Tokio, March 16.—The Emper-or of Japan has sent the fol-lowing message to his victori-ous Manchurian armies: "Since autumn the enemy prected strong defences around Mukden, held the district with a superior force and were con-fident of victory. Our Manchu-rian armies, however, forestal-ing the enemy, boldly and vig-orously assumed the offensive, and after strenuously fighting for more than 10 days and nights thru snow and bitting wind de-feated their strong foe, driving them to Tie Pass, taking tens of thousands of prisoners and otherwise inflicting serious in-juries. By this signal victory, our Manchurian armies have enhanced the military prestige of our country at home and abroad. We are deeply grati-fied by the courage and endur-and men have been able to achieve such a great success, and we look to you for èven greater exertions in the future." Gen.
