DEATH BY FIRE

THE BOYS' SECTION OF A PAPER SCHOOL IN LONDON BURNED LAST NIGHT.

The inmates were all asleep and twenty six boys were suffocated. Heroic Work of the Superintendent of School.

LONDON, Jan. 1.—The boys' section of the paper school in the district of Tottenham, in connection with the Whitechapel and Poplar Unions took fire last night while the inmates were asleep and it was burned with terrible results.

Two of the matrons of the institution escaped in safety by sliding through the water pipes. Several of the boys escaped in the same way.

The superintendent of the school reported that the fire broke out at about a quarter of twelve. There were 600 persons in the institution.

Further reports of the fire show it originated in the clothing room beneath the boys' dormitory. The smoke and flames coming from the stove alarmed those sleeping on the top floor and they made their escape.

The bodies of those who were suffocated were carried to the main hall of the building, which is still profusely decorated with Christmas greens.

The boys retired last evening in the highest spirits, having been treated to presents and a New Year's fete to-day.

The bodies of the boys who were suffocated were buried in the cemetery at St. John's.
