


All the calculations in this Almanao have been adapted to "Mean Time" at St. John, except the Sun's Declination and the "Equation of Time," which are for Mean Noon, Greenwich.

"Mean Time," is that shown by a well-regulated clock, and differs from "Apparent Time," or that exhibited by a Sun-dial by what is known as "The Equation of Time." When the Sun is Slow this is to be subtracted from "Mean (or Clock) Time," and when the Sun is Fust, to be added to "Mean Time" to get the "Apparent Time."

MISCOU FOG WHISTLE.—A Steam Fog Whistle has been erected on Miscou Island, at the entrance of the Bay of Chaleurs. The whistle is sounded twice in each minute.

D.; to enable vessels seeking shelter to clear the point of the shoal lying off the Island. The front light is fixed white catoptric, elevated 80 feet above high water mark, and should be visible in line of range 10 miles. Latitude N. 47d. 5m. 20r.; longitude W. 65d. 7m. 5s. The back light is distant 1 122 feet easterly from the front one. It is also fixed white catoptric, is elevated 42 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 11 miles. shall be the duty of the Pilot piloting such Steamer inwards to pilot the same when being removed to such mooring ground or berth, if such removal takes place within twenty four hours after the arrival of such Steamer as aforesaid, without extra charge for the same: For all Steamers not over 100 tons, \$2.00; aver 100 tons and not exceeding 200, \$2.50; over 200 tons and not exceeding 400, \$5.00, and 30 cents additional for every fifty tons such Steamer shall measure over 400 tons. Time for Going Through the Falls.

The Falls are level or still water at about three and a half hours on the flood, and about two and a half on the ebb, so that they are passable four times in twenty-four hours, about ten or fifteen minutes each time. No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the River Saint John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by high winds, and in proportion to the height of them.

### TIME BALL.

The Time Ball on Northern Tower of the Custom House Euilding, will be hoisted half its elevation each day (Sundays excepted) at fifteen minutes before one o'clock. At one minute before one o'clock it will be hoisted its full length; and at one o'clock, mean time, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer, keeping correct Greenwich time, should then show 5h. 24m. 15s., and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. As the above hour of one o'clock, when the Ball drops, represents 5h. 24m. 15s. at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained no matter where the ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at St. John should compare their Chronometers by the Time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbor rates. Barrel, 2 cents; loag containing 2 bushels, 2 cents; firkn, keg or box of like size, 1 cent; cask of lime, 4 cents; pipe, hogshead or puncheon, 15 cents; for every fifty pounds weight, and not exceeding one hundred pounds weight of iron, steel or other article not hereinafter enumerated, 1 cent; if above one hundred pounds weight, for each additional fifty pounds weight, 1 cent. All other things and articles not hereinafter enumerated, to be in proportion to the aforegoing scale of rates.

No load of greater weight than four tons weight, including the vehicle on which the load is carried, shall be permitted to go upon the floats or approaches to the ferry, or upon any ferry boat; and there shall be no privilege for the carriage, by ferry, of any weight greater than four tons in any load.

#### MATTER WHICH CANNOT BE FORWARDED THROUGH THE POST.

Any explosive substance, class, liquid, or other matter likely to entail risk or injury to the ordinary contents of the mail, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Spectacles and eye-glasses, if securely put in cases not likely to allow the contents to escape if broken in course of conveyance, may be sent by Post within the Dominion on prepayment of parcel post rates.

### RE-DIRECTED LETTERS.

Re-directed Letters to places within the Dominion or United States will be forwarded without any additional charge if returned promptly

Letters sent to or received from a Country of the Postal Union, and afterwards re-directed to any place in Canada, or a country in the Postal Union, will be forwarded even if taken out of the Office and re-addressed; but if re-addressed to a place where there is a higher rate of pastage, the difference of postage will be chargeable.

#### NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

On all Newspapers and Periodicals other than those specified above, the postage rate will be one cent per 4 ounces in weight which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and Periodicals published not less frequently than once a month and weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, if prepaid 1886.]

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

No information is permitted to be given by Postmasters respecting letters which pass through a Post Office, except to the persons to whom they are addressed. Postmasters are not permitted to furnish any information respecting the names or addresses of persons who receive correspondence at their respective offices.

A letter, once posted, becomes the property of the person to whom it is addressed, and must be forwarded according to directions. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer, or to any other person.

Any obscene or immoral book, pamphlet, picture, or other publica-tion, of an indecent or immoral character, or any letter upon the outside or envelope of which there are words, devices, matters, or things

aforesaid, is not permitted to pass by post.

Any article, supposed to be liable to Customs Duties, which is received by mail from any other country, will be sent to the nearest Collector of Customs.

#### USEFUL HINTS.

Never send money or other articles of value through the Post Office except either by Money Order or Registered Letter.

Make complaints and inquiries in writing.

Preserve and request correspondents to preserve envelopes of missent or delayed letters.

Business men should be careful to authorize but a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence.

Have a letter box on your office door.

Letters addressed to mere initials, or fictitious names, will not be delivered, unless addressed in care of a resident, or to some box in the Post Office.

Letters containg Gold or Silver Money, Jewels or precious articles, or anything liable to Customs duties, cannot be forwarded by Post to any of the Postal Union countries except the United Stdtes.

#### REGISTERED LETTERS.

Letters intended to be Registered, when addressed to places in Canada, must be prepaid by stamp, 2 cents each; to the United States, 5 cents each, in addition to the postage rate. For Newfoundland, registered letters, 2 cents; other articles 5 cents in addition to the postage.

All letters for Registration should be posted 15 minutes before the hour of closing ordinary Mails, and 30 minutes before the English Mail.

No letter will be accepted for Registration addressed either to initials or what may appear a fictitious name, and any such Registered Letters received from another office, or deposited in the Letter Box for Registration will be at once sent to the Dead Letter Office for disposal.

Registered Letter Stamps of the denomination of 2 and 5 cents may be obtained at the usual places.

### TABLE FOR FORETELLING THE WEATHER.

This table, and the accompanying remarks, are the result of many years actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom found to fail.

OBSERVATIONS.—The nearer the time of the Moon's change to noon or midnight, the more nearly will the result accord with the prediction.

The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e., from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table.
