^{*}It is right to mention that although this claim is here stated as in the Church Books, the heirs dispute its correctness.

A sum which the principal Creditor has agreed to take in liquidation of his claim. The two small debts due the Estates of Torrance and Platt and interest on the principal debt till paid are all that now require to be provided for, which cannot exceed £150 at the utmost. The greater part of this sum will, it is expected be made up by the subscriptions of parties, who have not, as yet been called upon.

Considering that at Easter, 1851, there was an increasing debt on the Church of £2333 13s. 0½d., the interest of which had not, for several years, been paid, there is not only cause for satisfaction, at the immediate prospect thus afforded of disembarrassing its temporalities, but there is also great cause to feel proud, that the late appeal, made to its members for that purpose, has been responded to in such a manner as practically indicates by its results, that they are actuated by those correct and honorable principles which should ever guide churchmen no less than private individuals.

The Church's property in Pews has been increased during the past year, by the acquisition from the Estates of deceased Members of one First, two Second and one Third Class Pews.
