

March 23.-The tug Velos with the barge Pilot in tow, left this city last evening for Hoddington Island to procure a cargo of stone for the new. Parliament Buildings. On board the tug were Contractor Adams, Captain Anderson, Mate Christiansen, Eng. Low and three other members of the crew. When passing Trial Island, which is a parren rock, noted on account of its erce tide, the tug's rudder chain broke, and, at full speed, she ran on the rocks. barge brought up against her, and as the barge passed, Mate Christiansen sprang aboard of her. The barge had twenty-five stone-cutters and laborers aboard. The barge drifted past the tug, breaking the hawser, and went ashore on Trial Island, all aboard of her escaping to shore. The men had no boat, and could do nothing to assist the unfortunate six left aboard the tug, of which Captain Anderson is now the only survivor. The tug went down stern first. Contractor Adams and three of the crew were quickly washed away and drowned. Captain Anderson and Engineer Low, however, had lashed themselves to the davits, and there they remained for some time. Captain Anderson started to swim ashore, and being caught by heavy seas, was carried in on top of two big waves, and thrown on the shore in a half frozen condition. The body of Mr. Low, who had remained on the wreck, was recovered. The dead man was hanging downward in the water. None of the other bodies have been recovered, and in all probability never will be. The proposed act also requires uniformity in size and color of the package, which places considerable restriction on the fruit grower, it being a natural fact that fruit does not grow uniformly.

Conn for forgery and the uttering of forged paper in the name of Anthony Gilroy through the Merchants' Bank of Canada in St. Thomas during the time of Conn's transacting a banking business in Alvinston. Ont. Many notes turned up after the failure which were not signed by Gilroy, and which were very poor imitations of the proper signature. Proceedings were taken against Conn in Detroit, and the Ontario Government effected his extradition. At the Spring Assizes the jury disagreed. The case again came up at the Fall Assizes of 1894, and the jury disagreed again. The indictment this time being somewhat changed, he appeared for trial, and for three days the trial has been on. The end was an acquittal.
