### M. P. FOR YORK CO. **DIED ON FRIDAY**

Lt.-Col McLeod Had Been Seven Years in Parliament— Was Overseas.

Fredericton, Jan. 7.—Col H. F. Mc-eod, M. P., died this evening from his fifth attack of pneumonia in the last

fifth attack of pneumonia in the lass-few years.

Col. McLeod was born at Frederic-ton in 1871, son of the late Rev. Dr. and Mrs. McLeod. He was graduated from the University of New Bruns-wick in 1891 with the Degree of Bache-lor in Arts and captured the Stanley Gold Medal. In 1895 he was called to the bar; five years later he was ap-pointed a K. C. In 1908 he was elect-ed to the Provincial Legislature for years later he was m

years later he was made Tronscapelled to enter the House of Commons by acclamation in 1913, and was relected in 1917. He was Mayor of Fredericton in 1907-8.

Col. McLeod took a keen interest in the militia and became Lieutenant-Colonel of the 71st York Regiment. When the Great War broke out he went overseas in command of the 12th Battalion of the Ffyst Canadian Contingent.

importations, the Reconstruction Association points out that exchange increases prices, that it raises the cost of manufacturing in Canada, and adds to the difficulties of industrial employment for Canadian workers. "Coal, cotton, iron and steel products, and oils," it says, "enter largely into the cost of production of most commodities and services. In buying such commodities from the United States, Canadians have to pay a substantial premium on accouna of the decline of Canadian money. Each purchase encourages higher prices and a higher exchange rate." The Association points out that exchange is three times as high to-day as it was a year ago, that early last February the premium on New York funds amounted to 17½ per cent. and that it threatens to go still higher this winter and next spring unless effective remedies are applied. "Those remedies," it says, "if applied at all, must be applied consciously and as a matter of both national duty and self-interest by the people of Canada whenever they spendonnery. The merchandise trade balance is running against us to the amount of between \$20,000,000 and \$30,000,000 per month. If we include interest on obligations abroad and other items in the account, Canada has an adverse balance of trade which at the present time is running at the rate of more than \$400,000,000 per year.


