LONDON, July 19 .- In the House of Con LONDON, July 19.—In the House of Com-mons this afternoon Sir Michael Hicks-Beach moved to adjourn in order to discuss the statement outlining the Government's program made by Sir William Harcourt yes-terday. The announcement of the Chan-cellor of the Exchequor, he said, had been received with general surprise and disap-pointment. The House had been in almost continuous section since the Government pointment. The House had been in almost continuous session since the Government came into office in 1892, and now the Min-isters had seized all the time belonging to the members for the consideration of private bills in an attempt to force upon the House work that could not possibly be performed within the time allotted.

Sir William Harcourt contended that there was no reason why the bills which the Gov-erument proposed to take up ought not to be carried within the time stated by him yesterday. The real question was whether the Opposition intended to injure the Gov-erument by paralyzing its business in the House

Evicted Tenant's Bill Second Reading. John Morley, Chief Secretary for Ireland, was loudly cheered by the Irish National members as he rose to move the second read-ing of the Evicted Tenants' bill. The meas-ure, he said, was designed to meeta difficulty of the utmost gravity, a difficulty whose im-mediate removal was imperative. Mr. Morley rebutted the contention of the Opposition that the bill bristled with new principles for which no precedents could be found among the Irish Land Legis-lation of the past quarter of a century. If the Government was mischlevous, as had been asserted the existing absence of a plan was doubly so. The bill proposed to take £100,000 of the church surplus. but it was now found possible to take £250,000. To no better use could the surplus be de-voted than to restoring peace and harmony between landlord and tenant. **Robing the Church to Pay Criminals.** Col. Saunderson, champion of the Ulster
