall report a list of books absent at the commencement of the Session, specifying the names of any persons who have retained the same in contravention of either of the foregoing rules.

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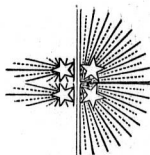

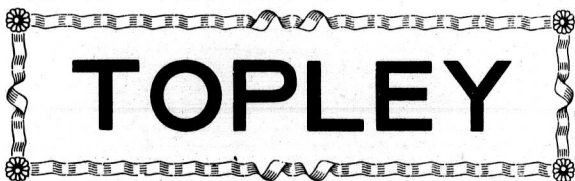

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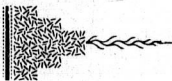
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THE QUEEN AND THE ROYAL FAMILY.

THE QUEEN—VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, etc., Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India (in India, Shri Shri, Rana Victorie, Kaiser-i-Hind). Her Majesty was born May 24th, 1819; succeeded to the throne, June 20th, 1837, on the death of her Uncle, King William IV.; was crowned June 28th, 1838; and married February 10th, 1840, to His late Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emmanuel, Prince Consort, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha; who was born August 25th, 1819; died 14th December, 1861. Her Majesty is the child of His late Royal Highness Edward Duke of Kent, son of King George III. The children of Her Majesty are—

Her Royal Highness Victoria-Adelaide-Mary-Louisa, PRINCESS ROYAL OF ENGLAND AND PRUSSIA, born November 21st, 1840; married to His Royal Highness Frederick-William, Crown Prince of Germany, January 25th, 1858, and has had issue: Frederick-William Victor Albert, born January 27th, 1859; Victoria Elizabeth-Angusta-Charlotte, born July 25th, 1860, married 18th February, 1878, to Herod, Prince of Saxe-Meiningen; Albert-Wilhelm-Heinrich, born August 14th, 1862; Francis-Frederick-Sigismund, born September 15, 1864 (died June 18th, 1866); Fredericka-Wilhelmina-Amelia-Victoria, born April the 12th, 1866; Joachim-Frederick-Earnest-Waldemar, born February 10th, 1868; Sophia-Dorothea-Ulrika-Alice, born June 14th, 1870; John etc., born April, 1871, died on Good Friday, 1871; and Margaret-Beatrice-Foedora, born April 22nd, 1872.

His Royal Highness Albert-Edward, PRINCE OF WALES, Duke of Saxony, Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Dublin, etc., born November 9th, 1841; married March 18th, 1863, to Alexandria of Denmark (Princess of Wales) born December 1st, 1844, and has issue: Prince Albert-Victor, born January 8th, 1864; George-Frederick-Earnest-Albert, born June 3rd, 1865; Louisa-Victoria-Alexandria Dagmar, born February 20th, 1867; Victoria-Alexandra-Olga-Mary, born July 6th, 1868; Maud-Charlotte-Mary-Victoria, born November 27th, 1869; and a son born April 6th, 1871, who died the following day.

Her Royal Highness Alice-Maud-Mary, born April 25th, 1843; married H. R. H. Prince Frederick Louis of Hesse, July 1st, 1862, died December 14th, 1878; issue five daughters and two sons; the second son was killed by accident, May, 1873.

His Royal Highness Alfred-Earnest-Albert, DUKE OF EDINBURGH, born August 6th, 1844; married Grand Duchess Marie, of Russia, January 22nd, 1874; has issue, a son, Alfred-Alexander-Ernest, born November 17th, 1874, and five daughters.

Her Royal Highness Helena-Angusta-Victoria, born May 25th, 1864; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick Christian-Charles-Augustus, of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburgh-Augustenburg, July 5th, 1886, and has had issue, three sons and two daughters.

Her Royal Highness Louisa-Caroline-Alberta, born March 18th, 1848; married to the Marquis of Lorne, eldest son of the Duke of Argyll, March 21st, 1871. No issue.

His Royal Highness Arthur-William-Patrick-Albert, Earl of Sussex and Duke of Connaught, born May 1st, 1850, married to Princess Louise-Margaret, daughter of Prince Frederick-Charles of Prussia, March 13th, 1879, and has issue one son and two daughters.

His Royal Highness Leopold-George-Duncan-Albert, born April 7th, 1853; married to Princess Helen of Waldeck, April the 27th, 1882; died 28th March, 1884, and has issue one son and one daughter.

Her Royal Highness Beatrice-Mary-Victoria-Foedora, borne April 14th, 1857; married to Prince Henry of Battenburg, 23rd July, 1885, and has issue two sons and one daughter.

But if the time occupied continuously whilst any such vehicle shall be in the employ of the same person or persons amounts to or exceeds one hour, then the rates by the hour, as aforesaid, shall only be proper and legal, and no higher rates shall be legal.

That each passenger shall be allowed to take with him or her one trunk or other baggage to a reasonable extent, free of charge; and it shall be the duty of the person in charge of any such vehicle to load and unload the same free of charge.

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
