





CUT OFF THE LOCAL MILK SUPPLY

Won't Send One Pint of Milk or Cream to City Until Sussex Train is Run on Atlantic Time—Daily Supply Received Here is Over Twelve Thousand Quarts—Secretary Huggard Gives Producers' Reasons.

According to official report from the Kings County Milk Producers' Association no milk or cream will be shipped into St. John today, with the result that the city will be short of about one thousand six hundred eight-quart cans of milk which on previous days arrived in the City of St. John on the so-called Sussex train in the early morning. This means that the residents of St. John will be cut off of no less than twelve thousand eight hundred quarts of milk, and while the dealers have a small supply on hand from yesterday the amount will not go very far.

The milk producers from farms in the close vicinity of the city have their regular customers and, of course, these customers will undoubtedly be fortunate, as each milkman who arrives in the city during the day with one wagon partly loaded means that his supply is for practically only a few customers. The greater majority of dealers who supply grocery stores, creameries, and householders, receive their milk from Kings county, and now that this great supply has been cut off there will be many a home without milk, if not today, the bottles, pitchers or other receptacles will be dry tomorrow.
